A proficiency rate is calculated by summing the count of students who scored either proficient or advanced proficient on the assessment and dividing by the count of valid test scores.

Additionally, this school is meeting 50% of its performance targets in the area of College and Career Readiness.



College and Career readiness measures the degree to which students are demonstrating behaviors that are indicative of future attendance and/or success in college and careers. For all elementary and middle schools, this includes a measurement of how many students are chronically absent. For schools with middle school grades, it also includes a measurement of how many students take Algebra I in eighth grade.

Student Growth

This school outperforms 15% of schools statewide as noted by its statewide percentile and 10% of schools educating students with similar demographic characteristics as noted in its peer school percentile in the performance area of Student Growth. 

Enrollment by Grade




Total School Enrollment Trends

Enrollment Trends by Program Participation




Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup

ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENT















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



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

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


NJASK Proficiency Trends - Math - Grade Level - 07




NJASK Proficiency Trends - Science - Grade Level - 04

Among the behaviors that research has shown to be indicative of success and college and career readiness are regularly attending school and challenging themselves with rigorous course work. 


Chronic Absenteeism Trend
