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#### **BUDGET MESSAGE**

To the Legislature:

Pursuant to Chapter 15, Laws of 1916, and Chapter 221, Laws of 1918, I transmit herewith my recommendations covering the budget of appropriations for the State's fiscal year ending June 30, 1921.

The estimate of State funds available for disbursement during such fiscal years, as presented to me by the State Comptroller and the State Treasurer under date of January 3d, 1920, sets forth probable receipts for the year as \$10,150,000, with a free balance at June 30th, 1920, of \$568,659.22, making a total of \$10,718,659.22 available for such appropriations as may be payable from the General Funds of the State, and without taking into account the disbursements which by law are payable from School, Road or other special funds.

The total appropriations for general State purposes as set forth in the Summary on page 29, amount to \$10,228,738.92, and these are recommended to be made from the General Funds of the State. Further appropriations for educational purposes are set forth, amounting to \$1,896,626.73, which it is recommended be made payable from the State School Funds derived from railroad corporation taxes. Although such items for educational purposes have heretofore been included in the stated totals of the Appropriation Bill, most of them have in fact been payable from the School Funds, since various acts of the Legislature have authorized the transfer to the General Treasury of the amounts appropriated for certain specific educational purposes. This procedure made it necessary that the estimates of revenue available to meet the total of the Appropriation Bill should include an estimate of the probable amount which would be appropriated for such purposes and would thus pass into the General Treasury, which fact could never be known until after the Appropriation Bill was passed by the Legislature.

uncertainty is eliminated by stating separately the total payable from the General Funds of the State and the total for educational purposes which is to be paid from School Funds. Not only is this desirable from the standpoint of greater accuracy and clearness, but it further seems that full justice to the educational needs of the State can be met only by having such appropriations made from funds dedicated specifically for educational uses.

The requirements for the general expenditures of the State have grown tremendously in amount over those of the pre-war period. This was inevitable because of the generally recognized increase in salaries and wages and in prices of materials, for which no amount of economy and efficiency could wholly compensate. War conditions brought unprecedented demands, and while the specific war activities have ceased they have been largely superseded by new demands to meet the industrial and social conditions which have arisen or been better understood in this post-war period.

While there has been a gratifying increase in the revenues of the State, the large increases in school and road funds have not been nor should they be made available for general State uses, and the increase in revenues accruing to the General Treasury funds has not been sufficient to meet both the increased costs and the increased current demands upon them.

Last year the surplus in the Treasury was drawn upon for desirable and proper construction projects. Had prices shown the decrease which then seemed probable, or had they merely continued at the then existing level, the revenues of the State would have been ample for all current requirements and for many desirable extensions and improvements.

As conditions stand to-day, the revenues accruing to the General Treasury are ample for all current General Appropriations, but are not sufficient to provide also for large expenditures for educational, road and construction purposes.

I am, therefore, recommending that appropriate legislation be enacted to provide that the expenditures for educational purposes be all made from the proceeds of the Railroad Corporation Tax; that the appropriation for State Aid to counties for road construction be made from Motor Vehicle Receipts, and that the funds for construction of the Interstate Bridge and Tunnel be raised by bond issue, to be paid off by tolls to be collected.

With such provisions made, the appropriations recommended will, I believe, fairly provide for the proper conduct of the existing activities of the State and will allow for many of the most valuable and pressing extensions of its service.

No general plan for new construction at the various State institutions can be recommended, but the necessary expenditures can be made to bring existing buildings into a proper state of repair and efficiency; to provide for adequate care and support of those who can now be housed therein, and to prosecute the measures already started for the improvement or cure of unfortunate wards of the State or for remedying conditions which result in requiring the State to care for them.

The child-welfare work should be continued, and an appropriation of \$150,000 is recommended for that purpose.

The Rehabilitation Commission has already shown most gratifying results and should have \$75,000 to continue their work.

It is with this same thought in mind that new buildings are recommended for the School for the Deaf (to be erected upon the new site recently acquired), and for the State Home for Boys.

The fine work being done at the Bordentown Industrial School for Colored Youth also deserves recognition and encouragement, and a new building for that institution is, therefore, recommended.

The amount of \$40,000 should be provided for the equipment of the new buildings at Morris Plains so that these additional accommodations may be available at the earliest possible moment. For the Trenton Hospital an additional amount is required for maintenance because of the additional accommodations recently provided.

