SUBJECT: Increased Income Eligibility Standards; New Jersey Care...Special Medicaid Programs

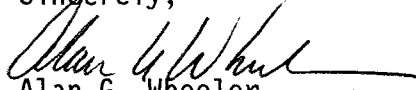
This is to advise that the federal poverty level guidelines for 1994 were published in the February 10, 1994 issue of the Federal Register. Enclosed are the new income standards based on the guidelines for the New Jersey Care program and the Specified Low-Income Medicare Beneficiaries (SLMB) program which is administered by this Division. These new standards are retroactively effective to January 1, 1994.

The CWA shall immediately review all cases that would otherwise have been terminated from New Jersey Care as a result of the Social Security cost-of-living increase. No action is required for those cases that remain eligible under the new income standards. Any of the continued cases which are not eligible under the new standards shall be terminated effective April 1, 1994. Adverse action requirements must, of course, be met.

Because these standards are retroactively effective to January 1, 1994, CWAs shall review all cases denied for excess income since that date which would be eligible under the new standards. Any case found to be eligible under the new standards shall be accreted to the eligibility file with an effective date reflecting the later of January 1, 1994 or the date of eligibility.
