Each month the Division of Family Development publishes its program statistics for: WFNJ/TANF, NJ SNAP, Emergency Assistance, General Assistance, and Child Support Services. When possible, information is provided separately for children and adults. Many tables also provide trend data with information broken down by county for readers to consider. This report is compiled and prepared by The Bureau of Research & Reporting.

WFNJ/TANF

- As of the end of October, the TANF caseload had decreased by 4,140 cases, from 39,721 in October 2012 to 35,581 in October 2013, a decrease of 10.4%.
- The county where the family caseload percentage increased since October 2012 was Warren (4.2%).
- The counties with caseloads that decreased since October 2012 were Bergen (-17.9%), Camden (-18.0%), and Morris (-19.1%).
- Of the WFNJ/TANF cases, 7,923 or 22.3% were child-only in October 2013.
- The counties with the most child-only cases were Essex (1,262), Camden (1,073), and Hudson (991).
- Essex (19,300), Passaic (10,900), Hudson (10,764), Camden (9,533), and Mercer (5,316) counties had the greatest number of persons receiving TANF in October 2013.

NJ SNAP (formerly FOOD STAMPS)

- In October 2013, there were 433,011 households receiving NJ SNAP benefits. The number of NJ SNAP households increased by 13,394, or 3.2%, since October 2012.
- There were 870,148 persons receiving NJ SNAP benefits as of October 2013, an increase of 27,041 or 3.2% since October 2012.
- The three counties having the highest caseload increase since October 2012 are Ocean (10.9%), Mercer (8.6%), and Hunterdon (8.2%).

EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE

- There were 6,968 families receiving Emergency Assistance (EA) in October 2013, an increase of 465 or 7.2% since October 2012.
- In October 2013, EA payments were made for 1,842 SSI recipients.

GENERAL ASSISTANCE

GA Emergency Assistance

- There were 5,852 Emergency Assistance payments made to GA cases in October 2013, a decrease of 794 or 11.9% since October 2012.
- The three counties that show an annual percent increase in emergency assistance payments are Burlington (49.1%), Atlantic (37.5%), and Mercer (14.0%).

GA Program

- The total numbers of cases receiving GA has decreased from 41,559 to 34,806 since October 2012, a decrease of 16.2%.
- There were 22,067 Employable GA and 12,739 Unemployable GA cases in October 2013.
- Warren (5.6%), Mercer (2.7%) and Middlesex (1.9%) counties showed the highest percent increase for GA cases since October 2012.
- In October 2013, GA cases showed a 0.5 percent decrease since September 2013.

CHILD SUPPORT SERVICES (Quarterly Report)

- The total collection for the Child Support Services Program was about \$318 million from July 2013 to September 2013, an increase of 4.1 percent over the same period for FFY 2012.
- Total distributions increased 3.7% from September 2012.


WORK FIRST NEW JERSEY (WFNJ)

- During the report month of October 2013, there were 4,276 families in which at least one member was employed and an additional 584 families whose WFNJ assistance cases were closed due to employment related earnings.
- The three counties with the greatest number of employed active WFNJ recipients were: Essex (1,028), Hudson (521), and Camden (413).
- There were 3,218 former TANF cases receiving post-TANF support in the form of child care assistance.





Work Participation Rates Achieved Over 12 Month Period Ending With OCTOBER 2013






ACRONYMS

CASS: Consolidated Assistance and Support System

EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE (EA) - Payments to those eligible for WFNJ/TANF or WFNJ/GA, authorized during the 30 consecutive days immediately following the emergency (defined as a substantial loss of shelter, food, clothing, or household furnishings by fire, flood or other similar disaster) or if eligible individual or family is an imminent or actual state of homelessness.

NJ SNAP - Formerly the Food Stamp Program, now known as **NJ SNAP** (NJ Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program) authorized by Congress as a nutritional supplement program to provide low income households with more food of greater variety and better nutrition. Program eligibility is based on household income, resources, and expenses for medical, shelter, and dependent care. CWA staff refers certain recipients to the New Jersey Department of Labor for participation in the Food Stamp Employment and Training Program.

FAMIS: Family Assistance Management Information System

GAAS: General Assistance Automated System

NJKiDS: New Jersey Kids Deserve Support (Child Support Information Management System)

NJ MMIS SHARED DATA WAREHOUSE: The Shared Data Warehouse (SDW) is the repository for New Jersey's DFD and Medicaid data. Since 2003, OptumInsight has administered the SDW and provided access to the data through a reporting tool known as Business Objects.

OMEGA: Online Management of Economic Goal Achievement

SSI-EA: Supplemental Security Income-Emergency Assistance

WFNJ: Work First New Jersey - Fully implemented July 1, 1997, this is New Jersey's welfare reform program which responds to the requirements of the Federal Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act (PRWORA) of 1996. PRWORA established Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) as the replacement for AFDC cash assistance. WFNJ includes two segments, WFNJ/TANF for families with children, and WFNJ/GA (General Assistance) for single adults and couples without dependent children. WFNJ emphasizes achieving self-sufficiency and limits lifetime receipt of financial assistance to a total of five years.

EXPLANATORY NOTES

The Department of Human Services Division of Family Development provides basic income and an opportunity to achieve self-sufficiency for individuals and families served by the Division's programs. The Division provides leadership, direction and supervision to those public agencies responsible for administering those programs and plans for and develops policies to promote self-sufficiency.
