REPORT

To the Governor and Commander-in-Chief:

SIR:—By virtue of law, I have the honor to report the operations of this department for the fiscal year ended October 31, 1909.

SMALL ARMS.

The U. S. Magazine rifle, model of 1903, calibre .30, and equipment in possession of the various organizations are reported as generally being in excellent condition for service. The bulk of the "Krag" rifles of the model of 1898, received from the National Government in 1903, have been returned as required by provision of the Act of Congress under which the new ones were issued.

FIELD ARTILLERY.

No improvement has been made in the storage facilities for the care of the 3-inch field guns and equipment drawn from the U. S. Government for the armament of the two batteries of field artillery in the State. The Commanding Officers of these batteries are using all facilities at hand for taking the best care of the 3-inch guns and implements in their possession to keep them in condition for active service at any time. It is to be hoped that the legislature will in the near future make ample provision for suitable armories for housing this costly property.

— ACCOUNTS OF ORDNANCE, ORDNANCE STORES, ETC.

All issues of ordnance and ordnance stores, camp equipage, and quartermaster's stores, are accompanied by a receipt for the signature of the receiving officer, and invoices in duplicate of such issues are furnished. Upon receipt of the property, it is compared with the invoice, and if found correct, the receipt must be signed by the officer to whom issue is made and returned promptly to the Quartermaster-General. Any deficiencies or discrepancies are reported immediately.

In making up the annual returns of ordnance, clothing, and medical property required from each battery, troop, infantry company and signal corps, the following instructions must be carefully followed:

After entering thereon on the line "On hand from last return" the property on hand at the close of the previous year, the invoices for stores received during the year should also be entered according to date of receipt, as "voucher No. 1" and so on, and one copy of each forwarded with the Return. The duplicate invoices should be numbered and entered in like manner on the retained copy of the return and filed therewith for reference or future inspection. This retained copy or duplicate of the annual return should be carefully preserved and be accessible at all times to regimental and departmental staff officers for data on which to base their inspections and reports as to the condition for efficient service of military stores in possession of the organizations of the National Guard. If all transactions covering receipts, issues and transfers of military property are carefully kept on the Annual Return, responsible officers will be ready at any and all times to make a speedy and intelligent settlement or transfer of their property accounts as occasion may require.

UNIFORMS.

The infantry organizations of the Second Brigade and the mounted organizations, National Guard, are practically supplied with the olive drab or winter service uniform, and by the end of the present calendar year the entire division will have been supplied. The blue uniform now in possession of the National Guard, so long as it lasts, may be worn for such service and on such occasions by detachments or individuals as may be designated by commanding officers. The U. S. Army regulations prescribe the woolen or olive drab clothing for winter service wear and the cotton or khaki uniform for summer service.

STATE CAMP GROUNDS AND ANNUAL ENCAMPMENT.

With the exception of the First Troop Cavalry, which participated with the U. S. Army in the coast defence maneuvers in Massachusetts, the entire National Guard encamped by regiments at Sea Girt last summer in the following order:

Fifth Regiment and Battery A, Field Artillery, July 12th to July 17th inclusive.

First Regiment, July 19th to July 24th inclusive.

Fourth Regiment and Signal Corps, July 26th to July 31st inclusive.

Third Regiment and Second Troop, August 2nd to August 7th inclusive.

Second Regiment and Battery B, Field Artillery, August 9th to August 14th inclusive.

The cooking for the troops was done for the first time by enlisted cooks, or by civilians employed by the respective organizations, with great satisfaction to all concerned, and it is expected that each troop, battery, infantry organization and signal corps will be provided by next year with regularly enlisted cooks, fully competent to perform their most important duties. The ration furnished by the State is ample in quantity and of the best quality, and it is to be hoped that, from the experience to be gained by regimental and battalion commissaries in the selection of, and close supervision over the works of the cooks, that these officers will be enabled to handle it with intelligence and avoidance of waste.

DISPOSAL OF SEWAGE AT CAMP GROUNDS.

The Committee on Appropriations at the last session of the legislature made an appropriation of \$12,000 for "Construction of plant necessary for disposal of sewage at the State Camp Grounds at Sea Girt." A survey of the entire ground is now being made preparatory to entering into a contract for this important work with a view if possible, to its completion before the encampment in July, 1910.
