Joint Committee on the Public Schools
Ramifications Of Potential Federal Funding Cuts to IDEA**

Save Our Schools NJ (SOSNJ) is a grassroots organization with over 38,000 members statewide who believe all children deserve a high-quality education regardless of their zip code. Public school funding is our highest priority.

Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA)

In 1975, The Education for All Handicapped Children Act (P.L. 94-142) was passed to support states in protecting the civil rights of and ensuring the education of, infants, children, and youth with disabilities. The name was changed to the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) when it was reauthorized in 1990.

Funding IDEA

Funding IDEA has been challenging since its inception. It began with only an aspiration to fund up to 40% of state costs. In the last 49 years, it has never been funded above 17%. In 2024, it was 14.7%, effectively shorting states, and therefore students, by billions of dollars. Now, multiply that by 49 years.

What are the provisions of IDEA?

There are four sections in IDEA, Part A - D, that define requirements and funding. It's useful to understand what each part does generally.

Part A defines terms to uphold the law, including three you will likely recognize as the basis for providing an education to students with disabilities: Individual Education Plan (IEP), Least Restrictive Environment (LRE), and Free Appropriate Public Education (FAPE).

Part B provides funding to states to educate students ages 3 through 21. There are two grants to states in this section, which include a Maintenance of Effort requirement.

- Section 611, which provides grants to states to support students with disabilities ages 3 through 21, making up roughly 90% of the total IDEA funding
- Section 619, a Preschool grant, for students with disabilities ages 3 through 5

Part C provides funding for children with disabilities ages birth to three and their families. This section also defines “early intervention.” This includes family visits, training, occupational therapy, medical support for diagnostic and evaluative services, and transportation.

Part D provides grant funding for the U.S. Secretary of Education to systemic support nationally and for capacity building at the state level. This includes competitive grants for personnel development, technical assistance, research and evaluation of programming, and training and support of students and their families – this includes funding the National Center for Parent Information and Resources.

How much IDEA funding have New Jersey districts received?

Since I referenced, the 2022-23 school year below, I’ve attached a spreadsheet from NJDOE with the district allocations from that year. Part B and C funding was about \$410.5 million. What happens if a significant portion of that funding is cut? What is the state plan to make up for any losses?

Funding Special Education in New Jersey

In 2008, with the adoption of the School Funding Reform Act (SFRA) New Jersey moved to a census-based formula for special education. The formula uses a state classification percentage multiplied by a district’s total student population and then by a multiplier that adjusts for the relative wealth of the district. To put it plainly, students lose because of both of those multipliers AND because the formula treats every disability as though they cost the same to educate.

The census-based formula was meant to save money, not educate our most vulnerable students. The State of New Jersey did not meet its funding obligation for more than a decade, exacerbating districts’ struggle to meet students’ needs. We hear of that struggle all over the state from families fighting for everything from getting special education testing and classification to delivery of services.

To highlight why using a state classification average is problematic: In an April 2024 report from the Education Law Center (*A Roadmap for Improving New Jersey’s School Funding Formula: Impact of Census-Based Funding for Special Education*; see attached), for the 2022-23 school year, the state average was 15.9% and the actual rates ranged from 3% to 34%. Districts with classification rates higher than the statewide average were underfunded by \$378 million.

How to provide an equitable solution and build resilience to federal funding cuts.

Change the special education funding formula to tiers. Many examples of state funding formulas are tiered, considering how much it costs to educate students at varying levels of disability.

Sixteen states have some form of a tiered or weighted system. Tiers are based on various factors including federal disability classifications, the type of classroom setting, the number of hours in specialized classrooms, etc. Some states have a hybrid of tiers and some other funding mechanism(s). For example, using tiers with extraordinary aid or categorical aid.

New Jersey has used extraordinary aid to help cover some of the costs over \$40k. Unfortunately, it has been historically underfunded and more recently, flat-funded. Using tiers and the actual number of classified students, districts would receive appropriate funding and the need for extraordinary aid would likely be far less.

Assuring districts of appropriate funding through the state for students with disabilities means they can create and maintain programming.

Please keep this in mind as you think about how the State of New Jersey will fund public schools during a federal administration that does not appear interested in supporting public schools:

We have been in scarcity mode for so long that it's been normalized.

The bottom line is money matters.

To have an environment where all students thrive, schools must be well-funded. This is not an opinion. Academic research demonstrates it over and over: *money matters*.

WHERE DO PUBLIC SCHOOL DISTRICTS RECEIVE FEDERAL FUNDING?

Federal funding to schools is targeted to support students across a wide spectrum of needs. The below table outlines where Federal funding is targeted. Note that not all school districts receive all title funds. Title funds are also based upon identified need, not spread across the country equally from school to school.

FEDERAL FUNDING TABLE

SOUTH BRUNSWICK SCHOOL DISTRICT TITLE I & IA FUNDING

Title IA - SEAs, LEAs, schools (public and private), students receive funding by formula involving poverty and population. Eligible schools enrolling >40% of children from low income families eligible to use funds for schoolwide programs. **Eligible schools enrolling <40% or that decline school-wide programs can offer targeted assistance to individual students.**

South Brunswick received slightly over \$400,000 in an average year for targeted assistance for individual students and a small amount for a specified very small group in one school.

SOUTH BRUNSWICK SCHOOL DISTRICT TITLE I & IA FUNDING

The Funding = ~\$400,000 in an average year

Our primary use of these funds go to salaries and benefits for staff to educate students who receive free and/or reduced lunch.

Additional funding supports staff who perform before and after school supports for students from a targeted group of struggling special needs students

SOUTH BRUNSWICK SCHOOL DISTRICT TITLE IIA FUNDING

Title IIA - The purpose of this program is to increase academic achievement by improving teacher and principal quality. This is done by increasing the number of highly qualified teachers, principals and assistant principals in classrooms/schools through professional development, support for new teachers and other like activities. Basically professional development type activities and expenditures.

