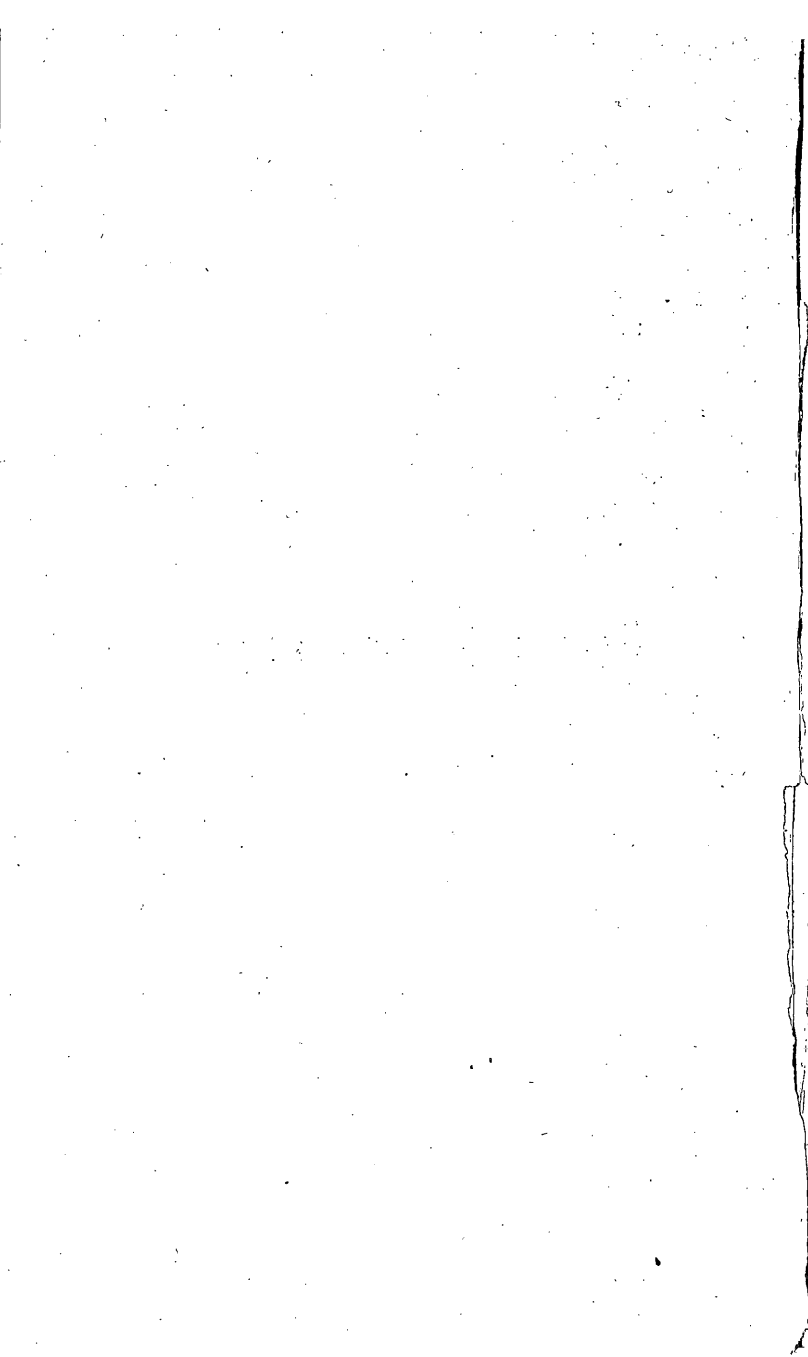

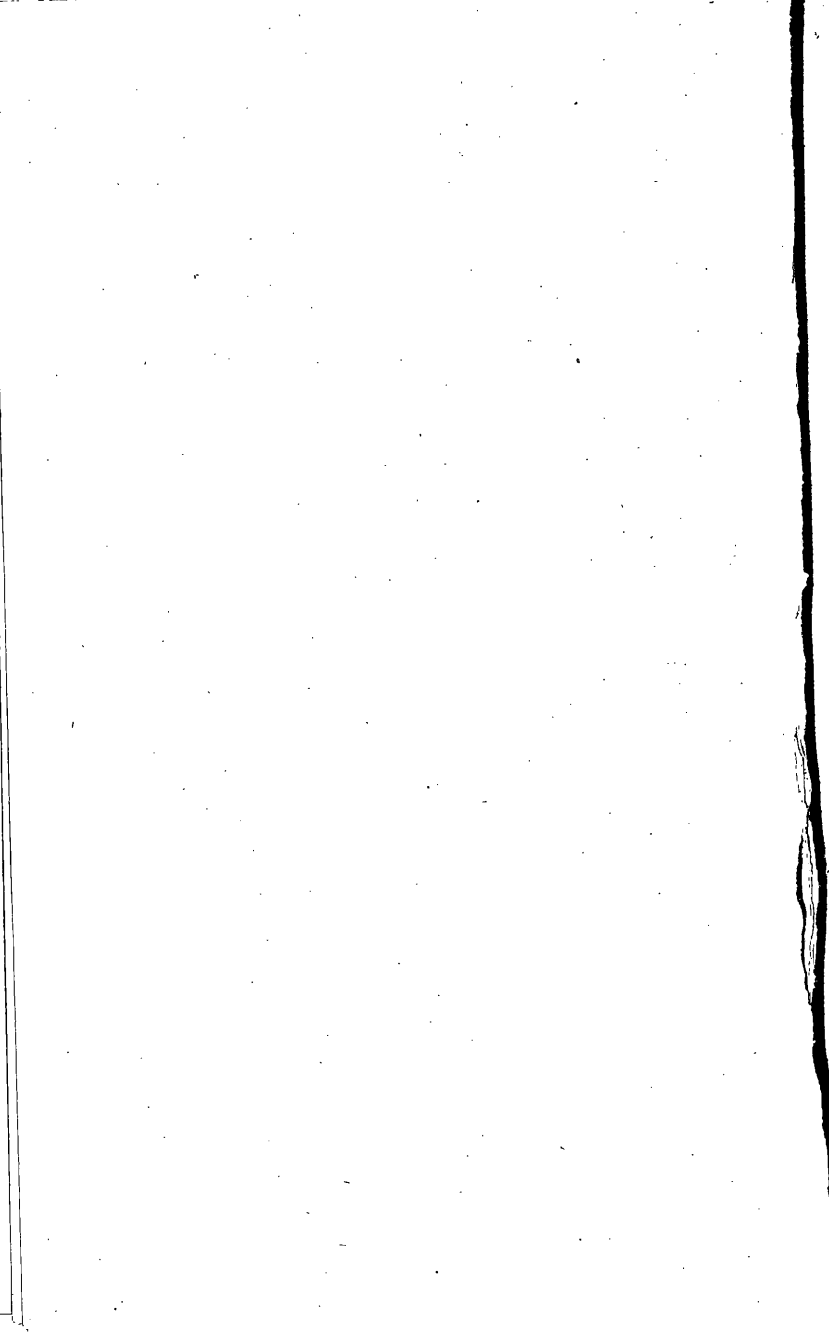

HISTORY.

On January 27th, 1888, James F. Rusling, W. O. Lanning and U. B. Titus met at the office of James F. Rusling, Trenton, N. J., pursuant to agreement, and after due conference decided to issue the following call :

“TRENTON, N. J., Jan. 28th, 1888.

“DEAR SIR :

“A meeting of representative officers and men of the 5th, 6th, 7th, 8th and 11th Reg'ts, N. J. Vols., will be held at the State Street House, Trenton, N. J., on Tuesday, Feb. 7th, 1888, at 11 A. M., to consider the advisability of holding a Reunion of the Second N. J. Brigade, at some time and place during 1888. You are cordially invited to attend same and bring a comrade. If unable to be present, your views as to such Reunion, and best time and place for same, if decided on, are kindly solicited.

This was sent to two or three officers and men of each N. J. Regiment belonging to the Brigade, and in answer to this “call,” February 7th, 1888, a number assembled, at the hour and place indicated, and proceeded to organize by electing William J. Sewell, Chairman, and James F. Rusling, Secretary. Said “call” was read,

and the roll of said Regiments being called, representatives of each were found present.

