

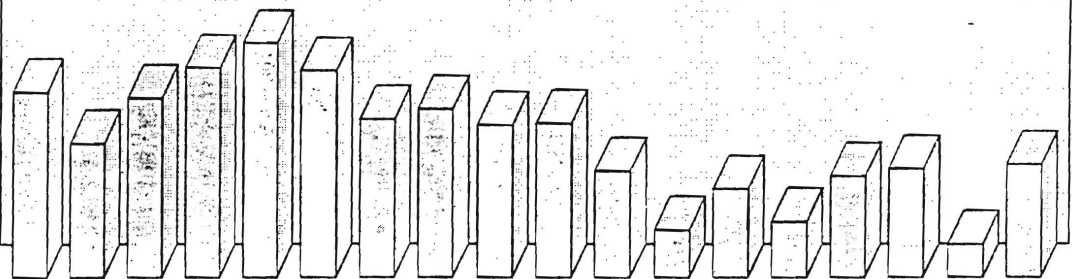

FEBRUARY 1995**

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### Highlights of Current Program Statistics

AFDC (Tables 1 and 5, Graphs 1 and 4)

121,425 eligible families in New Jersey were receiving AFDC as of the end of February 1995.

About 109,300 were single head of household families (Regular AFDC, C segment).

Among two-parent families, Unemployed Parents (F Segment) accounted for 3900, and State AFDC (N Segment) for 3300. There were more than 5000 Medicaid Only families.

By County, the largest numbers were in Essex with about 30,500 families, Hudson with 19,300, and Camden County with 13,800. They accounted for more than 52 percent of all AFDC families.

The other counties ranged from 219 families in Hunterdon to 7,826 in Passaic County.

The number of eligible families in February 1995 is 500 less than January. There has been a decline every month since the May/June 1994 peak of over 124,600, for a drop of more than 3200 or 2.6 percent.

Regular AFDC (C segment) peaked at nearly 111,800 in June 1994 then declined every month afterward, for a total drop of more than 2500 by February 1995.

F segment families declined from over 4500 in May 1994 to less than 3800 by December 1994. The number was about 100 higher in January and February 1995.

State AFDC (N segment) grew steadily from 2650 families in February 1993 to 3483 by May 1994 (almost one third), and has declined by only about 200 families since then.

The Medicaid Only group has hovered around 5000 families over the last two years.

### FOOD STAMP PROGRAM (Tables 2 and 6, Graphs 2, 5, and 6)

At the end of February 1995, 222,251 households were participating in the Food Stamp Program.

About 113,800 were AFDC households and 108,400 were Other Low Income households.

About 48 percent of all Food Stamp Households are in Essex (55,155), Hudson (29,571) and Camden (21,894) Counties.

These households included about 524,300 persons, 247,100 adults and 277,200 children.

In seven counties (Bergen, Hunterdon, Monmouth, Morris, Somerset, Sussex, and Warren) the number of adults exceeds the number of children in Food Stamp households.

Emergency shelter placements peaked at 573 in October 1993, and have remained below 500 since then.

During the period, All Other AFDC-EA fluctuated between a high of 2498 in May 1993 and a low of 1713 in December 1994.

### **JOBS/FDP PARTICIPATION RATES (Table 8, Graph 8)**

Statewide participation in the JOBS/FDP Program has had three troughs, in August 1993 at 12.5 percent, January/February 1994 at 16 percent, and again in August 1994 at 16.3 percent. It reached a new high in October 1994 at 21.8 percent, and remained nearly unchanged through December. The decline of more than one percent between December 1994 and January 1995, with little change in February, was similar to the pattern a year earlier. A gradual upward shift can be seen in the statewide rate.

Most counties have shown a similar pattern, with a rebound through October 1993. Several experienced declines in the 1993/1994 Winter months and then continued upward again in March 1994. Most counties declined from May through August 1994, then turned upward in September and October 1994. Rates remained fairly stable through December 1994, declined in seventeen counties in January 1995, and were evenly divided between increases and decreases in February.

Essex county's rate has remained under 10 percent (as has Cape May, except for two months), but has been increasing fairly steadily. In most counties rates have been between 10 and 30 percent. Atlantic, Cumberland, Salem, Somerset, and Sussex generally exceeded 30 percent, as has Passaic since October 1994. Warren exceeded 60 percent from June 1994 through October 1994.

### **GENERAL ASSISTANCE (Table 9, Graph 9)**

For the period January 1993 through June 1994 (the latest available information), the number of GA recipients peaked at about 37,400 in March 1993 and again at 38,100 in March 1994. The number has since declined to 37,000 in June.

