## DMAVA curator to receive Monmouth County award

SEA GIRT, N.J., – M. Claire French, Monmouth County clerk, has announced that historian Joseph G. Bilby of Wall Township has been selected for the 2011 Jane G. Clayton Award to be presented at Archives Day this October.

Bilby serves as assistant curator of the National Guard Militia Museum of New Jersey and is a prolific historian of the Garden State.

According to Monmouth County, the Clayton Award honors individuals who, over a substantial number of years, have made exceptional contributions to an aware-

ness, understanding, and/or preservation of the history of Monmouth County.

Bilby, who served in Vietnam as a lieutenant with the 1st Infantry Division, has worked at the museum since 2005.

Admission to the museum is free and open to the public.

The main museum is located at the National Guard Training Center in Sea Girt and is open seven days a week from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m., and the Lawrenceville Annex is open Tuesdays and Fridays from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m.
