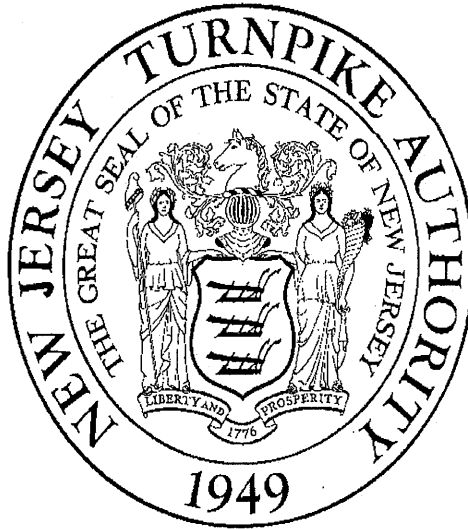

The Authority maintains a property insurance program for the protection of its physical assets on the Garden State Parkway and New Jersey Turnpike including business interruption insurance that protects against an interruption to its business income. This program currently insures all property encompassing all structures on both roadways and provides sufficient limits of coverage, subject to certain sub-limits. Approval of this item would renew the Program for one (1) year.

This matter involves a two-vehicle accident that occurred on November 13, 2017 on the Garden State Parkway northbound, at or near milepost 154.50, in the City of Clifton, at which time plaintiff/driver Julijana Coleska allegedly sustained personal injuries when she struck the rear of a Turnpike Authority dump truck. Outside counsel is seeking settlement authority in the amount of \$187,500. The Law Department concurs with outside counsel's recommendation.

The Authority's Employment Practices Liability policy underwriter will reimburse the Authority in the total amount of \$700,000. The Authority's out-of-pocket costs are \$300,000. The Law Department and General Counsel agree and recommend approval of the agreement in principle.

 Amount: Not to exceed \$ 11,147,955

The New Jersey Turnpike Authority (the "Authority") maintains a property insurance program for the protection of its physical assets and business income (the "Program"). The Program currently insures all property on both roadways with a total insurable value ("TIV") of \$28,159,745,261 via a primary quota share \$600,000,000 layer. The primary layer is supplemented by an excess layer which provides an additional \$200,000,000 layer of coverage. The Program is subject to specified sub-limits for different categories and/or exposures and is subject to a \$2 million per occurrence deductible. Standalone terrorism coverage is provided through Lloyd's of London, which provides broader coverage than insuring Terrorism through the Federal Terrorism Risk Insurance Program Reauthorization Act (TRIPRA).

Marsh USA, Inc. ("Marsh"), the Authority's broker of record, was asked to seek quotations for a one (1) year renewal, based on a TIV of \$28,945,156,231 which represents an increase of approximately 2.8% from the prior year. Marsh approached the incumbent carriers and sought out new markets. Many markets declined to quote for a variety of reasons that were specific to their individual risk appetite. Markets that did quote were evaluated by Marsh and Turner Surety and Insurance Brokerage, Inc., ("TSIB"), the Authority's insurance and risk management consultant, for price and quality of coverage.

With respect to All Risk primary layer of \$600,000,000, after review of all quotations, Marsh and TSIB recommend, and the Law Department concurs, with renewal of the program for one (1) year as follows:

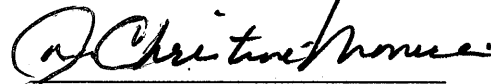

The above amount does not include a mandatory surcharge of \$26,029. In addition, a Boiler and Machinery Policy, including all Inspection and Certification Fees of \$54,421 is required.

With respect to the excess layer, Marsh secured renewal quotations from Swiss Re and Chubb Bermuda and Lloyds syndicates, with Swiss Re providing 50% of the capacity, Chubb Bermuda providing 42.5% and Lloyds syndicates providing 7.5% of the \$200,000,000 capacity at premiums of \$237,232, \$228,466 and \$36,815, respectively, plus a tax surcharge of \$3,558. Based on the recommendation of Marsh and TSIB, it is recommended that this layer be renewed for an estimated \$506,072. Marsh also secured standalone terrorism coverage with a \$800,000,000 limit, with Hiscox for an estimated \$241,875, and an excess terrorism layer of \$200,000,000 with Lloyds/Lancashire for an estimated premium of \$42,000. Marsh continues to negotiate with the market to secure the most advantageous quotation for these layers of coverage.

The total premium for placement of the insurance as set forth above for the one (1) year renewal is currently estimated to be \$11,147,955 and represents an approximate 19.42% increase in premium rate. Marsh will continue to negotiate with the underwriters for an improved premium for all layers of coverage up to June 15, 2024, the date that the renewal will become effective.

It is therefore recommended that the Commissioners authorize renewal and placement of the Authority's Bridge and Non-Bridge property insurance program as set forth above, for a total premium as indicated above. It is further recommended that the Commissioners authorize the Executive Director to substitute or add insurance companies to those indicated above and approve other changes to the structure recommended above, after consultation with the Authority's Law Department, should he deem it is in the best interest of the Authority. It is further recommended that the Executive Director, after consultation with the Authority's Law Department, be authorized to execute all documents and to take any and all further actions to effectuate the renewal of the Program as indicated herein.