During the same period, the number of employable recipients fluctuated between 23,000 and 26,000. There were also peaks in March 1993 (25,900) and March 1994 (26,400). The June 1994 level of 24,800 was about 800 more than a year earlier.

The number of Unemployable GA recipients remained almost unchanged in the period, staying between 11,000 and 11,700. In May 1994, Unemployables grew by almost 600 to 12,200, the highest level in 1993-94, and stayed about the same in June.

### **CHILD SUPPORT AND PATERNITY (Table 10)**

Total collections of the Child Support and Paternity Program grew from about \$438 million to more than \$510 million from FY1993 to FY1994, an increase of 16.6 percent. Total AFDC/Foster Care collections remained almost unchanged at around \$92 million. Non-AFDC collections grew from less than \$346 million to almost \$418 million, or 21 percent.

For the six months ended December 1994 (1st half FY1995), AFDC/Foster Care Collections were up 1.3 percent from a year earlier, led by a million dollar increases in income withholdings and about 1.5 million in collections from other states. Non-AFDC collections were up 16 percent, or about \$22 million more. Most of the increase was in Income Withholding, Other/Own Behalf, and For Other States.

Food Stamp households in New Jersey increased from 209,000 in February 1993 to a high of almost 222,500 in May of 1994, and have remained over 220,000 every month since. The February 1995 level was about 1000 more than January.

The numbers of AFDC(FS) households and Other Low Income households continue to converge. AFDC(FS) households were only 1900 higher in February 1995, at 113,800, than in February 1993, and changed little since September 1994. Other Low Income households increased by 11,400 from 97,000 in February 1993 to about 108,400 by February 1995.

Total recipients rose from 507,600 in February 1993 to almost 531,000 in March 1994, declined to about 522,000 by September 1994, and remained close to that level since.

Recipient adults have increased much more than recipient children. Adult recipients increased from about 234,000 in February 1993 to about 247,000 in February 1995 (near the peak of over 248,000 in March through June 1994). In the same period, recipient children increased from nearly 274,000 in February 1993 to slightly more than 277,000 in February 1995, with a peak of 282,700 in March 1994.

### EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE (Tables 3 and 7, Graphs 3 and 7)

At the end of February 1995 a total of 6528 eligible AFDC families were receiving Emergency Assistance (EA) in New Jersey.

3636 families were receiving Temporary Rental Assistance (TRA).

There were 605 motel placements and 408 emergency shelter placements.

All other AFDC-EA accounted for 1879 families, including either one-time benefits such as back rent, back utilities, security deposits, furnishings, and clothing and food allowance, or shared or transitional housing.

2433 families in Essex County received EA, including 1940 provided TRA. Mercer had 655 EA recipient families and Middlesex had 653, while Bergen had 442. All other counties had between 17 and 385 with eight under 100.

AFDC families receiving Emergency Assistance reached almost 8500 in May 1993, then declined to less than 7000 by December 1993. Similarly, in 1994 the number reached nearly 7700 in April and July, then declined to about 6500 by December, but was nearly unchanged through February 1995.

The decline in the number of Families receiving Temporary Rental Assistance accounted for most of the decline in EA. At almost 4900 in May 1993, it declined to less than 4000 in December 1993, remained between 4100 and 4300 through July 1994, and declined the rest of the year to less than 3700 in December 1994 through February 1995.

Motel placements were around 700 during most of 1993, and around 600 in late 1993 and the first half of 1994. The level was again near 700 during the second half of 1994, but dropped to about 600 by early 1995.