South Brunswick received slightly over \$250,000 in an average year for supporting our work to educate staff in the craft of instructional practices.

SOUTH BRUNSWICK SCHOOL DISTRICT TITLE IIA FUNDING

The Funding = ~\$250,000 in an average year

Our primary use of these funds go to expenditures associated with teachers teaching teachers, workshops (both in-district and out of district), consultants and materials to support staff improvement.

SOUTH BRUNSWICK SCHOOL DISTRICT TITLE III FUNDING

Title III - The overarching purpose is to ensure that multi language learner students, including immigrant children and youth, attain English language proficiency and meet the same challenging state academic standards that other students are expected to meet. Funding is provided based upon the number of MLL students in a school/district

South Brunswick received slightly under \$100,000 in an average year for supporting our work to educate students learning English, as well as support to families of MLL learners.

SOUTH BRUNSWICK SCHOOL DISTRICT TITLE III FUNDING

The Funding = ~\$100,000 in an average year

Our primary use of these funds go to direct supports for students learning English, including staffing, technology needs and consultants to work with us on best practices in the field.

SOUTH BRUNSWICK SCHOOL DISTRICT TITLE IV FUNDING

Title IV – SEAs, LEAs, Schools and local communities may use funds towards programs aimed at providing a well rounded education for all students. These funds run the gambit and can be used in many different academic categories such as STEM, The Arts, Advancement classes etc...

South Brunswick received slightly over \$25,000 in an average year for supporting our work to educate students in a chosen areas. Due to the small amount we focus these funds on one targeted are; STEM programming.

SOUTH BRUNSWICK SCHOOL DISTRICT TITLE IV FUNDING

The Funding = ~\$25,000 in an average year

Our primary use of these funds go to direct supports for STEM programming. Simply, it is not enough funding to spread across multiple areas so it is used to target supports in STEM.

IDEA FEDERAL FUNDING

The IDEA governs how states and public agencies provide early intervention, special education, and related services to more than 6.5 million eligible infants, toddlers, children, and youth with disabilities. Formula grants are awarded to states annually to support early-intervention services for infants and toddlers with disabilities and their families, preschool children ages three through five, and special education for children and youth with disabilities. Formula grants for school-age children go to States and districts, which must follow a specific set of rules regarding the education of children with disabilities. Because IDEA is considered a civil rights law, education must be provided to students as detailed in the law regardless of the amount of federal funds received.

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SOUTH BRUNSWICK AND IDEA

South Brunswick receives annual IDEA supports across three areas:

1. IDEA Basic Funding = ~\$2,100,000
2. IDEA Prek Funding = ~\$70,000
3. Extraordinary Aid = ~\$2,000,000

IDEA BASIC FUNDING K-12 SPECIAL NEEDS STUDENTS

The \$2,000,000 we receive from these funds are allocated accordingly:

- 50% direct to tuition for out of district students
- 40% Salaries & Benefits for in-district special education staff
- 5% Materials specific for special needs students
- 5% to non-public school districts as required by law

IDEA EXTRAORDINARY AID FUNDING K-12 SPECIAL NEEDS STUDENTS

Extraordinary Aid (EA) funds are provided to states to distribute to districts. NJ has a formula for how these funds are distributed. The formula includes expenditures occurred over a certain threshold for educating an individual student, currently if the cost to educate an individual student exceeds \$40,000 (not including of transportation) the amount obe 40K goes into a bucket to be reimbursed to the district. This threshold adjusts for students who are educated in out of district placement, but the same premise applies. Ultimately, the State distributes these funds based on a percentage of how much a district spent over the threshold. This past year, 71% of a district's EA was reimbursed.

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IDEA EXTRAORDINARY AID FUNDING K-12 SPECIAL NEEDS STUDENTS

The \$2,000,000 we receive from these funds are allocated across the array of special needs supports and programs ranging from salaries & benefits, tuition, nursing care, consultants, behavioral supports, assistive technology devices and other supports directly targeting supporting and educating special needs students.

IDEA PREK FUNDING AGE 3-PRE-KINDERGARTEN SPECIAL NEEDS STUDENTS

The \$70,000 we receive from these funds are allocated directly to tuition for out of district students

OVERALL FUNDING FROM FEDERAL DOLLARS

South Brunswick receives approximately \$5,000,000 annually as described above.

If these funds for cut, the impact on our most vulnerable students would be catastrophic. There would be no way for a school district to shuffle enough funding to support these students.

Consider the following...

IF FEDERAL FUNDS WERE CUT?

- One teacher has an average **cost of \$70,000**
- Benefits for a teacher have an annual average **cost of over \$30,000**
- One **Out of District** placement has a range of costs from **\$40,000 - over \$100,000 for EACH STUDENT**
- Behavioral Techs/Paraprofessional have an **average cost including benefits of \$65,000**

The math is simple, \$5,000,000 would remove massive support for the most vulnerable and those historically marginalized.

Testimony on Federal Education Funding

Thank you for the opportunity to speak today regarding the critical importance of federal education funding for our school district. I represent the Lenape Regional High School District, a large school district in South Jersey that serves students in grades 9 through 12. Our district encompasses eight municipalities and spans more than 326 square miles. We serve over 6,500 students, 18.4% of whom are classified, which is significantly higher than the state average of 15.9% for this school year as outlined in the SFRA (School Funding Reform Act) state aid formula.

This classification percentage results in a funding shortfall, as 167 of our students do not receive state aid dollars. This gap represents a loss of approximately \$3.6 million in state funding for our district. Additionally, the state provides special education funding through extraordinary aid. Unfortunately, this funding has been steadily decreasing each year, despite increasing costs and enrollment. Last year alone, our district faced a shortfall of nearly \$2.2 million in extraordinary aid.