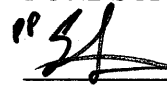

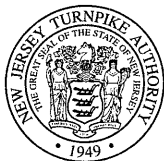

The Authority maintains Excess Liability insurance, including General Liability, Automobile Liability, Employers' Liability and Police Professional Liability insurance which was due to expire on April 15, 2024. Authorization to extend this program by sixty (60) days was provided by the Commissioners via agenda item 056-03-2024 to allow Willis of New Jersey, ("Willis") Authority's broker of record for the Program, additional time to seek the best terms and conditions for renewal.

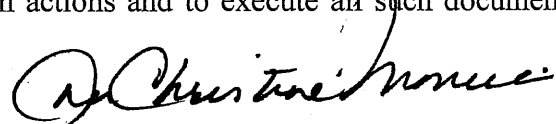
The Program provides \$100 million of Excess Liability Insurance above its \$5 million self-insured retention ("SIR") for General Liability, Automobile Liability, Employers' Liability and Police Protective Liability claims. The current lead carrier, Lexington, who had been providing the lead \$5 million layer of insurance for this line for many years, advised that due to market conditions and not the Authority's claims history, that it could no longer provide the primary layer coverage. Willis was tasked with marketing the primary layer and all remaining layers of the Program, upon the same terms and conditions, for the full \$100 million limit. After review of all submissions, and upon the recommendation of Willis and Turner Surety and Insurance Brokerage, Inc. ("TSIB"), it is recommended that the Program be renewed as follows:

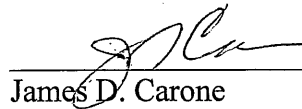
The renewal is proposed at a cost not to exceed \$4,016,583 which includes all mandatory New Jersey Property Liability Insurance Guarantee Association ("PLIGA") surcharges and other applicable taxes.

It is therefore requested that the Commissioners authorize the Executive Director to renew the Excess Liability Insurance coverage, upon the terms and conditions as outlined above, including Terrorism Risk Insurance Act coverage, at a total premium, including all applicable state taxes and surcharges including New Jersey PLIGA and New Jersey Excess & Surplus line taxes for a total amount not to exceed \$4,016,583. It is further requested that the Commissioners authorize the Executive Director to take all such actions and to execute all such documents to effectuate the authority set forth above.



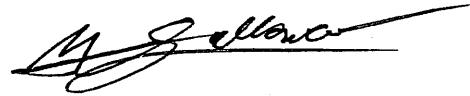

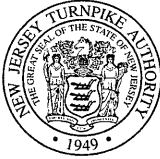

The New Jersey Turnpike Authority (the "Authority") owns Parcels R128, R128X, and a portion of Parcel W57, located at the southwest quadrant of the intersection of Louis and Moller Street and northeast of the park and ride area of the Alexander Hamilton Service Area, Town of Secaucus, Hudson County, consisting of ± 0.24 acres of vacant land that are adjacent to Block 35 Lot 8 and the municipal right-of-way.

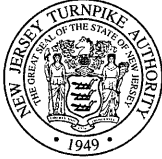
The Town of Secaucus contacted the Authority seeking to purchase the Property for use as a public park. In accordance with the Authority's regulations for the sale of surplus property, N.J.A.C. 19:9-2.6, the Law Department has circulated information regarding the Property to the Chief Engineer, the Director of Operations, the Chief Information Officer (ITS), and the Authority's Engineering Consultant, HNTB Corporation, for review. Each has reviewed information regarding the Property, and all have certified that the Authority no longer requires the Property and does not see any future use of the Property by the Authority. The Property has been certified by the various departments as surplus to the Authority's needs and will be disposed of pursuant to the Authority's Regulations for the Sale of Surplus Property, N.J.A.C. 19:9-2.6, and the Authority's By-Laws.

Accordingly, it is recommended that authorization be given to declare the Property surplus to the Authority's needs. It is further recommended that the Executive Director be authorized to take any steps necessary to transfer Parcels R128, R128X, and a portion of Parcel W57, in accordance with the Authority's regulations for the sale of Surplus Property, N.J.A.C. 19:9-2.6, and the Authority's By-Laws. The New Jersey Turnpike Authority (the "Authority") is proceeding with its plans to replace the at grade U-turns along the Turnpike Mainline with grade-separated U-turns near Mileposts 6.4, 13.4, 19.0, 29.1, 43.0 and 46.1 (the "Project") located within the municipalities indicated above, as safety enhancements.

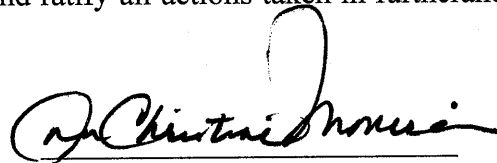
Based on the plans and design to date, the Project will require the acquisition of twenty (20) property interests from various public and private entities for direct use in the Project. The acquisitions are more fully described on the chart attached hereto as Exhibit A. This list is based on the current design and may be subject to change as the Project progresses. To that end, the Law Department will need to obtain both title work and an appraisal in order to begin the acquisition process.