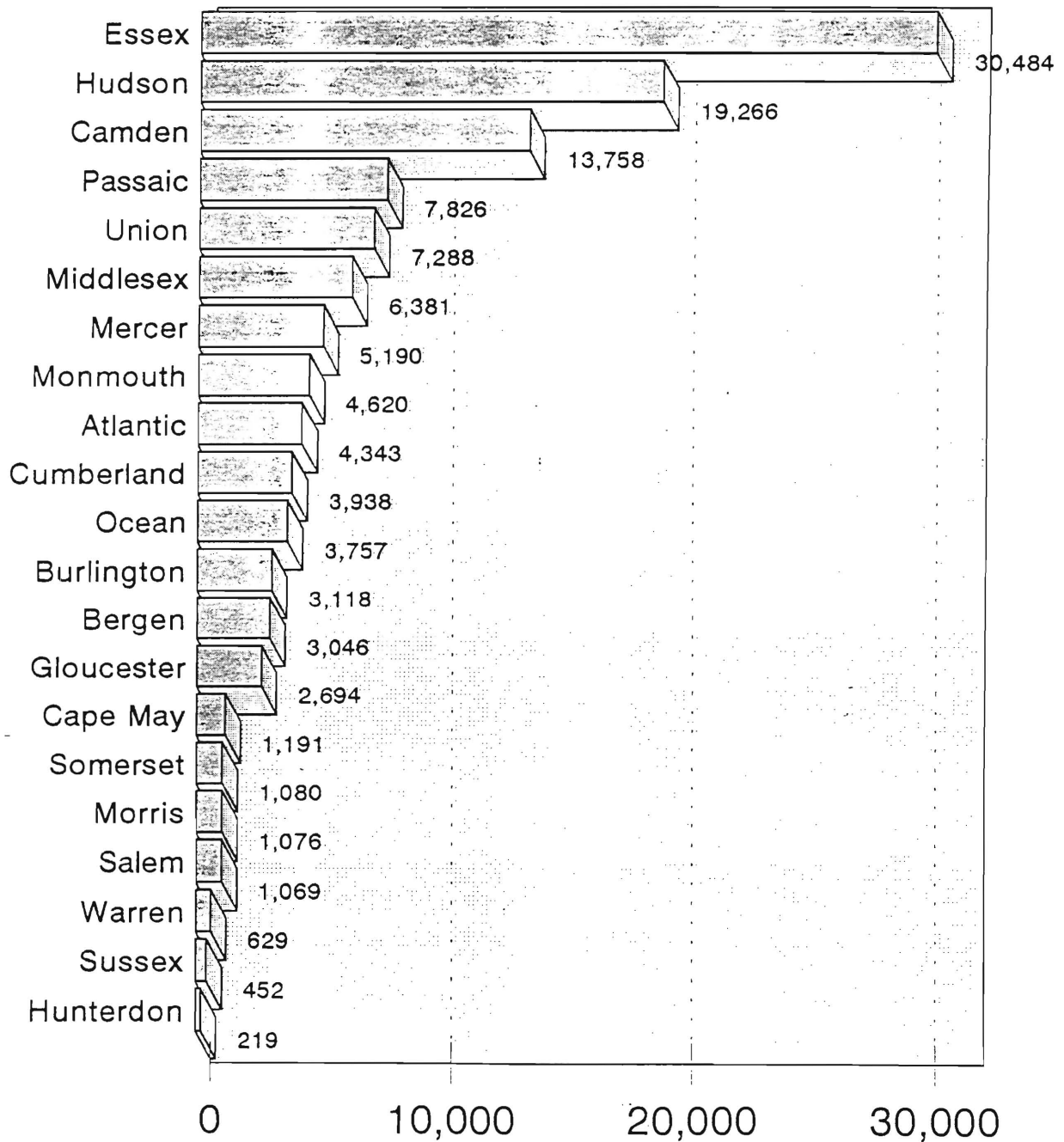