For the State Normal Schools a substantial increase is recommended in the amounts to be appropriated for teachers' salaries, and the further amount is recommended for the Glassboro Normal School so that new teachers may be made available for that section of the State.

Increases in salaries for all State employees are recommended if called for by the Standardization schedules of the Civil Service Commission, or, if unclassified, to give them the fair increase demanded by conditions of to-day. It has not seemed possible, however, to provide for all the salary increases and all the new employes requested by every Department, but in many cases it has been necessary to state flat amounts within which it is believed the Department could confine its expenditures without hampering it in the conduct of its normal activities and allowing for some desirable development and extension thereof.

Mr. Henry B. Fernald and Mr. Marvin A. Riley have rendered invaluable service in the preparation and presentation of this budget, and I desire to make public acknowledgment of my debt to them. I also desire to thank the various Boards and heads of Departments and their staffs who have so well co-operated in the successful carrying out of budget plans. As it is presented, the budget represents much of painstaking care and labor on the part of all concerned, and it is submitted in the hope that whatever shortcomings therein may be found, it will prove a valuable guide for the Appropriations Committee in its preliminary work and for the Legislature at large in passing upon the Committee's labors.

## Estimate of Funds Available for Appropriation for the Fiscal Year Beginning July 1, 1920, and Ending June 30, 1921.

Hon. William N. Runyon, Acting Governor:

At the close of business for the first six months of the fiscal year it is possible to determine with more certainty the probable surplus at the close of the fiscal year June 30, 1920, as well as the estimated resources for that period.

Receipts from Transfer Inheritance Tax, interest on deposits, Secretary of State, Clerk of the Supreme Court, State Athletic Commission and the Board of Shell Fisheries have shown such an unusual increase over the amount estimated that it is quite within bounds to place the estimate of receipts for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1920, at \$10,800,000.00.

With the balance last June for the State uses of \$5,898,118.51, this would make the resources for the current year \$16,698,118.51. The obligations against this amount are current appropriation act, \$13,744,996.26, and requisition reserve of \$2,384,463.03, a total of \$16,129,459.29, or a surplus of resources over liabilities of \$568,659.22.

It is improbable that the rate of increase in receipts during the past six months will continue during 1920-21, and we, therefore, place the estimate for that period at \$10,150,000.00.

This amount together with the estimated surplus July 1, 1920, will make the resources of the State subject to appropriation for all purposes, except educational, chargeable to the School Fund under various acts of the Legislature, the sum of \$10,718.659.22.

#### DEBT OF THE STATE.

Certificates of the State issued to the Commissioners of the Agricultural College, pursuant to Chapter 417 of the Laws of 1895, amounting to \$116,000.00 is the only debt of the State.

Under an act of Congress of the United States, approved July 2, 1862, entitled "An act donating public lands to the several States and Territories which may provide colleges for the benefit of agriculture and the mechanic arts," there was invested for the benefit of the State Agricultural College the sum of \$116,-000.00 in the war bonds of the State, being the proceeds from sales of land scrip. The war bonds have all matured and been paid. Owing to the inability of the Commissioners to invest the said sum of \$116,000.00 conformably to the said act of Congress, which provides, "That all moneys derived from the sale of the lands aforesaid by the States to which the lands are apportioned, and from the sales of land scrip hereinbefore provided for, shall be invested in stocks of the United States, or of the States, or some other safe stocks, yielding not less than five per centum upon the par value of said stocks," the Legislature, at the session of 1895, passed an act authorizing the Commissioners to transfer and pay over, as money shall be by them received, to the Sinking Fund of this State, and authorizing the State Treasurer and Comptroller to issue and deliver therefor to said Commissioners a certificate of this State to the effect that the State will pay to said Commissioners five per centum annually of the amount so paid into or transferred to the Sinking Fund.

Under an act approved April 8, 1903, the Sinking Fund has been assigned and is now a part of the permanent School Fund of the State.

The assets of the State Fund consist of 1,887 shares of stock of the United Railroad and Canal Company of New Jersey, the market value of which amounts to about \$350,000.00

The estimates herewith submitted are as liberal as practical. The appropriations of the current fiscal year ending June 30, 1920, were conspicuously liberal and consumed the balance with which the State has been annually favored, and which is practically eliminated, unless receipts in excess of those estimated or unused appropriations create it. In addition thereto was the passage of Chapter 118, Laws of 1919, approved April 11, 1919, extending the payment of Miscellaneous Corporation Taxes from the first Monday of June to the first Monday of July, which resulted in the elimination of fully \$1,200,000.00 from the collections of the year ending June 30, 1919.