The majority of the proposed acquisitions do not involve property designated as "Preserved Farmland" pursuant to and as required by the Agriculture Development and Retention Act, N.J.S.A. 4:1C-11, et seq. (the "ADA"), and State Agricultural Development Committee Rules, N.J.A.C. 2:76-1.1, the ADA's implementing regulations, nor have the above-referenced properties been designated or encumbered as Green Acres Properties pursuant to N.J.S.A. 13:1D-53, et seq. Four (4) of the proposed acquisitions do involve property designated by the ADA, but the ADA has been deemed not applicable due to the minor nature of the proposed Project improvements.

Accordingly, it is requested that the Authority's Commissioners deem the property interests set forth on the attached Exhibit A necessary for the construction of the Project. In addition, authorization by the Authority's Commissioners is requested to permit the Executive Director, with the assistance of the Law Department, Engineering Department, outside General Counsel and other Authority consultants, to take all steps necessary to prepare for the acquisition

of all property interests required for the Project, including those property interests listed on Exhibit A attached hereto, and any other property interests deemed necessary for acquisition during the final design process. This includes but is not limited to entering into negotiations to acquire the property interests and when such negotiations have reached an impasse, authorization for the Executive Director to commence eminent domain proceedings, including but not limited to, depositing the appraised value into court and filing a Declaration of Taking. The final purchase price will be submitted for approval to the Authority's Commissioners in a separate agenda item.

It is further recommended that the Authority's Commissioners authorize the Executive Director to execute any such other documents and take any such other actions as are deemed necessary to effectuate the intent of this authorization, and ratify all actions taken in furtherance of same.

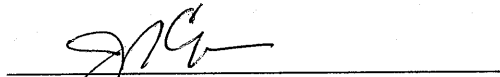

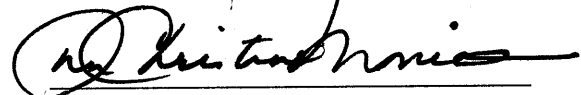

This matter is a consolidated personal injury claim arising from an accident on the Garden State Parkway near milepost 154.50 in the City of Clifton on November 13, 2017. A New Jersey Turnpike Authority Maintenance Division employee, while driving an Authority attenuator-mounted dump truck, collided with Coleska's vehicle by crossing into the lane that the Plaintiff was driving in. The impact of the accident resulted in the plaintiff alleging that she suffered a disk bulge, disk herniation, torn labrum (shoulder), and loss of consciousness. The court consolidated this litigation pursuant to Rule 4:38-1 with a separate, unrelated accident in June 2018 involving the Plaintiff in Hudson Township, New Jersey.

The parties attended a court-ordered mediation on May 7, 2024. At the mediation, the parties agreed to a global settlement of \$375,000 of all claims in both litigations, to be split equally between the Authority and the co-defendant, without any admission of wrongdoing by the Authority. The Authority's equal share would be \$187,500, subject to the Board of Commissioners' approval. General Counsel reviewed this matter and other similar matters that were previously adjudicated and/or settled to confirm that this proposed settlement value is reasonable given the facts of the case, in consideration of plaintiff's injury, age, and the projected future costs of defense. The Law Department concurs with General Counsel's recommendation.

Therefore, it is recommended that the Board of Commissioners approve the settlement of this matter pursuant to the terms set forth above. It is also recommended that the Board of Commissioners authorize the Executive Director to execute any and all documents in furtherance of same.

RE: Authorization to amend the New Jersey Turnpike Authority Employees' Deferred Compensation Plan (the "Plan") to comply with SECURE Act and SECURE 2.0 Act, and to authorize the Executive Director to evaluate and incorporate into the Plan additional provisions of SECURE and SECURE 2.0

The Authority maintains a tax deferred savings plan in accordance with applicable provisions of the Internal Revenue Code Section 457(b), known as the New Jersey Turnpike Authority Employees' Deferred Compensation Plan (the "Plan"). Two (2) other agencies participate in the Plan, namely, the Burlington County Bridge Commission and the South Jersey Transportation Agency. Authorization is requested to amend the Plan, which was last amended and restated in 2017, so that it complies with the SECURE Act and SECURE Act 2.0 (the "Acts") provisions, including, among other things, increasing the age for required minimum distributions (RMDs); decreasing the penalty for RMDs which are not taken in a timely manner; and allowing catch up contributions to be made via a Roth account.

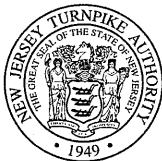
Numerous other optional amendments have been authorized under the Acts, which will require additional review and consultation with the Authority's Deferred Compensation Committee, Authority consultants, and outside counsel. These include various options which may allow participants in the Plan flexibility as to their funds, among other options, for which the Authority may need to await further guidance from the IRS regarding implementation and coordination with Mission Square the Plan provider.

Therefore, authorization is requested to amend the Plan as indicated above, and to authorize the Executive Director to make further amendments permitted by the Acts that he deems to be in the best interest of the participants of the Plan after consultation with the Deferred Compensation Committee. Authorization is further requested to take all further actions necessary to effectuate the authorizations granted herein.