After due discussion it was unanimously agreed to hold a "Reunion" of the Brigade at Trenton, N. J., April 9th, 1888, and the following were appointed an Executive Committee, with power to add to their number, and to take all necessary steps to call said Reunion and provide for the same:

William J. Sewell was added to the Committee as *ex officio* Chairman, and James F. Rusling elected Secretary.

The question of inviting Regiments from other States, that also served in the Brigade, to participate in the "Reunion," was referred to the said Executive Committee, with power to act.

The following were also appointed a Committee to draft a proposed Constitution and By-Laws for a permanent organization or Brigade Society, to report at said "Reunion": James F. Rusling, W. O. Lanning and U. B. Titus.

The first meeting of the Executive Committee was held February 17th, 1888, and the following call adopted:

"HEADQUARTERS REUNION COMMITTEE,
 "SECOND NEW JERSEY BRIGADE, WAR 1861,
 "TRENTON, N. J., March 1st, 1888.

"The First Reunion of the old Second New Jersey Brigade, war of 1861, comprising the 5th, 6th, 7th, 8th and 11th Regts. N. J. Vols., will be held at Trenton, N. J., April 9th, 1888—the 23d Anniversary of Lee's surrender.

"Business meeting at Aaron Wilkes Post Room, G. A. R., Dippolt Building, South Greene street, at 11 o'clock A. M. Banquet at Masonic Temple, at 2 o'clock P. M., sharp, provided by citizens of Trenton.

"His Excellency the Governor, the Adjutant-General and Quartermaster-General, Generals Sickles, Carr, and all old brigade and regimental commanders, are expected to answer 'present' at roll-call.

"There will be a short street parade, in which the old brigade and regimental colors will be borne, and the old Musicians of the brigade will furnish the music chiefly.

"All surviving officers, non-commissioned officers and privates of the old 'Second Jersey Brigade' are invited to this our first Reunion since the war. Comrades, let us '*fall in*' once more, and renew the memories of Williamsburg, Fair Oaks, Gettysburg, the Wilderness, Petersburg and Appomattox! All coming are requested to notify the Secretary, by postal card or otherwise, not later than April 4th, that 'rations' may be provided by our Local Committee accordingly.

"Arrangements made with all N. J. railroads for reduced rates or excursion tickets.

Copies of this were sent to all Posts G. A. R. in New Jersey, to all newspapers in the State, and many in New York, Philadelphia, &c., with request to announce the same duly.

In response to this a large number of the surviving officers and men of the Brigade met in Trenton, N. J., April 9th, 1888, at Aaron Wilkes Post Room, and at 11 A. M. were called to order by Gen. W. J. Sewell, Chairman of said Executive Committee. Gen. Sewell made a few remarks and was followed by Gen. Robert McAllister, when, on motion, Gen. Sewell was made temporary Chairman, and Gen. J. F. Rusling temporary Secretary. Gen. Rusling, on behalf of said Committee, then stated the object of the "Reunion," and it was unanimously agreed to form a permanent organization and hold an "Annual Reunion."

The Committee on proposed Constitution and By-Laws then made their report, which, after amendment,

was duly adopted as hereinafter printed. In pursuance thereof "THE SECOND N. J. BRIGADE SOCIETY" was formed, and the following were elected officers thereof for 1888:

The place for the next "Reunion" was fixed for Elizabeth, N. J., and the date left to the Executive Committee.

The Society then adjourned and marched to the Masonic Temple, where a "banquet," attended by his Excellency Governor Green, Adjutant-General Stryker, Gen. Joseph B. Carr, Hon. James Buchanan and others, was served at 2 P. M. Able and eloquent addresses were made in response to "toasts," two poems were read, and the "Reunion" closed at 5 P. M.

CONSTITUTION.

ARTICLE I.

NAME.

This Association shall be known by the name and style of "THE SECOND NEW JERSEY BRIGADE SOCIETY."

ARTICLE II.

OBJECTS.