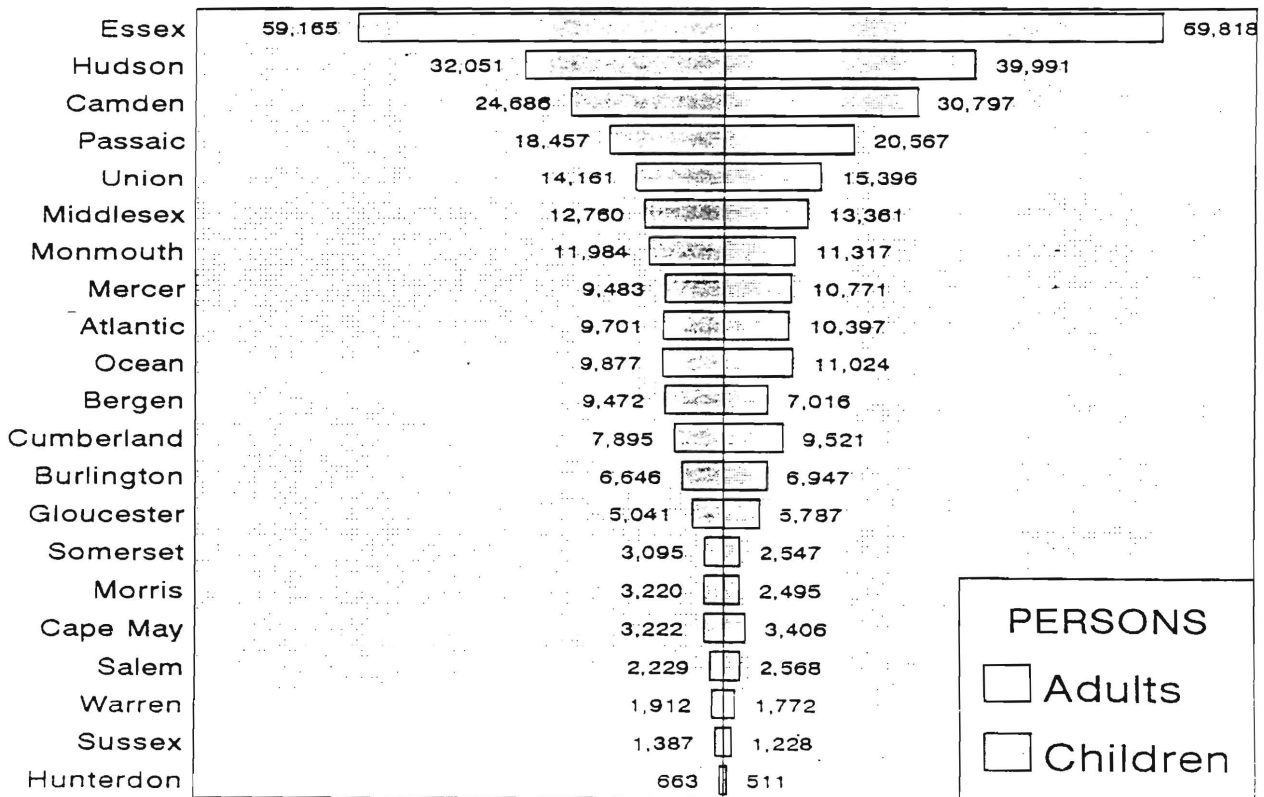

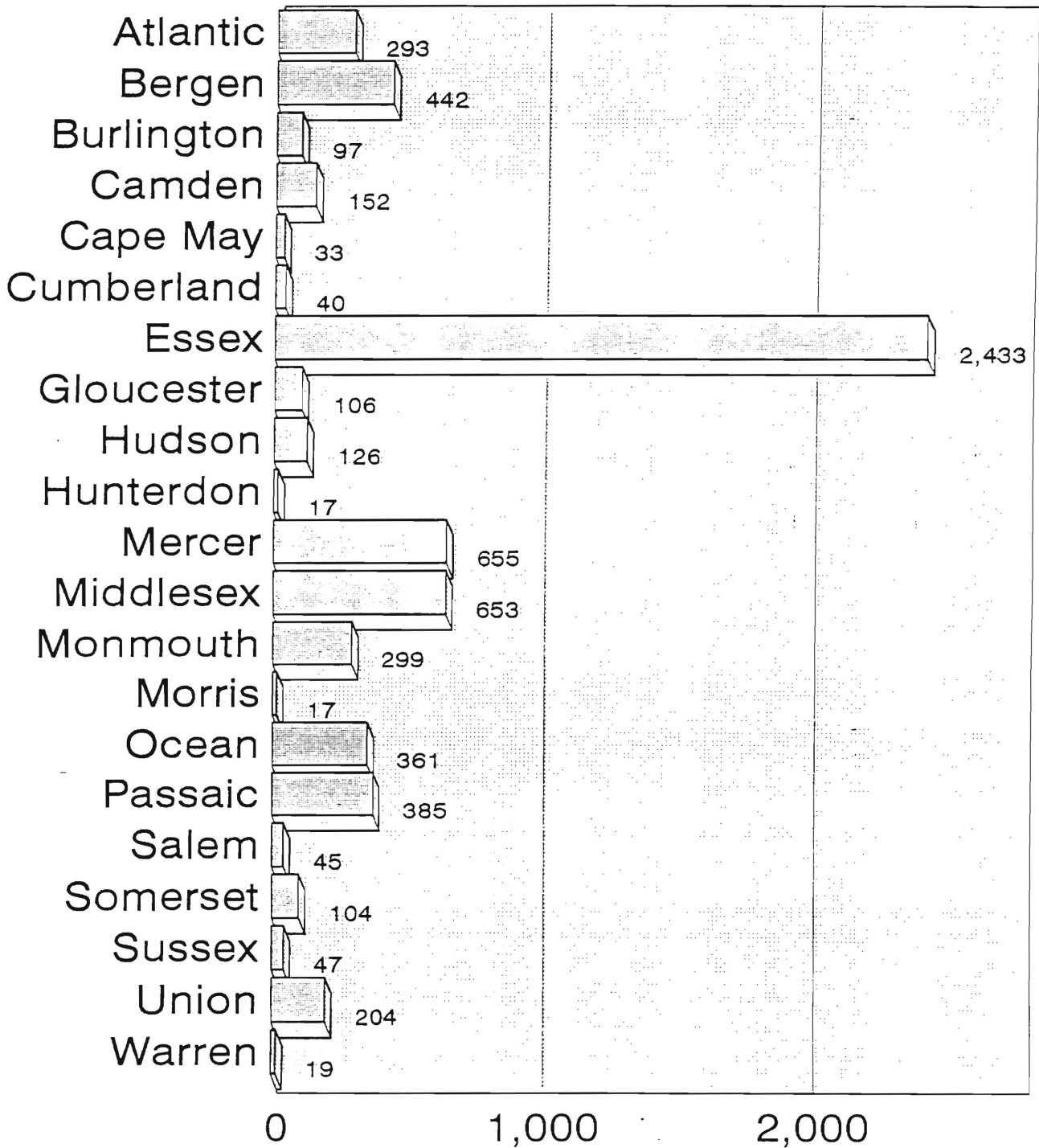

