SCHOOL OF INDUSTRIAL ARTS OF TRENTON.

Robert C. Belville, Secretary Board of Trustees; Frank F. Frederick,
Director School of Industrial Arts.

Since my last report the work of the School of Industrial Arts has gone steadily forward. The enrollment the past year was 862—a gain of 168 over last year. There are now twenty-nine instructors.

During the year the City Commission granted an additional appropriation of \$3,000 which will enable the school to round out its courses and purchase much needed equipment.

As time goes on, the work the school is doing appears to meet with greater appreciation, on the part of the manufacturers and the general public, as it is seen that the students really receive artistic and technical instruction of value not only to themselves but to their employers.

The scope of the school's work can be seen from the following:

ENROLLMENT OF STUDENTS 1914-1915—Males, 570; females, 292; attending evening only, 659; attending day only, 157; attending both day and evening, 46.

ENROLLMENT IN DEPARTMENTS—Fine Art, 181; Art-Crafts, 43; Mechanical, 336; Architectural, 49; Electrical, 22; Chemical, 70; Dressmaking and Millinery, 208; Childrens (Saturday only), 55; Watchmaking, 24; Woodworking, 41; Mechanics Course (Day Technical School), 62; in more than one department, 229.

NEWARK TECHNICAL SCHOOL.

Charles A. Colton, Director.

As the Newark Technical School is operated in the interest of the Manufacturing Industries, a year of industrial depression has naturally had some effect on the attendance, though not to the extent that was anticipated.

There was a falling off of about ten per cent over the year 1913-1914, and while the number of students was not as great, there was a notable advance in the age of those attending.

The average age of all students (413) during the year 1914-1915 was 21 years.

Such a class of students demands instruction which can be made available for practical purposes at the earliest possible moment. These men have pretty definite notions of what they want and how to apply what they receive in the line of instruction.

Such conditions demand instructors having different qualifications from those required for academic work and these are frequently difficult to obtain. The combination of pedagogical with practical ability is rare and Industrial Education has been much retarded by the scarcity of suitable instructors.

An exhibit of the students work was shown at the convention of the National Manufacturer's Association held in New York, May 25 and 26, which received very favorable commendation from the members. It consisted of specimens from the following courses; Toolmaking, Electricity, Electroplating and Plumbing, and in many respects was very different from the work shown by other institutions.

LEGISLATIVE RECORD.

From the beginning, the Teachers' Retirement Fund has been a part of the School Law of the State of New Jersey. The Legislative enactments are as follows:

Chapter 32, page 58, Laws of 1896; Chapter 178, page 475, Laws of 1899; Article XXVIII., Chapter 96, page 270, Laws of 1900; Article XXVII., Chapter 36, page 150, Laws of 1902; Article XXV., Chapter 1 of the Laws of the Second Special Session of 1903, page 80; Chapter 314, page 689, Laws of 1906; and Chapter 139, page 365, Laws of 1907. The Fund is now Article XXV. of the School Law, enacted in 1907. The first Act by which the State appropriated money toward the expense of administering the Fund was Chapter 95, page 194, Laws of 1905, which allowed \$1,500.00, and became effective November 1st, 1906.

SYNOPSIS OF BUSINESS OF FISCAL YEAR 1914-1915.

The operations of the year which ended June 30, 1915 may be summarized as follows:—Receipts, \$235,890.22, of which interest contributed \$16,192.55, enough to pay 64 annuities of \$250.00 each. (Note—The above receipts do not include \$10,500.00 received on account of investments.) Disbursements were \$207,163.82, of which \$206,946.92 was for annuities. (Note—The afore-said disbursements do not include \$14,000.00 invested on bond and mortgage @ 5%.) The surplus on the year's business was \$28,726.40. Forty-nine annuities were granted; annual value, \$26,187.32; average, \$534.43. Ten annuities were granted to men; total, \$5,229.60; average, \$522.96; and thirty-nine to women; total, \$20,957.72; average, \$537.37; all but three were granted under the Act of 1907. Nine annuities paid their deficit in a lump sum; the other forty took advantage of that clause of Section 217 (Article XXV.) of the School Law, which permits the deficit to be liquidated by the accruing annuity. Fifteen annuities deceased; annual value, \$6,645.88; average, \$443.05. The 1914-1915 decedents paid to the Fund an average of \$201.14, and received therefrom an average of \$1,986.17. The net 1914-1915 increase in annuity obligations was \$19,541.44. At the close of business June 30, 1915, thirty-six applications were pending action by the Trustees; annual value, \$18,842.72; average, \$523.40. On the same date, 474 annuities were living and in force; annual value, \$217,305.76; average, \$458.45. Assets, \$432,183.55. Liabilities, none.

RECAPITULATION FROM BEGINNING TO JUNE 30TH, 1915.

The Teachers' Retirement Fund became a part of the Public School System of New Jersey by virtue of Chapter 32, page 58, Laws of 1896, (enacted March 11th,) and six times amended and re-enacted. The latest revision is Chapter 139, page 365, Laws of 1907, Article XXV., School Law, (enacted May 7th). To June 30th, 1915, five hundred and ninety-eight teachers had been granted annuities, aggregating an annual value of \$266,806.12, averaging \$446.16, and have received benefits totaling \$1,141,343.58, averaging \$1,908.60. Of the 598 annuities granted, 94 were to men; annual value, \$43,295.56, average, \$460.59; total received from Fund, \$164,891.85; average, \$1,754.16; while 504 annuities were granted to women; annual value, \$223,510.60, average, \$443.47; total received from Fund, \$976,451.73; average, \$1,937.40. One hundred and twenty-four annuities had deceased; annual value, \$49,500.36, average, \$399.19; these had paid to the Fund an average of

\$161.22, and had received therefrom an average of \$1,432.60. Four hundred and seventy-four annuities were living and in force June 30, 1915; annual value, \$217,305.76; average, \$458.45. Total rebates paid, \$1,121.80. Assets, June 30, 1915:—Investments, \$262,750.00; cash in bank, \$169,433.55; total, \$432,183.55; no liabilities; annuities paid in full to date. Total cash raised by Fund to June 30th, 1915, (Approx.) \$1,599,372.09. Receipts from bequests, legacies and gifts, \$3,647.72. Receipts from bazaars, fairs, excursions, entertainments, gifts, bequests, legacies, etc., \$34,868.21; of this amount, \$33,445.82 was contributed prior to January 1st, 1906. All such moneys, including legacies, bequests and gifts, go into the invested Permanent Principal, and, therefore, by the process of compound interest, have practically doubled, so that it is safe to assume that of the Fund's present net assets, about \$70,000.00 must be credited to the proceeds of fairs, entertainments, legacies, gifts, etc., with compound interest thereon.