I bring this to your attention because the Lenape Regional High School District receives approximately \$1.5 million in federal IDEA funding. Without this essential support, our ability to provide the required services for our special education students would be compromised, placing an undue burden on our general education programs. Our district has faced seven consecutive years of state aid cuts. In fact, our funding levels are now comparable to those seen in the early 1990s, even though our student enrollment has increased by 30% since that time. To put this in perspective, 35 years ago, the funding we received was equal to what we are receiving today, despite having 1,500 fewer students. Further cuts to our funding would have catastrophic consequences for our district.

In addition to IDEA funding, the district also relies on ESEA (Elementary and Secondary Education Act) funds. These funds are allocated for very specific purposes. For example, Title I funds are used to support tutoring and summer programs for students who may be falling behind. With the loss of ESSER (Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief) funding, we have had to reallocate Title I and Title IV funds to address the growing need for mental health services in our district. According to the CDC, the percentage of high school students experiencing depressive symptoms has risen from 28% in 2011 to 40% in 2023. Given that

this age group is the sole population we serve, our district's need for funding to support mental health services far exceeds what we currently receive.


Title II funding is allocated specifically for teacher training. Without this funding, the district would struggle to provide necessary professional development for our educators, particularly given our ongoing financial constraints. In total, the district receives approximately \$356,000 in ESEA funds. While this amount is limited, we utilize every dollar to support our students and address critical needs. Any reduction in this funding would force us to make difficult decisions, including cutting essential programs in order to absorb the loss.

Finally, I would like to address our district's experience with Medicaid funding. While Medicaid reimbursement is an important source of revenue for special education services, the process is time-consuming and labor-intensive, requiring significant effort from our caseworkers, secretaries, related service providers, and business office. Unfortunately, much of this work becomes futile when parents refuse consent or providers fail to log services, resulting in a loss of funding. The current process is burdensome, and I urge consideration of potential reforms to streamline this system.

In conclusion, federal funding is indispensable to the success of our district. It supports special education services, mental health initiatives, teacher training, and more. Cuts to this funding would have a devastating impact on our ability to serve our students. I respectfully ask that you consider the challenges we face and the essential role that federal education funding plays in helping us meet the needs of our students.

What is Impact Aid?

Impact Aid is a property tax replacement program. It provides payments to school districts in lieu of property taxes.

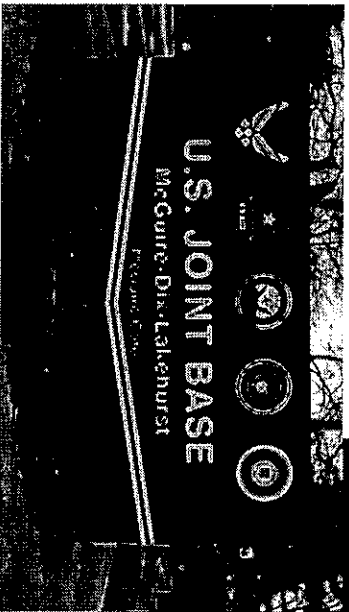
Public Law 81-874 signed on September 30, 1950

Currently it is Title VII of ESSA, designed to:

- Reimburse school districts for revenue lost when land is removed from local tax rolls due to federal activity (Section 7002- Federal properties)
- Compensate school districts for additional costs associated with the presence of federal property (Section 7003- Military Connected students, Indian Lands students and Federal Public Housing students)
- Impact Aid is a \$1.7 billion program; Districts in NJ receive about \$27 million

When the Federal Government Owns Land...

- It is removed from the local tax rolls = loss of revenue at the local level
- Additional students may be present in local schools due to activities on that land
- Both may impact a school district



Examples of Federal Impaction in NJ

- Military installations (7002 and 7003)
- Federal low-rent housing facilities (7003)
- Civil service activities: VA hospitals, national laboratories, national parks, etc. (7002)

A few examples in Burlington County

North Hanover is an Impact Aid District because 74% of our students live on the military installation and we receive no local property taxes for those students.

Beverly City is an Impact Aid District because 20% of their students live in Federal Low Rent Housing

New Hanover is an Impact Aid district because 50% of its land was taken by the Federal Government for federal purposes, and the tax revenue is lost for that land.

Section 7003 Payments: WFSUS

- Annually, districts count students and convert to WFSUS
- Since different types of students have different financial impacts on the school district, there are several different weights

You get PAID on Weighted Units...NOT on kids!

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What is the Role of the US Department of Education?

- All applications, calculations, verifications, audits and payments are processed through the Department of Education Office of Impact Aid.
- Analysts are assigned to work impartially with districts throughout the country. They are subject matter and application process experts.
- The Department monitors Congressional Appropriations (Budgeted vs CR) and releases payments as they are authorized by Congressional action.
- The staff of the Office of Impact Aid are experts in Impact Aid, understand the needs of different districts and are prepared to implement a very complex federal law in a way that is accurate and fair to all.

What makes Impact Aid different?

Impact Aid is really property tax replacement. It is OWED to the LEA that qualifies for it. It is the federal government's payment in lieu of taxes for land it took off the tax rolls for a federal purpose and, in many cases, put extra students in the school district with no tax revenue.

Impact Aid is current year funded. It is subject to the annual Congressional appropriations process.

The amount of Impact Aid a district receives is based on that district's current student counts converted to WFSUs (7003), and current land values (7002).

In some cases, Impact Aid is the vast majority of a district's revenue. In North Hanover, it is about 40% of the annual revenue.

Introduction

In 2008, New Jersey changed how the state funds special education in public schools as part of the School Funding Reform Act (SFRA). The new school funding formula adopted a census-based model, which funds all districts using the statewide average classification rate and a statewide average “excess cost.”