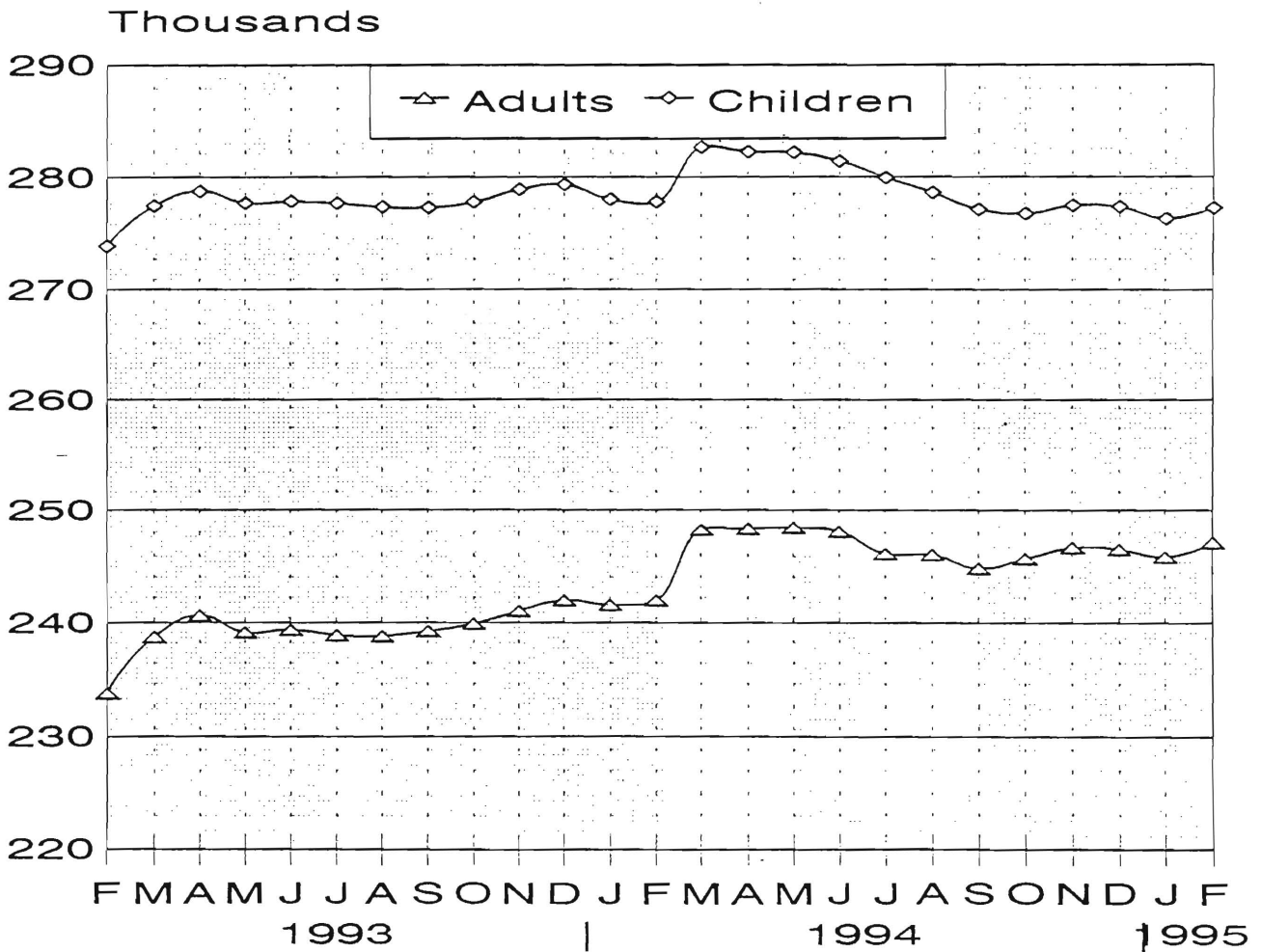
