Senate Bill No. 13, entitled "An act regulating the weighing, sampling and testing of milk and cream when the results of such weighing, sampling and testing are to be used in official inspection or as a matter of public record, or as the basis of payment for milk or cream purchased, and to repeal an act entitled 'An act regulating the weighing, testing and purchasing of milk and cream in certain cases,' approved March eighth, one thousand nine hundred and sixteen,"

Which was read for the first time by its title, ordered to have a second reading, and referred to the Committee on Agriculture.

On leave, Mr. Mackay introduced Concurrent Resolution No. 1, ratifying the suffrage amendment,

Concurrent Resolution No. 1, entitled "Concurrent resolution ratifying an amendment to the Constitution of the United States,"

Which was read for the first time by its title, ordered to have a second reading, and referred to the Committee on Education.
