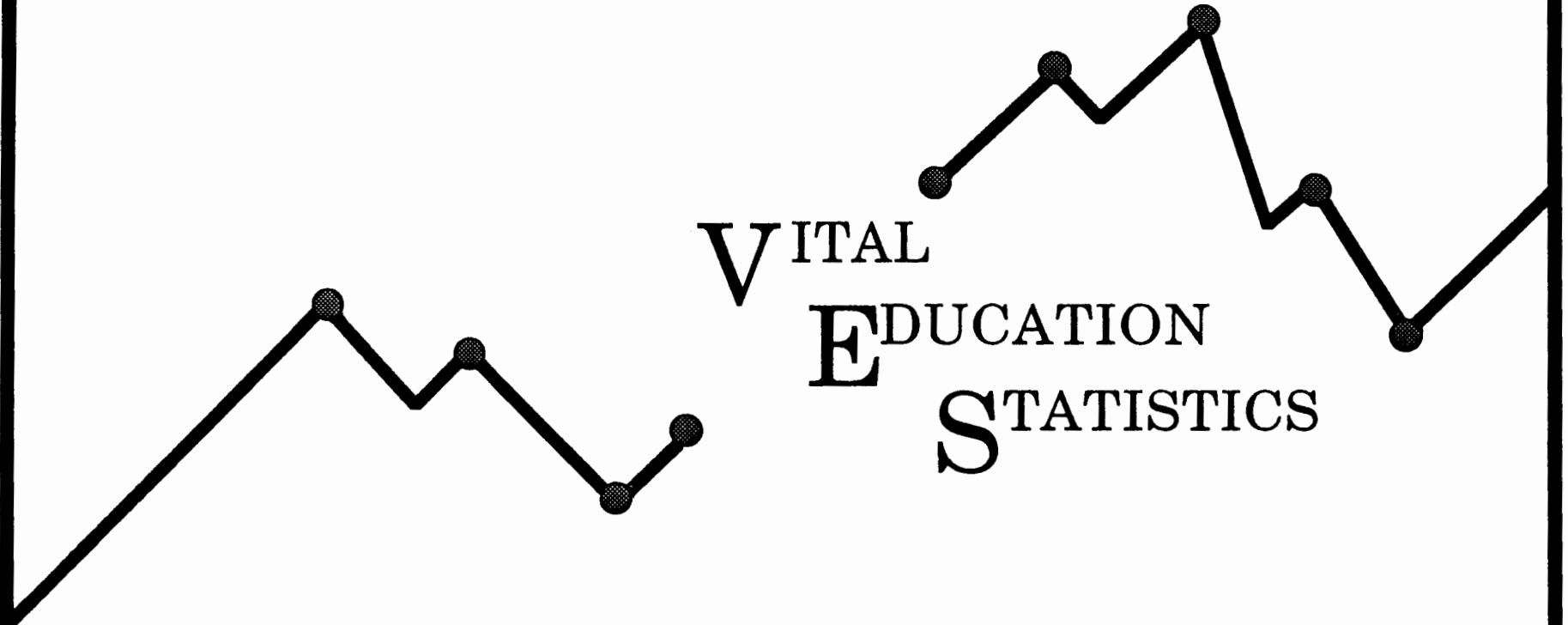

PREFACE

The 1988-89 edition of Vital Education Statistics is the fifteenth in a series which began in 1974-75. It marks the twelfth year of a revised series using data derived from updated survey instruments supported by detailed and illustrated instructions. It is the eleventh year that the publication has been produced in two volumes.

As in the previous editions, Volume I contains school district and school data, including enrollments, dropouts, and graduate data. Each section contains narrative and tabular data to accommodate both reader and user preferences. A glossary of data terms is provided.

Volume II of Vital Education Statistics is a separate publication and deals exclusively with certificated and non-certificated staff data.

The data published in the Vital Education Statistics series are descriptive and were designed to establish a core data base to aid in reporting on the condition of education in New Jersey. It is hoped that these data, when joined with other department data, will lead to insights from which policy can be developed.

INTRODUCTION

This introduction presents selected trend data characteristics of public elementary and secondary education in New Jersey between 1984-85 and 1988-89. The four sets of data show enrollments, dropouts and graduates over the past five years; and the schools that housed the public elementary and secondary pupils.

INTRODUCTION (CONT.)

SYNOPSIS OF TRENDS

1984-85 TO 1988-89

Statewide, enrollments in the period between 1984-85 and 1988-89 decreased by 4.3 percent or an average of 0.86 percent per year. Elementary school enrollments increased by 0.6 percent. This marks the second time in the 15 years of Vital Education Statistics publications that an increase is reported for elementary school enrollments. Secondary school enrollments decreased by 15.7 percent over this period for an average of 3.1 percent per year.