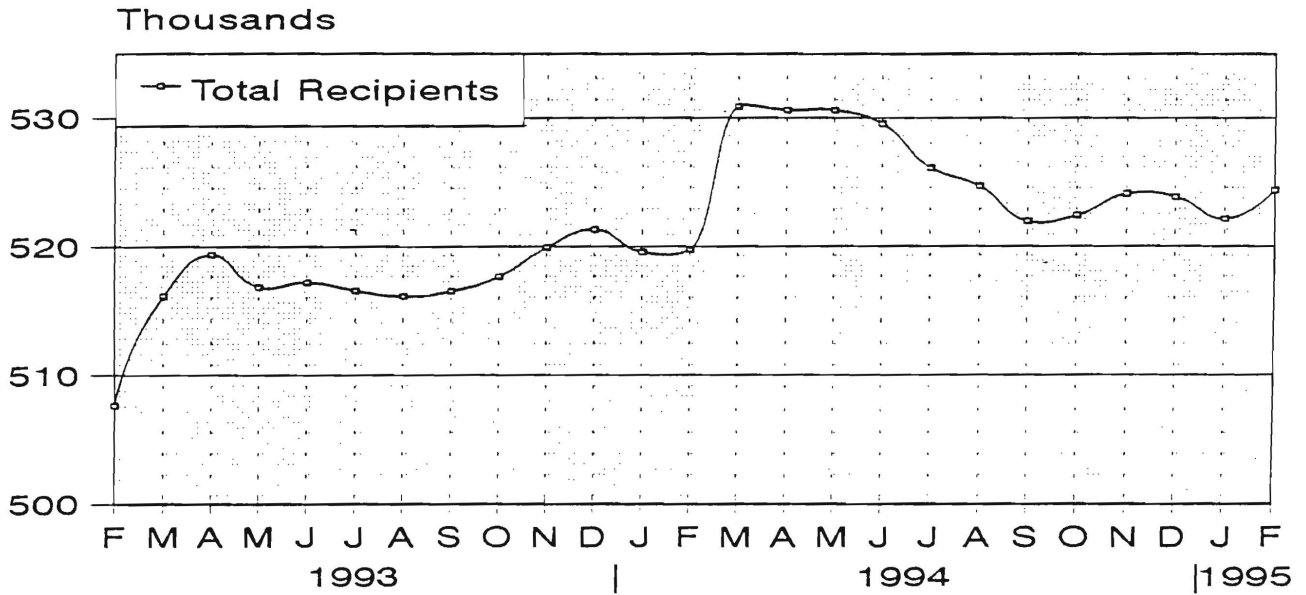
# Food Stamp Households