This model replaced the previous system that differentiated state special education aid based on four different tiers of student need. A dollar amount was assigned to each tier; students were assigned to tiers based on their disability; and districts received funding based on the total number of students they served in each tier. In contrast, the census model assumes that all districts serve a proportionate number of special education students, and that the average spending per pupil in each district is equal to the state average. This method disregards variations in classification rates and the uneven distribution of high- and low-cost disabilities.

The rationale for switching to a census-based model was at least partially to control New Jersey’s special education costs, which a report had recently identified as 40% higher than the national average.¹ School finance experts claimed that census funding would reduce costs by disincentivizing districts from overclassifying or misclassifying students into incorrect tiers. However, classification rates have continued to climb, from 14.8% in 2008-09, to 15.9% in 2022-23, and the average excess cost for education has increased from \$15,337 to \$19,524. Contrary to hopes the

new funding model would encourage districts to develop inclusive settings and in-district programs instead of high-cost, out-of-district placements, advocates have raised the possibility that the census method disincentivizes districts from developing specialized programs for students with disabilities because they may not receive funding for the students they would attract.

The SFRA included a statutory mandate for the Commissioner of Education to complete an independent study of the census methodology and issue recommendations to the Legislature regarding any needed adjustments to the state’s special education formula.² In 2011, the state commissioned Augenblick, Palaich and Associates (APA) to study the impact of the change in special education funding on New Jersey school districts.³ APA concluded that it was difficult to assess the impact of census funding based on the brief period of implementation, the lack of full SFRA funding, and limitations in the data collected by the New Jersey Department of Education (NJDOE). They recommended that the state address these shortfalls by fully implementing the census funding system, increasing data collection on where students are funded/served and the costs of serving different disability types, and conducting an analysis of enrollment patterns and costs across districts. Over a decade later, the SFRA remains underfunded, and the NJDOE has not publicly released any further assessment of the census-based funding system.

Advocates, researchers, and stakeholders expressed disapproval of the switch to census funding even before the SFRA’s implementation.⁴ More recently, the thirteen-member New Jersey Coalition for Special Education Reform, the New Jersey Council on Developmental Disabilities, and the New Jersey School Boards Association issued reports critical of the state’s current funding mechanism.⁵ Despite widespread agreement that census funding does not work for New Jersey students, no action has been taken by the state to improve the funding model.

In this report, we show that census-based funding does not meet the needs of New Jersey school districts and the students, in both special and general education, they serve. The analyses presented in this report demonstrate the need for New Jersey to convene school finance and special education experts to explore and recommend alternative funding models for special education that would better meet the needs of the state’s school districts.

How Census-Based Funding Works

The census-based funding model funds all districts as if they serve the same percentage of special education students. Districts are funded at the statewide average classification rate – 15.9% in 2022-23 – regardless of whether their actual classification rate is higher or lower. The SFRA sets a per-pupil allocation based on the statewide average “excess cost” for a special education student. In 2022-23, this excess cost was \$19,524.⁶ Districts also receive additional funding for extraordinary special education to cover a percentage of high-cost special education programs.

A district’s special education funding is calculated as:

$$\text{Resident Enrollment} \times \text{Statewide Average Classification Rate} \times \text{SFRA Excess Cost} \times \text{GCA}$$

where GCA is the SFRA’s geographic cost adjustment. One-third of this total is funded as a categorical aid that is paid fully by the state. The remaining two-thirds are wealth-equalized and split between a state and local share. Districts with greater fiscal capacity are expected to fund this portion largely through local tax dollars, while districts with less capacity receive a greater share of this funding through state aid.

Both of the core components of census funding are subject to criticism for failing to recognize year-to-year and district-to-district variations in the characteristics of the special education population. First, funding all districts based on the statewide average classification

rate ignores the significant variation in classification rates between districts and within districts over time. Second, funding all students at the average excess cost ignores variation in actual special education costs stemming from the severity of the disability and the types of services required to educate students. Because data are not currently available to assess districts' actual per-pupil expenditures relative to the state average excess costs, this report focuses solely on the fiscal consequences of using the statewide average classification rate. The fiscal impact of not differentiating funding based on the per-pupil costs of services adds another layer of complexity to the findings presented here.

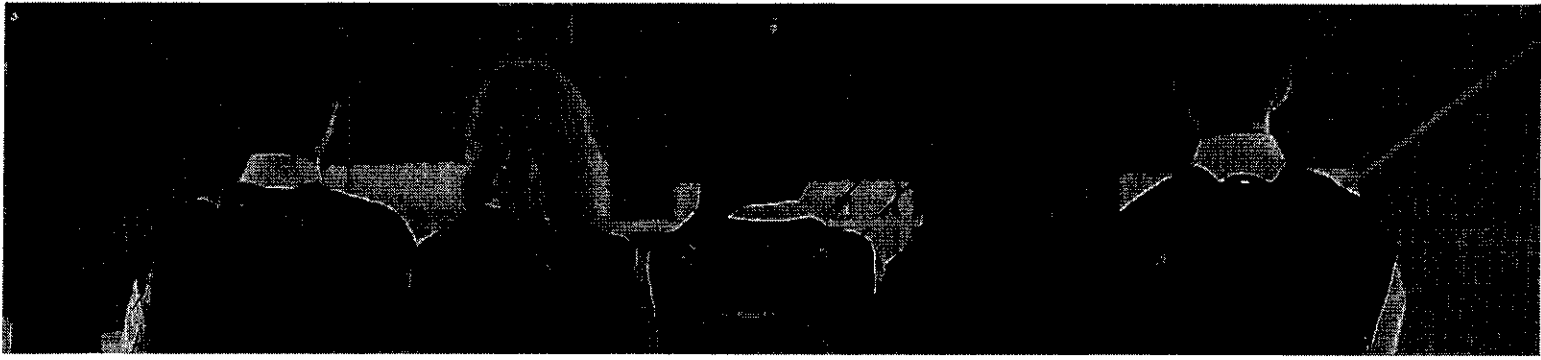
It is also important to note that this analysis demonstrates the effect of the census model under the hypothetical condition of a fully funded SFRA. In fact, the state has yet to fully fund its share of the SFRA, and about one-quarter of school districts have not raised their required local share, while others are raising local funds in excess of what is required by the formula. The funding gaps reported here are meant to assess the effect of the census model when the formula is operating optimally, with both state and local funding at the minimum set by the SFRA. Current funding gaps may be either more or less severe, depending on whether a district is above or below the funding targets in the SFRA.⁷

What is Extraordinary Special Education Aid?