The objects of this Society shall be to cherish the memories and associations of the old SECOND NEW JERSEY BRIGADE, of the 2d Division (Hooker's), 3d Corps, Army of the Potomac; to strengthen the ties of fellowship and sympathy arising from service and companionship in that Brigade; to collect and preserve the records of its great achievements—its arduous campaigns and heroic battles; and to perpetuate the loyalty and patriotism, the good name and fame, of all who served honorably with that Brigade for any period, during the great struggle for liberty and union—1861 to 1865.

ARTICLE III.

MEMBERS.

SEC. 1. The members of this Society shall consist of all officers, non-commissioned officers and privates that served with the Second Brigade, New Jersey Volunteers, at any time during the war of 1861, and were honorably discharged from the service of the United States, and have now given their assent to the Constitution and By-Laws of this Society and paid their initiation fees.

SEC. 2. The oldest male representative of any deceased officer, non-commissioned officer or private of said Brigade, honorably discharged as aforesaid, may become an honorary member of this Society, by the vote of a majority of members present at any annual meeting; but such honorary members shall not be entitled to vote or to hold office, except by the unanimous consent of the regular members present at any meeting.

ARTICLE IV.

OFFICERS.

SEC. 1. The officers of this Society shall consist of a President, one Vice President from each of the Regiments serving in said Brigade (to wit: 5th, 6th, 7th, 8th and 11th N. J., 2d and 120th N. Y., 26th and 115th Pa., 1st, 11th and 16th Mass., and 1st Maine Heavy Artillery), a Secretary and a Treasurer.

SEC. 2. These officers shall be elected annually, at the annual Reunion of the Brigade, and shall serve for one year and until their successors are elected. They shall be elected by a majority vote of the members present, except the Vice Presidents, who shall be chosen by the members of each Regiment present, by a majority vote of the members thereof present respectively, and confirmed by the Society.

ARTICLE V.

BADGE.

The badge of this Society shall be the old Headquarter Flag, with "White Diamond" thereon, of the 3d Brigade, 2d Division, 3d Corps, Army of the Potomac.

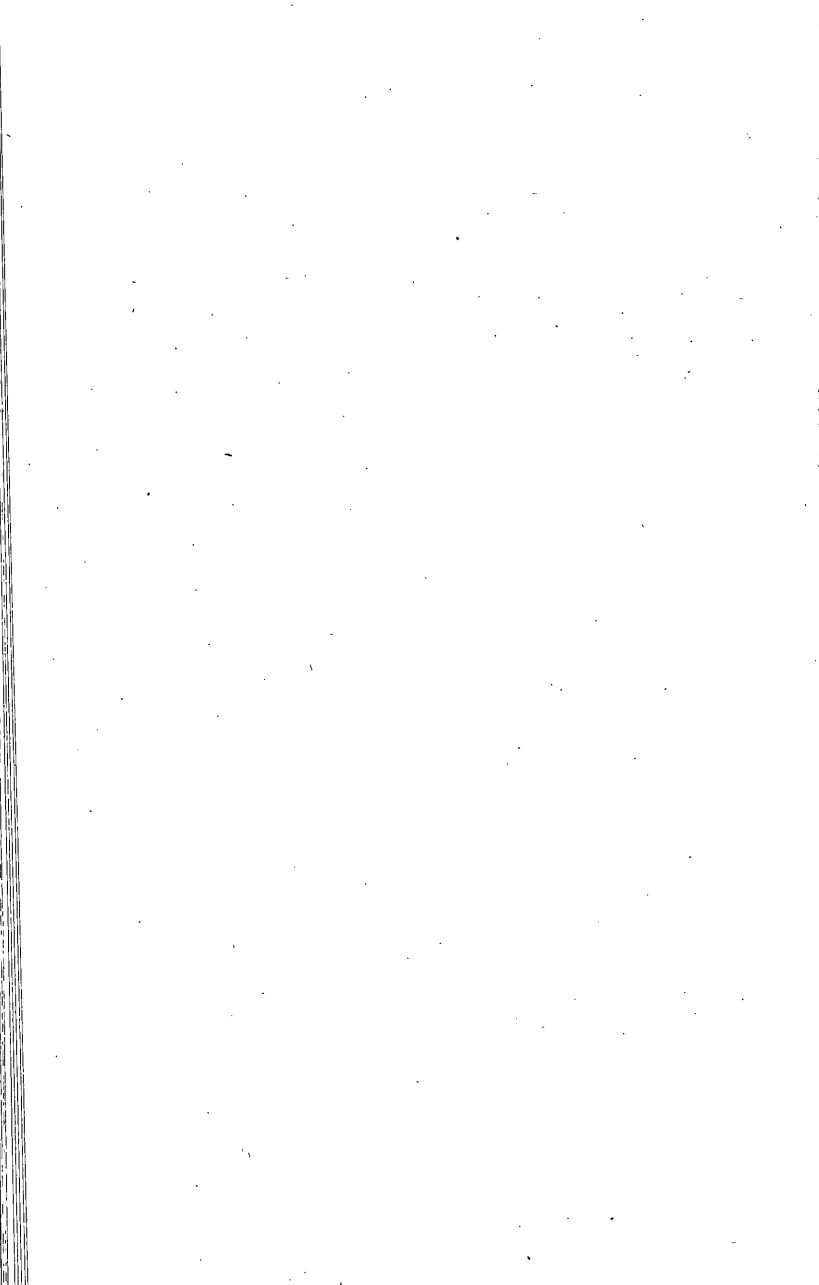
ARTICLE VI.