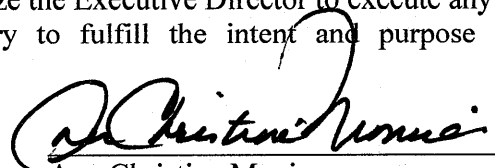

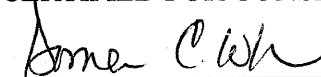
DePalma et al. v. New Jersey Turnpike Authority et al. is a lawsuit filed by three former New Jersey Turnpike Authority staff attorneys, Nicholas DePalma, Paul Macchia, and Maulik Sanghavi, who were terminated as part of a reduction in force. The plaintiffs filed a suit for wrongful discharge.

The parties reached a conditional agreement subject to the Authority's Board of Commissioners approval, at mediation on May 3, 2024, before Superior Court Judge Mark Epstein, J.S.C. (ret.). In principle, the total settlement is \$1 million allocated as follows: \$289,895 (Nicholas DePalma); \$140,695 (Paul Macchia); and \$140,495 (Maulik Sanghavi). The remaining gross proceeds of \$428,915 would be remitted to plaintiffs' counsel for incurred counsel fees as required by the Civil Rights Act. The Authority's insurance carrier, AIG, will reimburse the Authority \$700,000 of the gross settlement amount and approximately \$90,000 in incurred defense costs. The Authority's out-of-pocket share of the settlement is \$300,000, representing 30% of the gross settlement amount. AIG conceptually agrees to this allocation predicated on the exclusionary language set forth in the Authority's Employment Practices Liability policy.

The Authority's General Counsel and Law Department have reviewed the settlement and recommend the Board of Commissioners' approval pursuant to the terms set forth herein. It is further recommended that the Board of Commissioners authorize the Executive Director to execute any and all documents and take such further steps as necessary to fulfill the intent and purpose of this recommendation.

This contract will provide for the replacement of State Police substations and site improvements at Pleasant Plains, Milepost 83.8, Avalon, Milepost 14.0 and the Celia Cruz Service Area, Milepost 76.2. The existing substation at Pleasant Plains will be relocated to the Celia Cruz Service Area in Lacey Township. The existing substation at Avalon will be replaced in kind. All work is expected to be substantially completed by November 14, 2025.

One bid proposal was received on April 23, 2024 for the above publicly advertised contract, as shown on the attached bid summary sheet. The bid proposal, in the amount of \$11,364,211.40, may be compared to the Engineer's Estimate in the amount of \$9,759,715.00. The bid was significantly higher than the Engineer's Estimate likely due to higher than anticipated costs associated with environmental remediation work at the Pleasant Plains location and pricing volatility on non-standard work items. The low bidder, Hall Building Corp., has performed work for the Authority and is considered competent to complete this contract.

It is, therefore, recommended that Contract No. P500.720 be awarded to Hall Building Corp. of Farmingdale, New Jersey, in the amount of \$11,364,211.40. Bids for this work were procured, and the authorization being sought is to award this fair and open contract to the lowest responsible bidder, in accordance with N.J.S.A. 27:23-6.1, N.J.A.C. 19:9-2.2, and Executive Order No. 37 (Corzine 2006).

The General Consultant, HNTB Corporation, concurs with this recommendation.

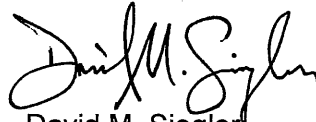

This Order for Professional Services will provide supervision of construction services for Contract No. P500.720, Replacement of State Police Substations and Site Improvements at Pleasant Plains, Milepost 83.8, Avalon, Milepost 14.0 and the Celia Cruz Service Area, Milepost 76.2. These services include construction inspection, material testing, record keeping, preparation of payment estimates, and other services required to ensure compliance with the contract documents.

This assignment is classified as a "Simple Project" based on the scope of work being clearly defined and not likely to change during the course of the project, and the cost not exceeding \$2,000,000.00. The solicitation for Expressions of Interest (EOIs) was posted on the Authority's website and forty-six (46) engineering firms were prequalified and eligible under Profile Codes: B151, Construction Management and B159, Building Construction & Renovations Inspection. Five firms submitted EOIs by the closing date of April 4, 2024.

Subsequent to the scoring of EOIs by the Review Committee, Fee Proposals were requested from the top three (3) technically ranked firms. The firms in the order of ranking are: 1) Boswell Engineering; 2) KS Engineers, P.C.; and 3) Remington & Vernick Engineers. The fee submitted by Boswell Engineering has been reviewed and is considered to be fair and reasonable for the services to be provided.

It is, therefore, recommended that Order for Professional Services No. P4141 be issued to the firm of Boswell Engineering of South Hackensack, New Jersey, in an amount not to exceed \$1,995,000.00. This amount includes reimbursement of direct salaries times a maximum multiplier of 2.25 to cover the cost of fringe benefits, overhead and profit, plus authorized direct non-salary expenses. These professional services were procured by a fair and open process, and the recommended firm was selected in accordance with N.J.S.A. 52:34-9.1, et seq., N.J.S.A. 27:23-6.1 of the Authority's enabling legislation, N.J.A.C. 19:9-2.8, promulgated pursuant thereto, and Executive Order No. 37 (Corzine 2006).

