




# **Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup**

For all elementary and middle schools, this includes a measurement of how many students are chronically absent. 












NJASK Proficiency Trends - Language Arts Literacy -Grade Level - 03






NJASK Proficiency Trends - Math - Grade Level - 03










# **Enrollment by Grade**












## NJASK Proficiency Trends - Language Arts Literacy -Grade Level - 06






NJASK Proficiency <u>Trends - Math</u> - Grade Level - 06