Extraordinary aid is a separate funding mechanism from the census-based system described in this report. Districts receive reimbursement for high-cost special education expenditures that exceed certain thresholds. The amount of the reimbursement varies by educational setting. Districts must cover the full cost of any special education services below the threshold.

The reimbursement rates are as follows: 90% of costs above a \$40,000 threshold for in-district placements, 75% of costs above a \$40,000 threshold for placements in a separate public school program for students with disabilities, and 75% of costs above a \$55,000 threshold for students placed in a separate private school for students with disabilities. Extraordinary aid has historically been underfunded by the state: in 2022-23, districts received reimbursement for only 72% of their eligible costs.

Inequities Resulting From Census-Based Funding

Classification rates in New Jersey school districts vary widely, from a low of 3% to a high of 34%. The majority of districts have classification rates that exceed the statewide average, which means that the SFRA underfunds most districts relative to their actual special education enrollment. In fact, more districts are underfunded now than in 2009-10, the year after census funding was implemented. In 2022-23, the state underfunded special education in 60% of school districts, compared to 48% in 2009-10. In 2022-23, 54% of K-12 students were educated in districts where the state underfunded special education (Figure 1).

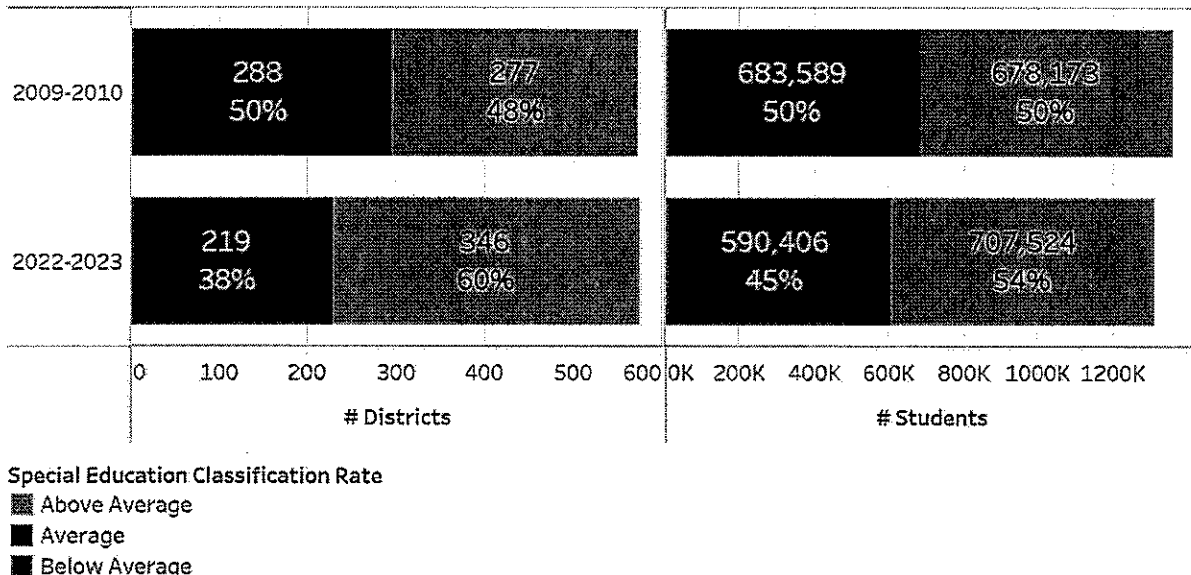
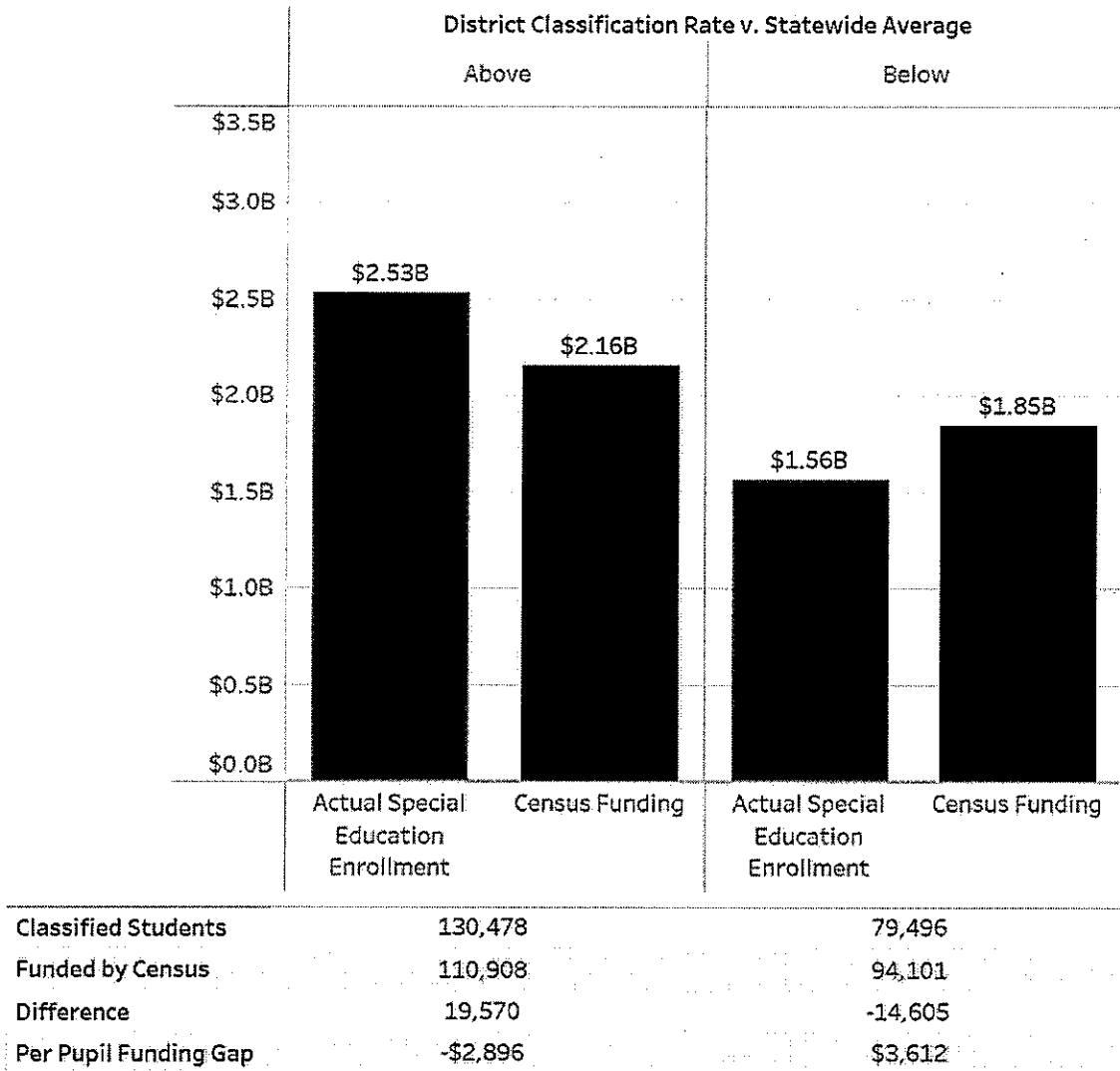