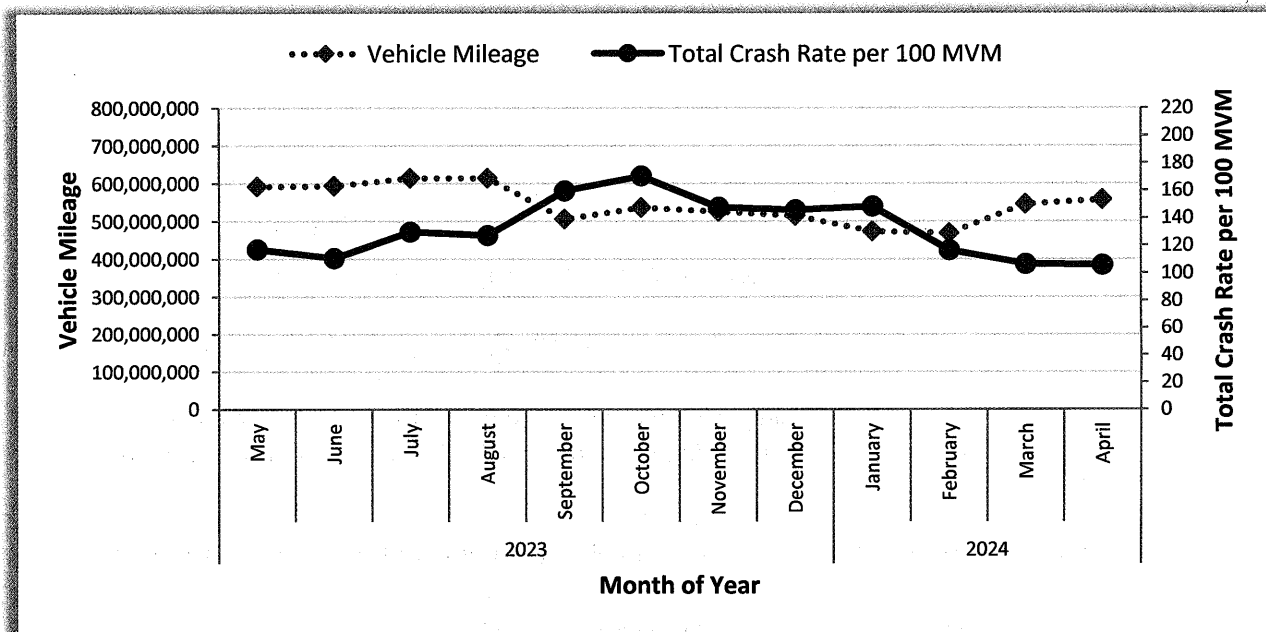
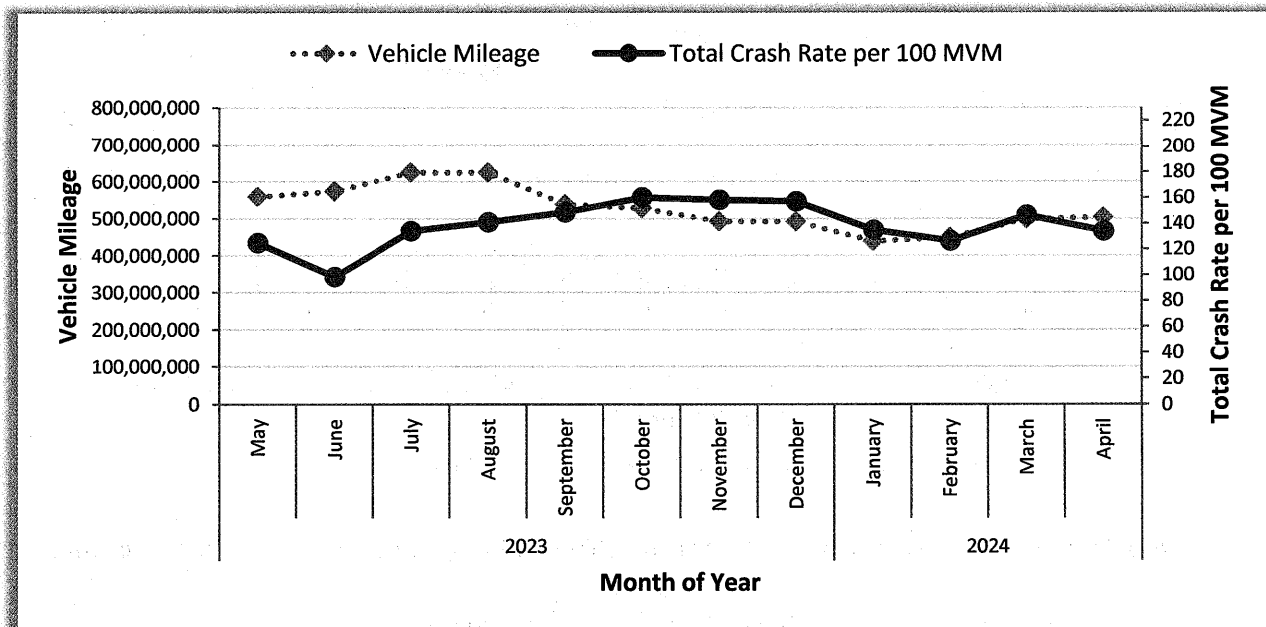