The number of schools increased by 2 or one-tenth of one percent of the total reported in 1984-85. Schools for the handicapped increased by fourteen (14). Secondary schools decreased by 23 or 5.7 percent of those operating in 1984-85. Elementary schools increased by 11 or 0.6 percent of those operating five years ago.

The total number of dropouts increased by 1.6 percent between 1984-85 and 1988-89. The number of dropouts classified as "minority" increased by 18.0 percent.

Although the number of public high school graduates decreased by 5.5 percent (between 1984 and 1988) the percent of those "continuing education" increased by 4.6 percent. The percent of 1987 graduates continuing their education was 69.1 percent.

DISTRICT AND SCHOOL INFORMATION

Section I contains the following tables: Table I, Operating and Non-Operating Public School Districts; Table II, Universe of State, County and Local Educational School Systems; Table III, Enrollment Size of New Jersey Public School Districts; Table IV, New Jersey Public Schools by Type of School; Table V, Special Selected Programs with Enrollments by County.

Table I For the second time since 1983-84, there was a change in the status of the number of school districts operating or non-operating. The number of operating districts decreased from 592 to 591, as the number in Morris County decreased from 41 to 40. The number of non-operating districts decreased from 26 to 25 with the subtraction of one in Morris County. The decrease from 618 to 616 districts effected the status in only one county as Morris decreased from 43 to 41.

Table II This table was first published in the 1981-82 Vital Educational Statistics and showed 601 operating administrative units in the state. Between 1981-82 and 1984-85, there was a reduction in the number of Type I units from 53 to 52, the number of Type II units decreased by three to 527, the county units decreased by one (1) and state units increased by ten (10). In 1985-86, there was a decrease of nine (9) operating administrative units from 606 in 1984-85 to 597 in 1985-86. In 1988-89, the number of operational Type I School Districts decreased by five and the number of Type II Regionals increased by one and the number of Type II Regular by three.

Thus, of the 596 operating units in 1988-89, 577 are local school districts (a reduction of one from 578), 14 are county units and 5 are state operated units.

Table III This table was introduced in the 1982-83 edition and there have been no significant changes in the size of districts over the period. Three hundred and three (303) or 51.3 percent of the 591 operating districts enroll between 0 and 999 students. One hundred and ninety-two (192) or 32.5 percent of the total operating districts enroll between 1,000 and 2,999 students. The remaining ninety-six (96) or 16.2 percent had enrollments which ranged from 3,000 to the high of 49,823 students.

Table IV This table displays the type of schools which compose the state's public elementary/secondary educational system. Column 12 reports a total of 2,257 public schools which is an increase of ten (10) from the 2,247 reported in 1987-88. Of this total number of public schools, 1,855 are elementary and 402 are secondary. In comparison with 1987-88, increases were reported in the number of middle schools (9), four year high schools (1) other high schools (4), elementary handicapped schools (4), and secondary handicapped schools (1). Declines in school types were as follows: one in elementary schools (1,561 to 1,560); two in approved junior high schools (25 to 23); four in three-year high schools (17 to 14); and three in six-year high schools (39 to 36).

A comparison of the total number of schools by county between 1987-88 and 1988-89 shows that increases occurred in nine counties. Counties showing increases were: Bergen (1), Burlington (1), Camden (1), Essex (2), Hunterdon (1), Monmouth (1), Ocean (2), Somerset (3), and Union (1). Counties showing decreases were: Atlantic (1), Cumberland (1), and Hudson (1). There were no changes in Cape May, Gloucester, Mercer, Middlesex, Morris, Passaic, Salem, Sussex, and Warren.

Of the 402 public secondary schools in New Jersey, 42.0 percent or 169 schools had enrollments between 500 and 999 students; 23.4 percent or 94 schools had enrollments between 1,000 and 1,499; and 10.9 percent or 44 secondary schools had enrollments which ranged from 1,500 to a high of 4,209 students. Thus, 23.7 percent or 95 of the secondary schools in New Jersey enrolled fewer than 500 students.

Of the 1,855 public elementary schools in New Jersey, 1,378 or 74.3 percent had enrollments between 0 and 499, and 430 or 23.2 percent had enrollments between 500 and 999. Thus, 47 or 2.5 percent of the elementary schools had enrollments which ranged from 1,000 to a high of 1,381 students.

Table V This table was introduced in the 1984-85 edition of Vital Educational Statistics Volume I and is appearing for the fifth year. It reports on programs that the schools of New Jersey have established to meet the identified needs of their students and the numbers being served. The following table compares the students reported enrolled in 1987-88 with the numbers reported enrolled in 1988-89 by showing increasing, no change, and decreasing program enrollments.