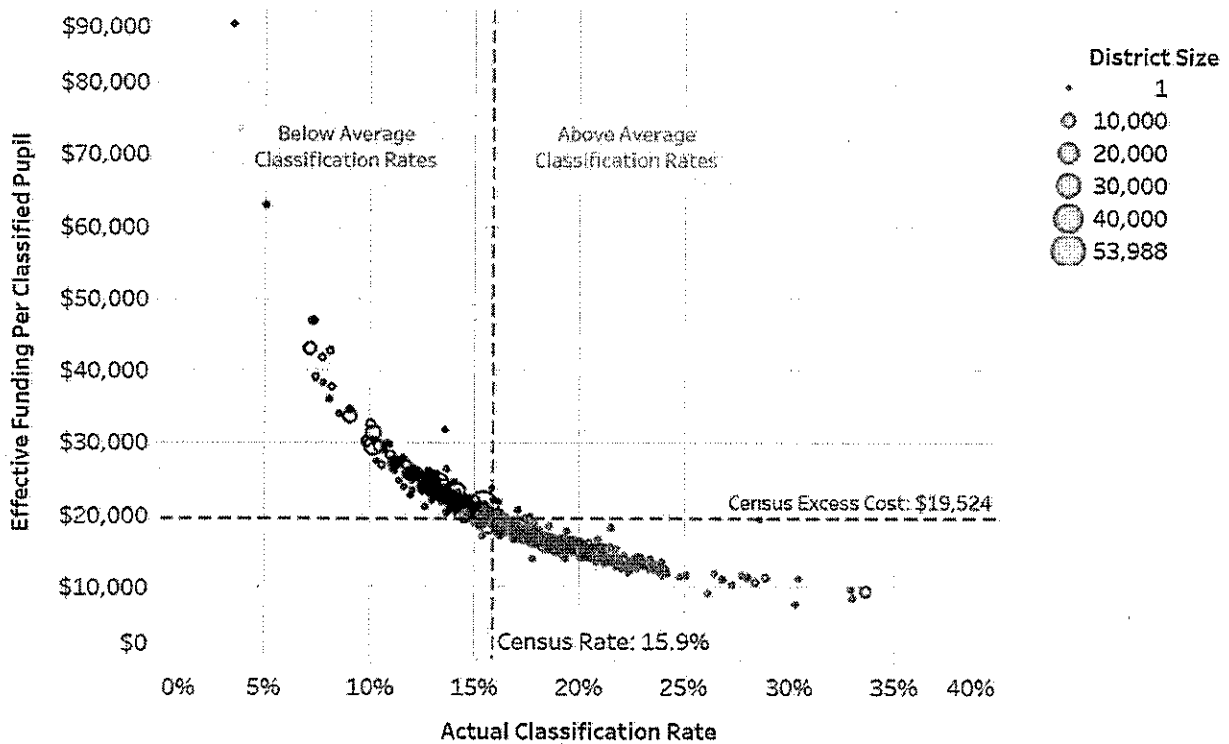
Figure 2. Census Method Special Education Funding Gaps, 2022-23

The SFRA's census method underfunded districts with classification rates higher than the statewide average by \$378 million in 2022-23. On average, the state funded these districts for only 85% of their actual special education enrollment, essentially reducing special education funding by about \$2,896 per classified student (Figure 2). By contrast, districts with classification rates below the statewide average received \$287 million more than they would have received based on actual enrollment. On average, these districts were funded for 118% of their actual special education enrollment, which is an additional \$3,612 per classified student.