Figure 3 - New Jersey Turnpike Injury and Property-Damage-Only Crashes by Month

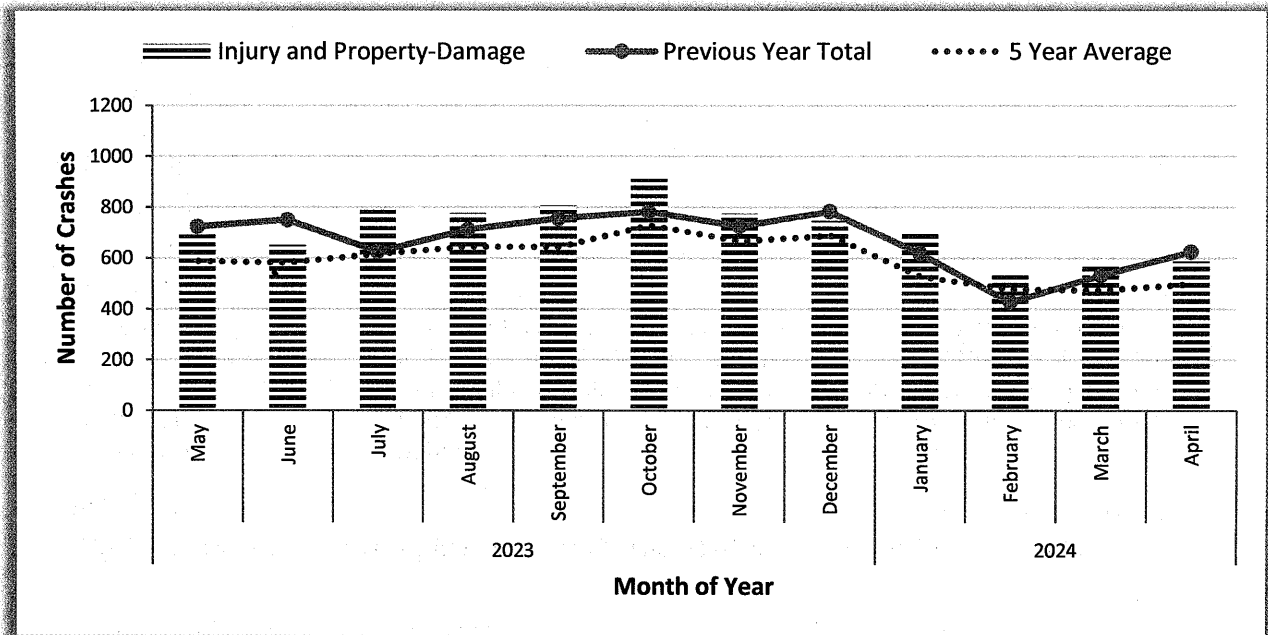
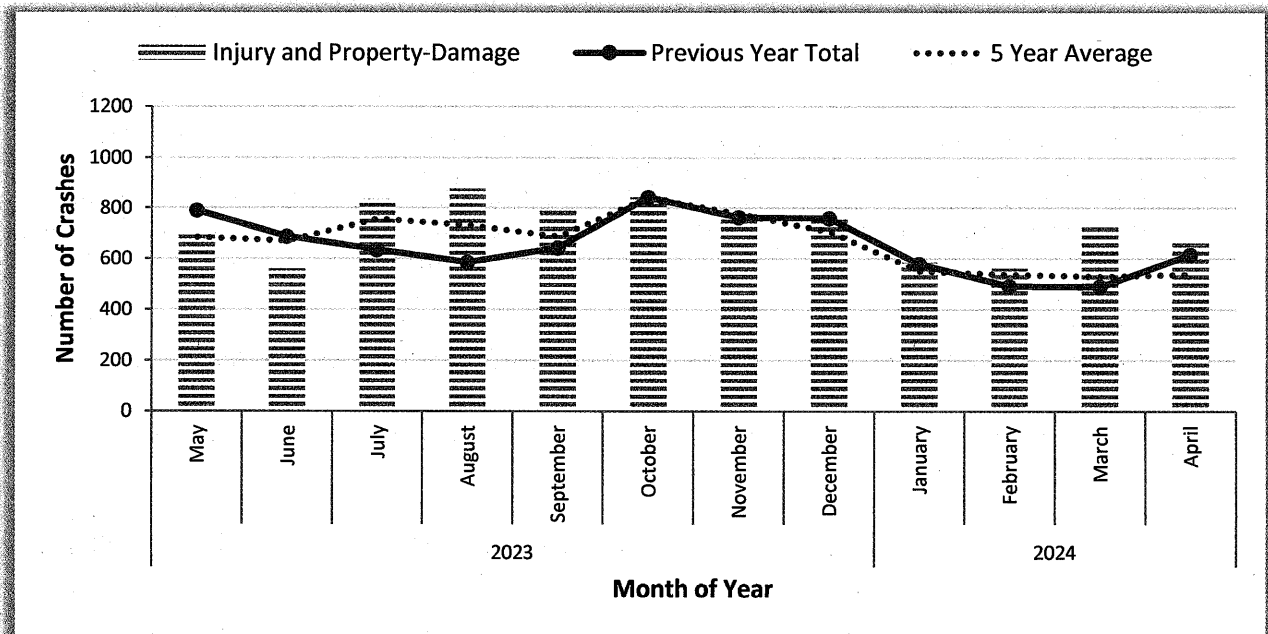