Political or other discussions foreign to the objects and purposes of this Society, as set forth in this Constitution, are declared inimical to the Society, and are hereby expressly prohibited at any and all meetings.

ARTICLE VII.

AMENDMENTS.

This Constitution may be altered or amended at any annual meeting of the Society; *provided*, the alteration or amendment proposed be submitted in writing; *and provided further*, that two-thirds of the regular members present at such meeting vote in favor thereof.



BY-LAWS.

1. Every person desiring to become a member of this Society shall give his assent to its Constitution and By-Laws, and shall pay to the Treasurer the sum of one dollar as an initiation fee, and each year thereafter the sum of fifty cents as annual dues, and shall thereupon be entitled to a copy of the Constitution and By-Laws, and to an Annual Reunion badge and banquet ticket, and to all publications of the Society, free of further charge.

2. No member shall be entitled to vote at any meeting who shall be in arrears.

3. The Secretary shall record the proceedings of the Society, and keep a register or book exhibiting the name and address of every member of the Society; he shall also notify each member at least one month in advance, of the time and place of the Annual Reunion.

4. The Treasurer shall receive and disburse all the moneys of the Society, upon the order of the Executive Committee, attested by the signature of the Chairman thereof, and shall, at each annual meeting, make a report in detail of his receipts and disbursements.

5. The Executive Committee shall consist of the officers of the Society, with the President thereof as Chairman *ex officio*. They shall have charge of all matters and things not otherwise provided for in these By Laws.

6. The Executive Committee shall, in due season, select an orator and poet, from the members of the Society or otherwise, to deliver an address and a poem, appropriate to the occasion, at each Reunion, if practicable.

7. When the place of the Annual Reunion shall be decided upon, the President shall appoint a suitable Local Committee from members living near or convenient to the place selected, and it shall be the duty of such Committee to make all needful arrangements and preparations for such Reunion, including the defraying of the expenses thereof.

8. The election of officers shall be as follows: *First.* A ballot for President, to be continued until some member receive a majority of the votes cast—the lowest candidate to be dropped on each ballot. *Second.* The Vice Presidents shall be selected in the same manner, by the respective Regiments (5th, 6th, 7th, 8th and 11th N. J., 2d and 120th N. Y., 26th and 115th Pa., 1st, 11th and 16th Mass., and 1st Maine Heavy Artillery), and elected by the Society. *Third.* A ballot for Secretary and Treasurer on a single ticket, the balloting to be continued until these officers are elected by a majority of the votes cast.

9. In the absence of the President the Vice President senior in rank present, shall preside.

10. No member of the Society shall speak more than once on any subject or question of business, and not longer than five minutes, without the consent of the Society first obtained.

11. These By-Laws may be altered or amended by a majority vote of all the members present at any annual meeting.

12. Cushing's Manual of Parliamentary Law shall be the authority for the government and regulation of all meetings of this Society.
