Whitman Applauds Judiciary Committee Approval of Dunbar as State Police Superintendent

NJ Gov. Christie Whitman today applauded the unanimous decision by the Senate Judiciary Committee to approve Carson J. Dunbar, Jr., of Ramsey, NJ, as the next Superintendent of the New Jersey State Police. Dunbar is a former NJ State Trooper who currently serves as Special Agent in Charge of the Administrative Division of the FBI's New York field office.

"I applaud the Judiciary Committee's thorough review and unanimous approval of Carson Dunbar to be the next Superintendent of the New Jersey State Police," Gov. Whitman said.

"Obviously, the Judiciary Committee agrees with me that Carson Dunbar brings to this job a unique combination of experience from within the ranks of two of the finest law enforcement agencies in America and that the people of New Jersey will be well served by this appointment," she said.

"I am hopeful that the entire Senate will follow the lead of the Judiciary Committee and confirm Special Agent Dunbar's nomination by an overwhelming margin later this week," she said.