## AFDC Families Receiving Emergency Assistance February 1993 through February 1995



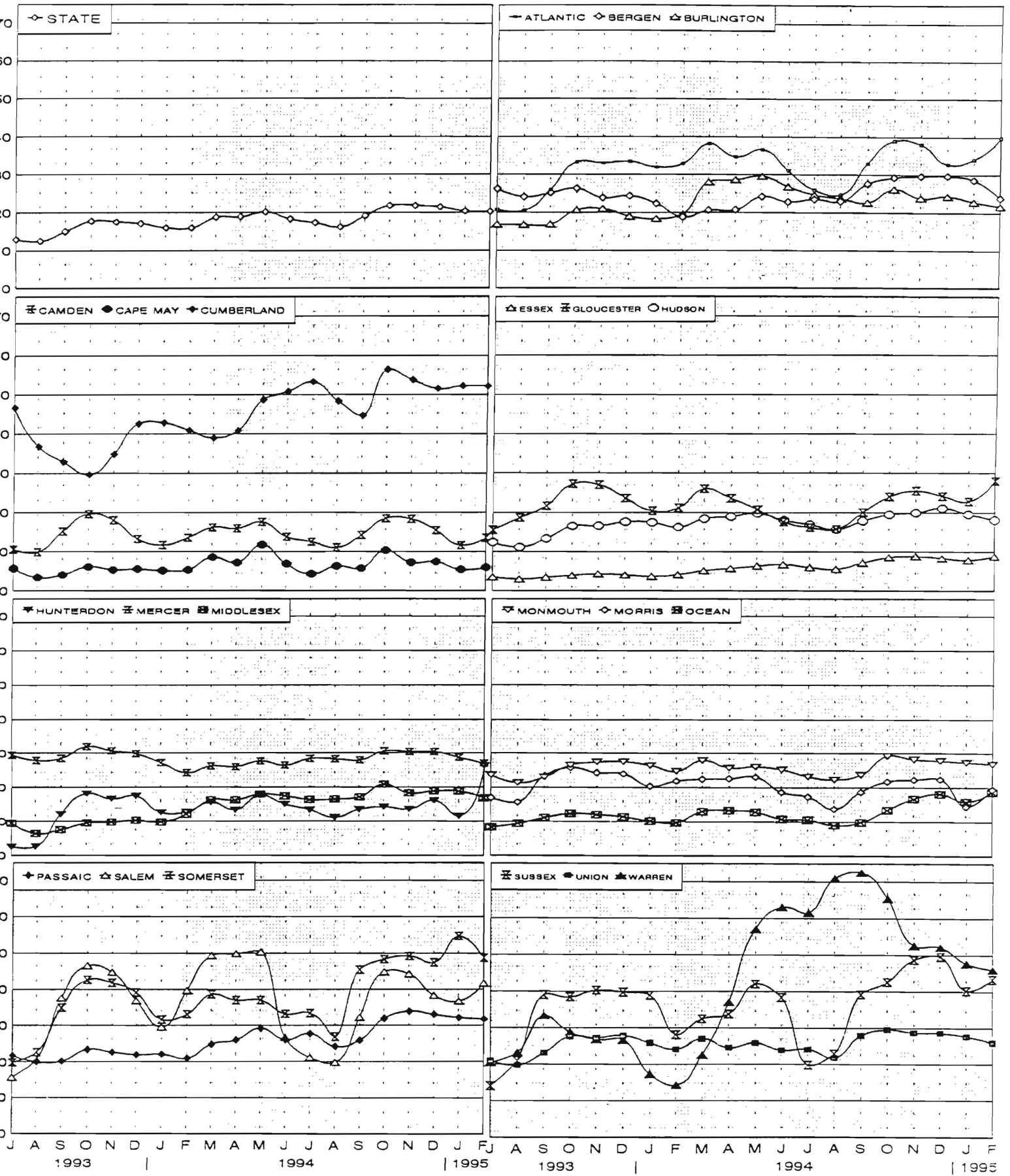

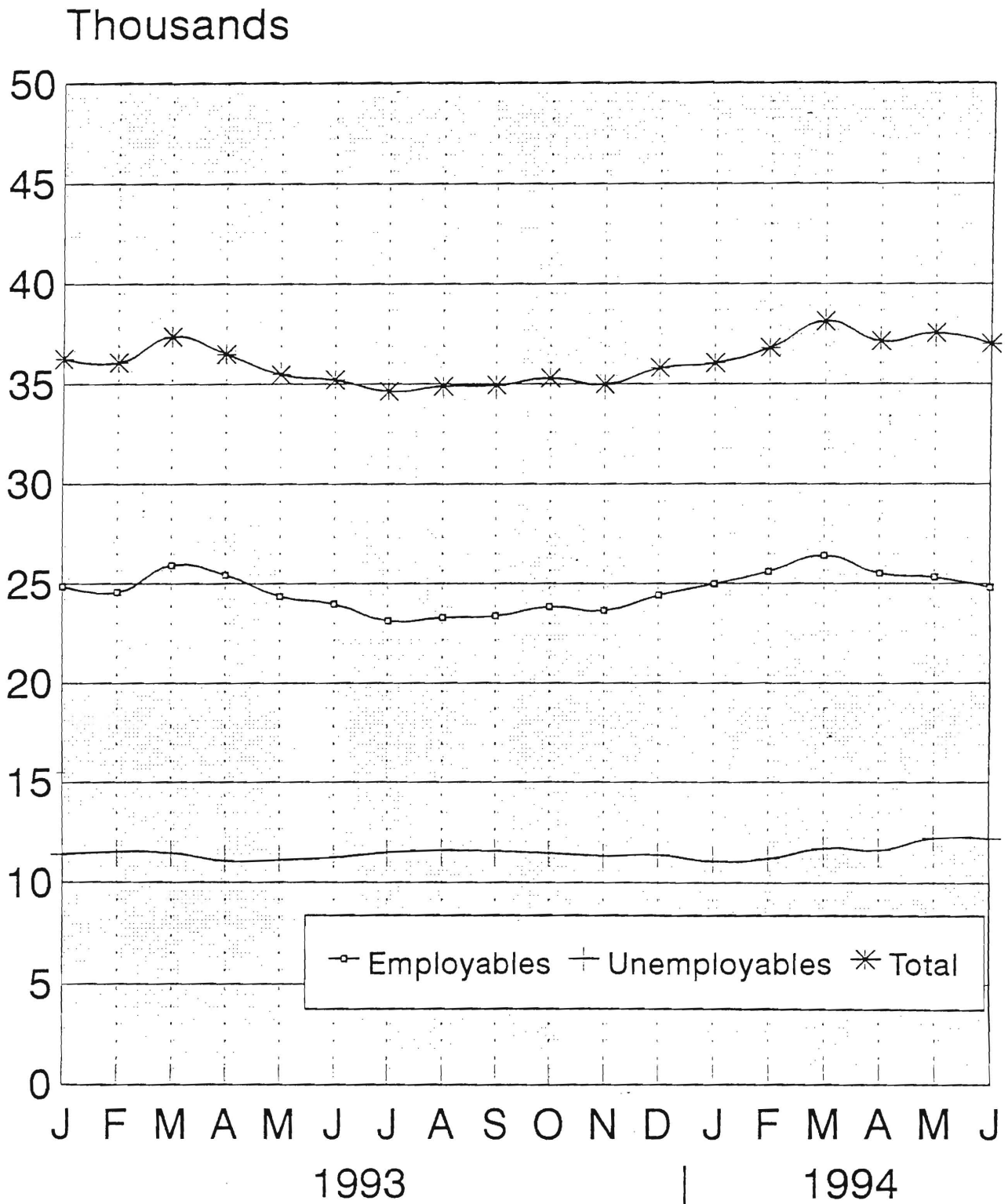

## Explanatory Notes

The Department of Human Services Division of Family Development provides basic income and an opportunity to achieve self-sufficiency for individuals and families served by the Division's programs. The Division provides leadership, direction and supervision to those public agencies responsible for administering those programs and plans for and develops policies to promote self-sufficiency.

**AID TO FAMILIES WITH DEPENDENT CHILDREN (AFDC)** - Financial assistance for dependent children and their natural or adoptive parents, or certain other relatives recognized as taking the place of a parent.

**Regular AFDC (C Segment)** - assistance when only one parent is in the home due to death or absence, or both parents are in the home but at least one is incapacitated.

**Unemployed Parents (F Segment)** - assistance when both parents are in the home, neither is incapacitated and the primary wage earner meets the federally defined criteria for unemployment.

**State AFDC (N Segment)** - assistance when both parents are in the home, neither is incapacitated, and the primary wage earner does not meet the federal definition of unemployment.

**Medicaid Only** - families no longer receiving AFDC financial assistance but remaining eligible for Medicaid under applicable provisions which extend coverage beyond period of AFDC assistance.

