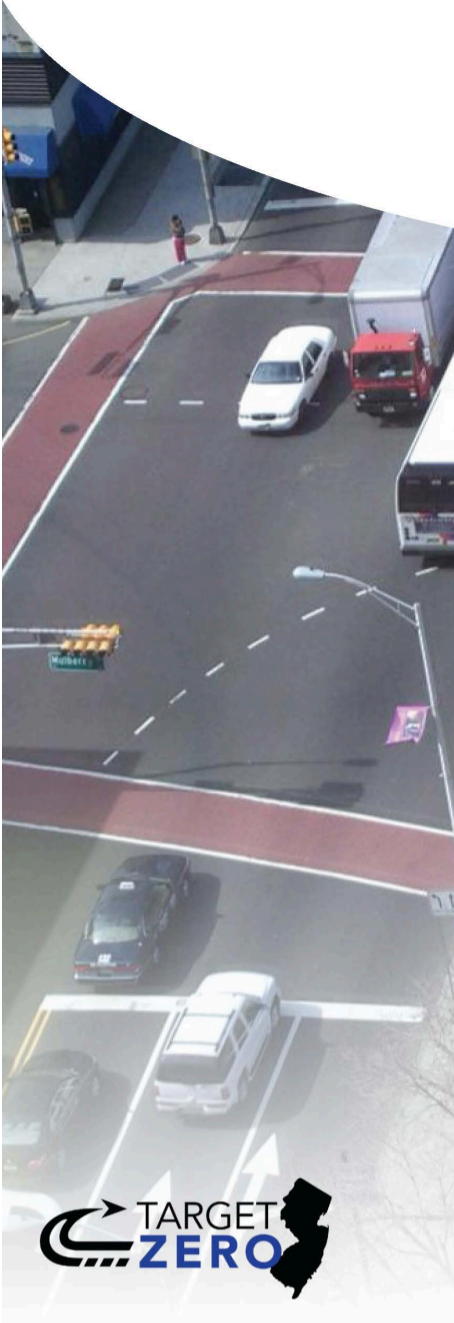

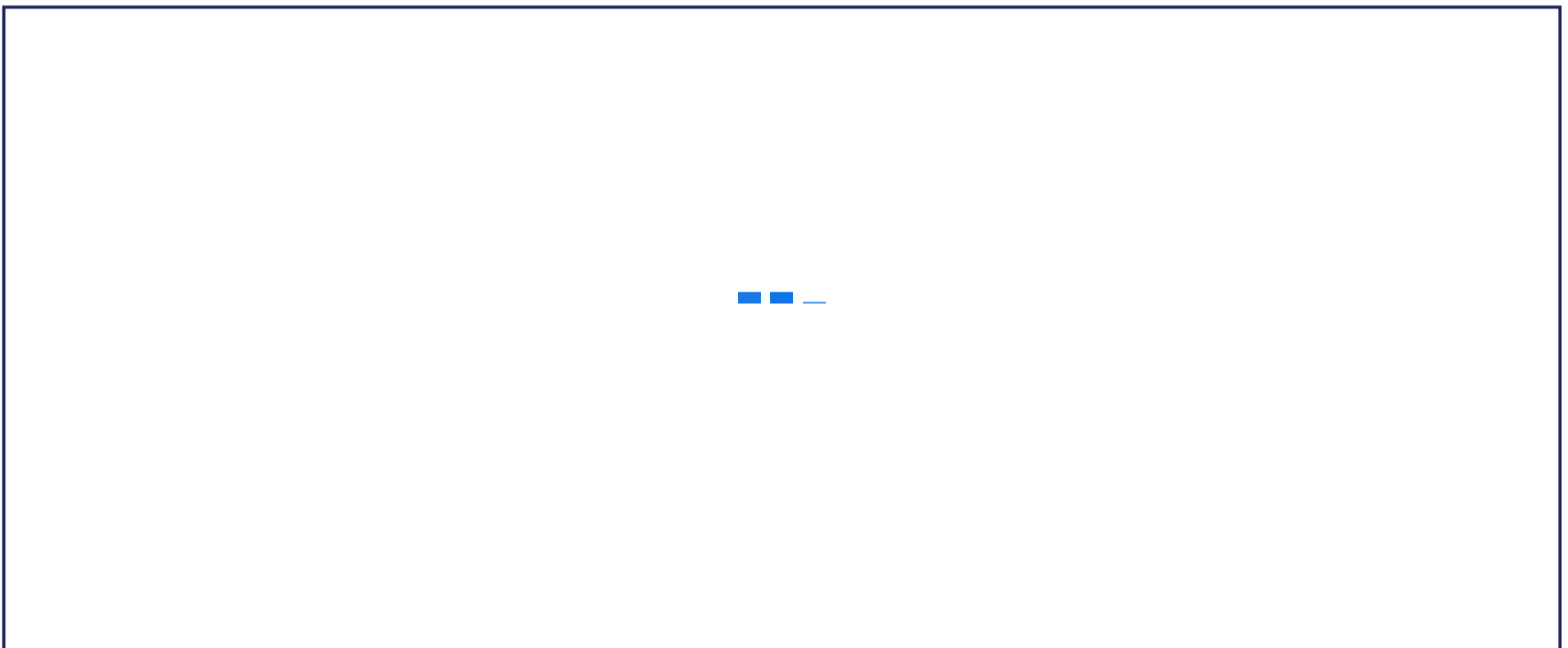