The Budget Act requires a statement showing the estimate of revenue and of the State's income available for the appropriations for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1921. At the present time there is nothing upon which such estimate can be based other than that made as above for the year ending June 30, 1920, and in order that any further action may be based upon sound principles we do not feel safe in placing before you an estimate in excess of the one made for the new current year, namely, \$10,576,870.00.

Before the time for the Budget message, when the actual revenues for the first half of the current year are known, it will manifestly be possible to make a much more satisfactory estimate of the unincumbered balance in the State Treasury on June 30, 1920, and the probable revenues for the ensuing year. If this knowledge should make a material change in the figures here presented a supplemental estimate will be submitted.

#### STATE EMERGENCY FUND.

An appropriation of \$250,000.00 was made by the Legislature at the session of 1918 to meet any condition of emergency for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1919. This appropriation was supplemented by an additional appropriation of \$200,000.00 at the session of the Legislature of 1919, making a total appropriation of \$450,000.00.

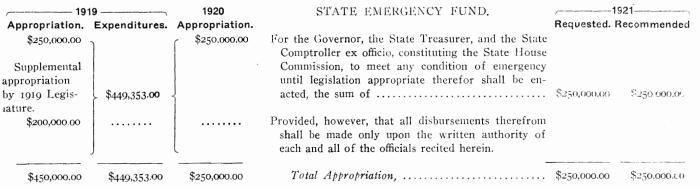

The \$7,000.00 for Land Registry Bureau, which was appropriated for 1920 as a separate item, as shown in the above tabulation, has been distributed in the requests and recommendations for 1921 into the several subdivisions of salaries and wages, materials and supplies and miscellaneous expenses.

The above does not include \$2,500.00 in 1919 for the Laboratory Equipment paid from Road Funds.

The appropriation for 1920 for fire lookout towers (including installation, equipment and maintenance) was made with the proviso that an equal sum in money or material was contributed by other interests. For 1921 the wages and maintenance of these fire towers is included under the usual subdivisions of maintenance and the request of \$3,000.00 is asked for extensions of this service. Such extensions are not, however, recommended until those already provided for can be placed in operation and their value and comparative cost can be established.

The other appropriations for extensions of work and of parks are not recommended since it does not appear that the State Funds should be so used at this time while the urgent requirements exist for additions and improvements at the various institutions of the State.

This department has supervision and control of about one-half of the entire amount covered by the Appropriation Bill, and also has before it the responsibility for planning and developing the future policy for handling properly the charitable and institutional problems of the State which have not heretofore been adequately considered and dealt with. For this purpose it is essential that it should have an adequate and able staff, with a sufficient appropriation to enable it to carry on and develop the work. No feature of the State's activities is of greater and more urgent importance than the work of this department.

For the State Use System, some specific appropriations are recommended for additional machinery and equipment for prison industries, in order that it may be possible to include a provision in the Appropriation Bill that the "State Use Revolving Fund" should be used only for paying the cost of labor, materials, supervision and other expense of production of goods, or performing the labor which shall be chargeable against using agencies or others, and that such Revolving Fund shall not be depleted by the purchase of additional machinery or equipment. Certain administrative expenses which were last year stated under the title of "State Use" have this year been classed as "Industrial Supervision," since they consist largely of Farm Supervision, and practically none of these farms are operated under the heading of the "State Use System." This classification will be more consistent with the principle that no moneys appropriated under the heading of "State Use" are to be expended for any activities except those which are operating under the "State Use System."

An appropriation for the purchase and equipment of a Lime Quarry is not recommended since I am not satisfied that it could be operated on a commercial basis which would pay for its costs.

The original act, Chapter 294, Laws of 1913, provided that for State Aid for Vocational Schools "The total amount expended under the provisions of this act shall not exceed in any one year the sum of \$80,000," and that such amount should be deducted from the school funds before their apportionment among the counties. Chapter 76, Laws of 1916, provided for the appropriation from the general treasury of the State of an additional amount of \$60,000, provided such amount is allowed in the regular annual appropriation bill. I would recommend that necessary legislation be enacted to make the entire amount requested above payable from the funds devoted to the maintenance and support of the public schools.

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