Figure 4 - Garden State Parkway Injury and Property-Damage-Only Crashes by Month

The following un-audited results are for the four months ended April 30, 2024.¹ Based upon these results, revenues will be sufficient to satisfy the requirements of the Authority's Bond Resolution. For the twelve months ending December 31, 2024, the Authority is projected to have a debt service coverage ratio of 1.97 and a total requirements coverage ratio of 1.50.

The Authority's total revenue for the four months ended April 30, 2024, was \$824,470,000, which is \$26,303,000 or 3.3% above the 2024 year-to-date budget. Toll revenue was \$687,695,000, which is \$6,305,000 or 0.9%, below the 2024 year-to-date budget. Toll revenue is below budget primarily due to the three impactful snow days and one State of Emergency (flooding) that occurred January. Furthermore, there were two more snow days in February, followed by one heavy rain/flooding event in March and two in April. In addition to the severe weather, the 3% toll increase was budgeted for the full year but did not go into effect until March 1, 2024. Gas prices averaged \$0.02/gallon higher in 2024 compared to the same period in 2023, and when compared to March 2024, gas prices in April increased \$0.19/gallon. Investment income was \$17,491,000, or 88.8%, above budget due to higher invested balances and increases in interest rates. E-ZPass fees were \$13,095,000, or 31.3% above the budget due to conservative budgeting in 2024. Miscellaneous revenue was \$1,524,000, or 25.0% above budget due to the receipt of the \$1.8M in Arts Center rent for 2023 PNC variable rent payment.

For the four months ended April 30, 2024, traffic on the New Jersey Turnpike increased 1.3% and toll revenue increased 1.0% compared to the same period in 2023. The increase in traffic can be attributed to greater passenger car travel, and normal growth. Toll revenue increased mainly due to the 3% annual toll rate indexing that went into effect on March 1, 2024. In addition, April 2024 had two more weekdays compared to April 2023, which had a positive impact on results. The 2024 traffic and toll revenue budgets are based on the Authority's traffic engineering consultant's (CDM Smith) New Jersey Turnpike System 2023 Traffic and Toll Revenue Forecast Study dated July 28, 2023. CDM Smith projected a 0.6% decrease in traffic and a 1.9% increase in revenue as compared to the prior year. The actual results for the four months ended April 30, 2024, exceeded CDM's traffic projections, but were below CDM's revenue projections, as the budget assumed the 3% annual toll rate indexing on January 1, 2024, which was only implemented as of March 1, 2024. When compared to the same period in 2019, pre-pandemic, traffic is down 2.7% and revenue is up 40.5% for the same period. Traffic has recovered to 97.4% of pre-pandemic levels. Through April 2024, the E-ZPass usage rate on the New Jersey Turnpike was 93.0%, an increase from 92.4% for the same period in 2023.

For the four months ended April 30, 2024, toll transactions on the Garden State Parkway increased 0.5% and revenue increased 2.0% when compared to the same period in 2023. The slight increase in traffic and revenue is primarily due to normal growth and the 3% annual toll rate indexing that went into effect on March 1, 2024. The actual results for the four months ended April 30, 2024, exceeded CDM Smith's projection of a 0.1% increase in toll transactions, but was below the toll revenue projection increase of 3.0%, as the budget assumed the 3% annual toll rate indexing on January 1, 2024, which was only implemented as of March 1, 2024. When compared to the same period in 2019, pre-pandemic, traffic is down 3.5%, but revenue is up 31.7%. Traffic has recovered to 96.5% of pre-pandemic levels. Through April 2024, the E-ZPass usage rate on the Garden State Parkway was 91.0%, an increase from 90.4% for the same period in 2023.

Operating expenses for the four months ended April 30, 2024, were approximately \$215,459,000, which is \$31,652,000, or 12.8% below the year-to-date budget. The Authority's operating expenses through April were below budget primarily due to lower than budgeted snow/severe weather costs. This was partially offset by higher-than-budgeted electronic toll collection costs due to higher credit card fees and violation processing costs, as well as higher-than-budgeted State Police costs due to holiday cash out pay for troopers. The Authority spent a total of \$21,731,000 for snow and severe weather costs in 2024, with \$12,684,000 charged to operating expenses and an additional \$9,048,000 charged to extraordinary events in the General Reserve Fund. All snow and severe weather costs are considered operating expenses and paid from the Revenue Fund, except for declared state of emergency events, which are charged to the General Reserve Fund. New Jersey had one declared state of emergency event in January 2024. When excluding snow/severe weather costs and its budget, operating expenses for the four months are 5.4% below budget for 2024.