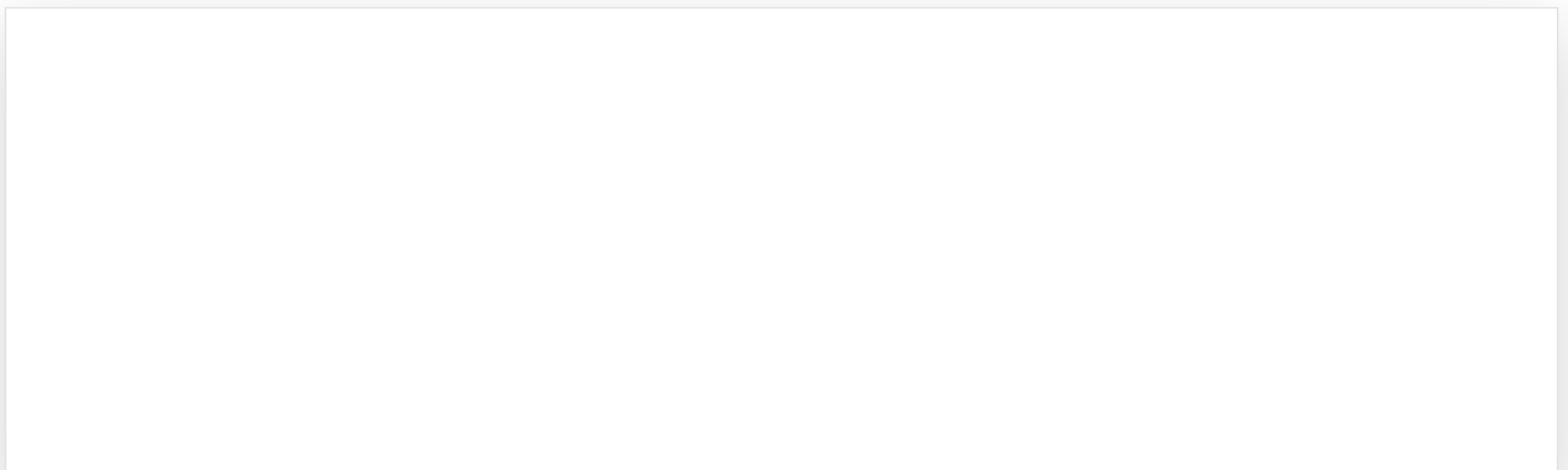
High Injury Network