Figure 1. Distribution of Districts and Students Relative to Statewide Average Classification Rate

The degree of difference from the statewide average classification rate determines the funding gaps at the district level (Figure 3). Some districts are only a few tenths of a percentage point above or below the average classification rate, so their effective per-pupil special education funding is only a few hundred dollars different from the SFRA-defined excess cost (\$19,524 in 2022-23). But even a 1% increase in a district's classification rate above the statewide average reduces the

effective funding rate by over \$1,000 per classified pupil. In a district with a classification rate that is 50% higher than the state average, the funding allocated for each classified student is reduced by about \$6,500 per pupil. Likewise, districts with classification rates slightly lower than the state average will receive minimal extra funding per classified student, while those with dramatically fewer classified students receive significantly more per classified student.

In an extreme example, Franklin Township in Warren County had a classification rate of 3% in 2022-23. Because the district was funded for far more special education students than it enrolled, under a fully funded SFRA the district would receive about \$88,000 per classified student, far above the SFRA's excess cost.

In comparison, Seaside Park Boro in Ocean County had a classification rate of 30% in 2022-23. Only 40% of Seaside Park Boro's actual special education student enrollment was funded under the census method. The SFRA allocated \$7,558 per classified student in the district, creating a gap of \$11,377 per student relative to the average excess cost.

It is worth noting that five of the ten districts with the lowest classification rates were county vocational systems. These school districts often have selective admissions criteria that create barriers to acceptance for students with disabilities, resulting in classification rates far below the state average. For example, Cumberland County Vocational's actual classification rate was only 7% in 2022-23. Under a fully funded SFRA, the district would receive about \$28,400 more per pupil than the average excess cost.

Diversion of Funding to Cover Unfunded Special Education Students

Because school districts are legally required under federal law to provide a Free and Appropriate Public Education (FAPE) to all students with disabilities, districts with special education classification rates that exceed the statewide average must either raise additional local revenue or divert funding from general education to cover the costs for unfunded special education students. Districts may cut academic programs, extracurriculars, and/or other schoolwide initiatives to fill the gaps between state funding for special education and actual costs. This negatively impacts *all* students in underfunded districts, who lose access to vital programs and learning opportunities.⁸

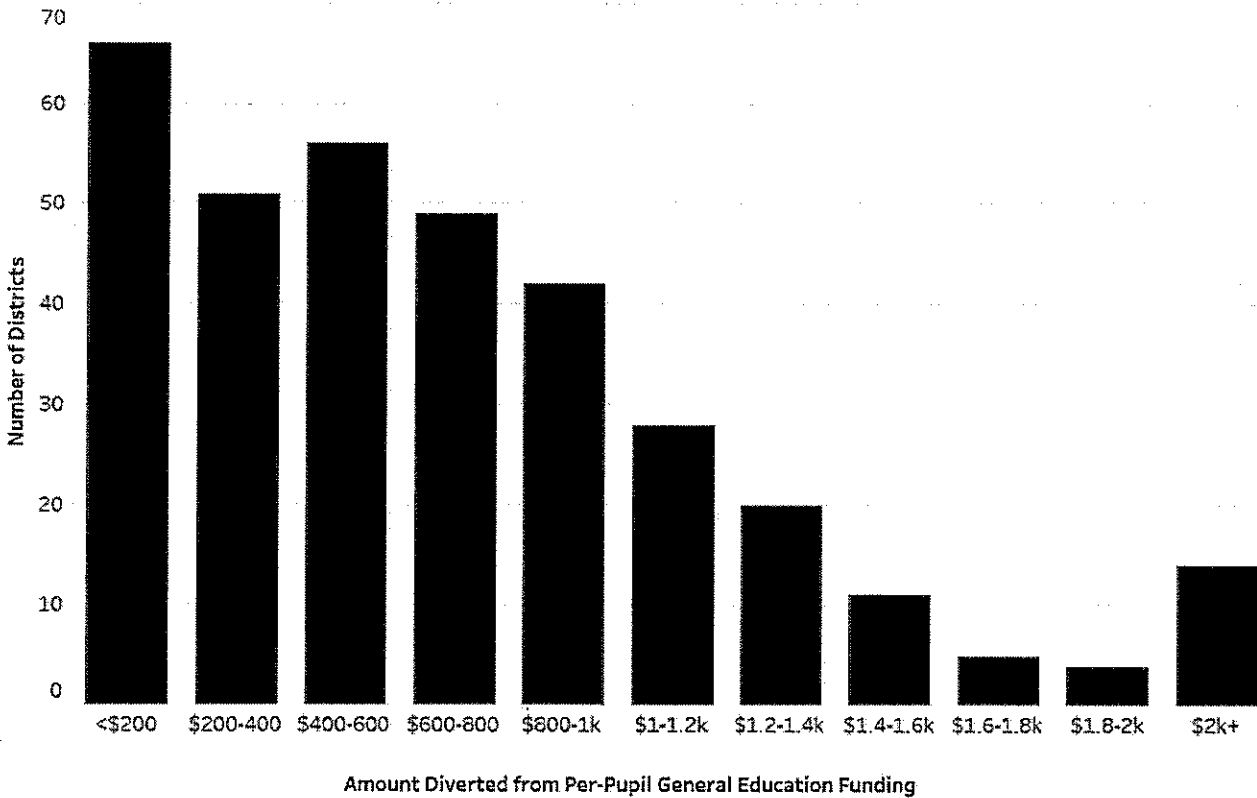
We estimate how much funding districts would divert from general education to cover the costs of unfunded special education students under the census funding method. In other

words, how much less per-pupil funding is available for the general education program when districts must fill in the funding gaps for unfunded special education students?

The per-pupil amount underfunded districts must divert from general education to fill their special education funding gap varies greatly. Figure 4 shows this distribution: about half of the 358 underfunded districts must shift more than \$600 per pupil from general education to cover unfunded special education students. This diversion is compounded in districts that are also not receiving full formula funding. These districts, which often serve high concentrations of low-income and minority students, are doubly harmed as they already lack sufficient resources to provide students with a constitutionally required "thorough and efficient" education.

