SENATOR JOSEPH C. WOODCOCK (Chairman): Good morning, ladies and gentlemen. This is a public hearing on Senate Concurrent Resolution 36.

This public hearing on Senate Committee Substitute for Senate Concurrent Resolution 36 with Senate Committee amendments and Senate amendments, which proposes an amendment to the State Constitution, is being held by the Senate Judiciary Committee by direction of the Senate and in accordance with the procedure for consideration of proposed amendments to the Constitution, directed by the Constitution and the Rules of the Senate.
