VETS HAVEN SUPERINTENDENT MAKES PRESENTATION AT VETERANS ADMINISTRATION (VA) MEDICAL CENTER. The meeting was held at the Coatsville VA Medical Center and included homeless veterans providers from New Jersey and Pennsylvania. Mr. Durante's presentation included a history of the program in New Jersey, success stories from our program, and funding issues and availability.

The new nametags will be available in Army and Air Force Exchange Service military clothing sales stores at a future date when stocks become available.