**FOOD STAMP PROGRAM (FS)** - Authorized by Congress as a nutritional supplement program to provide low income households with more food of greater variety and better nutrition. Program eligibility is based on household income, resources, and expenses for medical, shelter, and dependent care. CWA staff refer certain recipients to the New Jersey Department of Labor for participation in the Food Stamp Employment and Training Program.

**EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE (EA)** - Payments to those eligible for AFDC (also for General Assistance or Supplemental Security Income, not included here), authorized during the 30 consecutive days immediately following the emergency (defined as a substantial loss of shelter, food, clothing, or household furnishings by fire, flood or other similar disaster) or if the eligible individual or family is in an imminent or actual state of homelessness.

**JOB OPPORTUNITY AND BASIC SKILLS PROGRAM (JOBS)** - Federally mandated work/training program for recipients of AFDC established by the Family Support Act of 1988 under Part F of Title IV of the Social Security Act.

**FAMILY DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM (FDP)** - Reform legislation enacted by the State Legislature in January 1992 to: build, strengthen, and support the family unit; encourage family formation; reduce the long-term aspects of welfare dependency; look to the needs of the family unit as a whole; emphasize education and training for all family members; maximize use of educational, training and employment resources; and develop genuine private sector job opportunities.

**County** - Counties currently participating in the Family Development Program are indicated by an "\*".

**SNAPSHOT OF ACTIVITY AT POINT IN TIME** - Status of activities as of the end of the month:

**Total Non-Exempt JOBS/FDP Recipients** - Calculation of the number of mandatory IV-F individuals (FAMIS report # FB304).