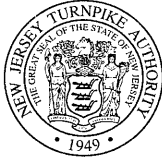
**Financial Summary
For the Four Months Ended April 30, 2024**

Debt Service includes interest and principal payments on the Authority's outstanding bonds and is funded primarily through revenue and to a much lesser extent bond proceeds (capitalized interest). For the four months ended April 30, 2024, Debt Service totaled \$320,973,000, which was \$6,431,000 or 2.0% below budget as the 2024 Budget assumed a \$500M new money bond issuance in January 2024, that was ultimately issued in April. Debt service through April included \$194,950,000 in interest payments and \$126,023,000 in principal payments. Net debt service (funded from revenue, net of capitalized interest) was \$307,501,000 for the four months and meets the budget. The 2024 annual debt service budget includes approximately \$922,500,000 of debt service funded from revenue (net debt service), and the remaining \$84,700,000 of debt service funded from bond proceeds (capitalized interest), for a total debt service budget of \$1,007,200,000.

The General Reserve Fund includes all contractual payments subordinate to bondholders and expenditures for any other corporate purpose. The General Reserve Fund spending totaled \$228,829,000 for the four months ended April 30, 2024, which was \$9,287,000, or 3.9% below budget. Spending consisted primarily of \$154,816,000 for the 2021 State Public Transportation Projects Funding Agreement, \$9,048,000 for Extraordinary Events (State of Emergency Events), and \$7,333,000 for the Transportation Trust Fund. Also included are \$44,267,000 in transfers to the Supplemental Capital program in the Construction Fund.

The Capital Budget, which is funded by revenue, consists of the Maintenance Reserve Fund, Special Project Reserve Fund, and the Supplemental Capital Program. For the four months ended April 30, 2024, total expenditures were approximately \$78,322,000, which was 62.3% of the 2024 year-to-date spending budget. Expenditures included \$21,432,000 for Service Area Improvements, \$3,340,000 for Tolling Legacy Parts Replacement, and \$3,145,000 for GSP Milepost 126-172 Bridge Repairs. In addition to these expenditures, there are open contracts and commitments totaling approximately \$403,326,000.

The Construction Fund, which is funded from bond proceeds, consists of the 2024-2028 Capital Improvement Program, the 2019 Capital Improvement Program, and the 2008 \$7 Billion Capital Improvement Program. For the four months ended April 30, 2024, total expenditures were approximately \$107,486,000, which was 48.6% of the 2024 year-to-date spending budget. Total expenditures included \$15,008,000 for TPK Bridge Rehabilitation W107.84 and E107.84, \$8,825,000 for TPK Deck Reconstruction Mileposts 98.48 to 98.76, and \$7,531,000 for Passaic River Bridge Rehabilitation. In addition to these expenditures, there are open contracts and commitments totaling approximately \$1,135,280,000.

Re: Authorization to Enter into Agreements with the New York Jets, New Jersey Devils and Rutgers University for E-ZPass Advertising and Safety Messaging

Date: May 17, 2024

This agenda item is a request to enter into three separate agreements for E-ZPass advertising and Safety Messaging at NY Jets, LLC, New Jersey Devils and Rutgers University sporting events for the 2024 and 2025 seasons. This initiative will advertise and promote the NJ E-ZPass concept as an easier and more efficient means of travel throughout the New Jersey area including various messages promoting safe travel.

The NY Jets football event advertising package will consist of outside and inside stadium advertising for all 2024 pre-season and regular season home games. Specifically, advertising messages around the perimeter of the stadium, on over 2000 video monitors in and around the inside of the facility and radio spots throughout each event. Additionally, E-ZPass Promotional Days will be scheduled to include on site interaction with patrons to further explain, and promote advantages of the E-ZPass concept. The cost for this advertising package is \$180,000.

The Rutgers University advertising package will consist of promotions for the 2024 football season and the 2024-2025 Rutgers wrestling and men's and woman's basketball seasons. Specifically, advertising will consist of video board exposure, radio initiatives and social media promotions. Additionally, E-ZPass Promotional Days will be scheduled to further endorse the E-ZPass concept. The total cost for this project is \$180,000.

The New Jersey Devils agreement will include advertising promotions at all Devils home games and other major Prudential Center events. Specifically, exterior LED messaging, digital concourse messaging, concourse E-ZPass activations, in-game features and fan interaction and radio initiatives. The total cost for this project is \$180,000.

Accordingly, approval of these agreements is respectfully requested in the total annual amount of \$540,000. It is further recommended that the Commissioners authorize the Executive Director or his designee to execute all documents relative thereto. Authorization is also requested to authorize the Executive Director or his designee to enter into agreements for the two (2) one-year renewals at the same terms and conditions.

All salary ranges for all job classifications within the bargaining unit shall also be increased by the across-the-board increases set forth above.

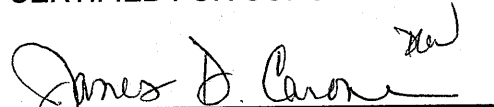
The fully executed MOA shall be made a part of this authorization and both parties recognize and agree that this MOA represents the entire understanding of the parties.
