A proficiency rate is calculated by summing the count of students who scored either proficient or advanced proficient on the assessment and dividing by the count of valid test scores.

#### **College and Career Readiness**

This school outperforms 77% of schools statewide as noted by its statewide percentile ranking and 87% of schools educating students with similar demographic characteristics as noted in its peer school percentile ranking in the performance area of College and Career Readiness. Additionally, this school is meeting 80% of its performance targets in the area of College and Career Readiness.



College and Career Readiness measures the degree to which students are demonstrating behaviors that are indicative of future attendance and/or success in college and careers. For high schools, this includes measures of participation in college readiness tests such as the SAT or PSAT and in rigorous coursework as defined by participation in AP courses in English, math, social studies and science.

#### **Graduation and Post-Secondary**



This graph presents the count of students who were 'on roll' by grade in October of each school year.




**Total School Enrollment Trends**




# **Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup**






# **Proficiency Trends - Math**




#### Scholastic Assessment Test (SAT) Results





This graph presents the count of students who were 'on roll' by grade in October of each school year.






# **Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup**















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











Students in both elementary and middles schools begin to demonstrate college readiness behaviors long before they even enter high school. Among the behaviors that research has shown to be indicative of success and college and career readiness are regularly attending school and challenging themselves with rigorous course work. 