⁸ Diversion from the general education program to support special education costs can occur in any district, regardless of classification rate. If the district's actual expenditure for special education services exceeds the average excess cost provided under the census method, districts would necessarily divert funds to cover these expenses. However, limitations in publicly reported expenditure data prevent us from analyzing these effects.

Millville School District in Cumberland County is one example. In 2022-23, the district was both underfunded according to the SFRA formula and did not receive adequate special education funding. The district received only 87% of the state and local revenue required by the funding formula and was funded for about two-thirds of its actual special education student enrollment. This left the district with a gap of over \$6 million for unfunded special education students on top of a formula gap of \$12.2 million. The district, which enrolled 4,543 students and spent approximately \$2,650 per pupil below what the formula required, would have had to reduce spending on general education by nearly \$1,650 per pupil to maintain special education spending

at the state average. In effect, use of the census method means that Millville may have spent as much as \$4,300 below what the SFRA formula requires for its general education program.

Special Education Funding Systems Across the Country

States across the country use a variety of funding mechanisms for their special education programs, with 22 states using a hybrid model that combines two or more methods. New Jersey is one of thirteen states, including Alabama, Massachusetts, California, Illinois, and Arizona, that uses a census-based model alone or as part of a hybrid system for K-12 special education funding.

Some states, such as Michigan and Nebraska, reimburse districts for all or some of their special education expenditures. Others, such as Delaware and Virginia, provide resource-based allocations, which means that districts receive a minimum base amount of resources, usually linked to staff-to-student ratios. The majority of other states fund their special education systems through a weighted model that assigns dollar amounts to certain student characteristics or needs. Many states also provide additional funding for high-cost special education services, similar to New Jersey's extraordinary aid program.

Conclusion

This report finds that census-based special education funding has led to enormous variations in the resources allocated to school districts for classified students. New Jersey districts with classification rates higher than the statewide average were underfunded by approximately \$378 million in 2022-23. While special education funding gaps vary greatly among districts, this report makes clear that New Jersey policymakers must take steps to modify and improve the state's special education funding system.

In their 2011 report, Augenblick, Palaich and Associates (APA) found clear differences in the percentages and types of students served in districts across the state. They noted that certain disability categories have higher costs than others and found that the distribution of students by disability category is not consistent across districts. APA recommended increased data collection and further analysis of where students are being served and funded, the costs of serving different disability types, and special education enrollment patterns and costs across districts. The NJDOE never

followed through on APA's recommendations, and our analysis further demonstrates the need for additional study of New Jersey's special education funding system.

When the New Jersey Supreme Court signed off on the constitutionality of the new school funding formula in 2009, the Justices were clear that their approval was conditioned on the State's commitment "diligently to review the formula after its initial years of implementation and adjust the formula as necessary."⁹ The State's lack of action to address known issues with the census-based funding model must be rectified immediately.

ELC previously recommended that the NJDOE consult with school finance experts as they prepare the FY2026 Educational Adequacy Report (EAR), the statutorily required three-year review of the formula's costs and components.¹⁰ Although altering the special education funding method is outside the scope of the EAR, the NJDOE should include discussions of and improvements to special education funding in a broader analysis of the

formula. Recommended improvements can then be enacted through separate legislation. ELC calls for the Legislature to take the following immediate steps:

- Include an appropriation in the FY2025 budget for the NJDOE to conduct a comprehensive review of the SFRA, including an analysis of the special education funding method;
- Require the review to include community and stakeholder engagement and consultation with school finance researchers with expertise in special education funding;
- Increase the Extraordinary Special Education Aid allocation in the FY2025 budget. Extraordinary Aid has been flat funded since FY2022, meaning that each year a smaller fraction of school districts' eligible costs are reimbursed. This creates greater pressure on school districts to cover these costs through other revenue sources.

A fair method of allocating special education funding is a crucial element of an adequate and equitable school funding formula. The Legislature and the Commissioner of Education must take immediate steps to remedy the major issues created by census funding for special education so that all districts have access to the resources they need.

Thank you for the opportunity to testify about the ramifications that would result if the federally funded Perkins grants, which are administered through the U.S. Department of Education, were eliminated. My name is Jackie Burke and I am the Executive Director of the Council of County Vocational-Technical Schools.

Each year under Perkins, Congress appropriates roughly \$1.4 billion in State formula grants and over \$30 million in competitive discretionary grants specified in the law for the improvement of career and technical education, or CTE, programs across the nation.

In FY 2025, this amounted to an award of over \$29 million to New Jersey's Department of Education. Almost \$9 million of the total was awarded directly to county vocational-technical districts.

Perkins funding is the lifeblood of our schools. It not only pays for the industry standard equipment necessary to provide the education and technical training students need to transition into to the workforce, but it also funds additional enhancements to provide high-quality career and technical education opportunities.

For example, districts have purchased an anti-gravity treadmill for their sports medicine program, virtual reality training modules for their bio-medical science program, sub-arc welding machines for welding programs, industrial ovens for culinary programs, and more. Districts have also used the funds to cover the cost of CTE college courses for special education students as well as funding middle school and summer enrichment programs. None of this would have been possible without Perkins funding.

Loss of this aid does not solely affect our schools. It would also be detrimental to the many businesses and employers who rely on the education and technical training our students receive to fill positions that allow them to continue to operate and grow, thereby meeting the economic demands of the State.

Direct funding for our schools is not the only way career and technical education would be affected if Perkins funding is eliminated. CTE program standards and requirements are all governed by Perkins regulations. The regulations provide the framework for the delivery and quality of CTE programs and ensures that offerings of all secondary districts are rigorous programs built with input from industry professionals. Further, the overwhelming majority of employees in the Office of Career Readiness in the New Jersey Department of Education are federally funded through Perkins. These employees review the CTE offerings to make sure they meet all requirements and are delivering relevant course work.

Simply put, the elimination of Perkins funds would have a devastating effect on the ability of our schools and the state to provide the high quality CTE programs that students and employers need.
