Daughter receives father's medals and flag four decades after his death

Loved ones gathered at The Outlet Collection-Jersey Gardens Mall in Elizabeth Tuesday to posthumously honor a Korean Conflict and Vietnam War veteran nearly 40 years after he was killed in action in Vietnam.

The New Jersey Department of Military and Veterans Affairs (DMAVA) awarded Sgt. 1st Class Robert H. Wescott Jr., the Distinguished Service Medal, the Korean Service Medal and the Vietnam Service Medal, which was proudly accepted by his daughter Christine Hamilton-Wescott, who was three-years-old when her father was killed in action.

In addition to the medal ceremony, the one thing that made this event unique was Hamilton-Wescott was also presented with a U.S. flag by Brig. Gen. Alfonse Stephenson, Air National Guard Director of Chaplains. "This flag is presented on behalf of a grateful nation, as a token of our appreciation for the honorable and faithful service rendered by your loved one," said Stephenson.

"A folded flag is presented to the next of kin to honor those who have served and have made the ultimate sacrifice," said Stephenson.

"This means more to me than you can imagine," said Hamilton-Wescott, as she embraces a framed picture of her father. "I am very proud of him and I know that he loved his country and all the Soldiers in his unit."

"Today, I am proud to say that after so many years my father was never forgotten and that his memory will always be with me," said Hamilton-Wescott.

The ceremony marked the start of a three-day visit of the veterans outreach kiosk where veterans and their family members can learn more about benefits or entitlements that they could be eligible to receive. The Veterans Outreach Program is an effort by the DMAVA to talk one-on-one with veterans or their family members about the wide variety of state and federal veterans' benefits.

HELP WITH CONCUSSIONS IN VETERAN'S HANDS TODAY

The Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) has developed Concussion Coach, a mobile application that provides portable tools to recognize symptoms and to identify and make use of coping strategies.

It's designed to meet the needs of Veterans and others who have suffered mild to moderate concussions.

The Concussion Coach application is designed to educate users about concussions, related symptoms, treatments and to enable users to recognize and assess symptoms.

In developing the Concussion Coach, we applied the clinical recommendations...to better understand the nature and consequences of injury to the brain.

It also identifies resources for managing symptoms, planning tools to build resilience, and provides access to crisis resources, including personal support contacts and ways in which the user can obtain professional healthcare.

Its development came about as a result of knowledge gained by VA medical staff in treatment of Traumatic Brain Injury (TBI).

Concussion Coach is available for mobile Apple devices (iPhone, iPad, and iPod Touch) from the App Store and will be available to Google Play later in 2014.

Brain injuries caused most often from falls and accidents

While combat injuries to Service members and injuries to professional athletes gain media attention, TBI is most often caused by

falls, vehicle accidents and violence. TBI is a major cause of death and disability worldwide, especially in children and young adults.

The application is a useful tool and is not intended to replace professional diagnosis, medical treatment or rehabilitation therapies for those who need them.

"We believe that Concussion Coach will support treatment with a healthcare professional by providing portable, convenient tools for the user to recognize symptoms and cope with concussion-related problems," said Dr. Micaela Cornis-Pop, Speech Pathologist and lead expert for the application.

"In developing the Concussion Coach, we applied the science and the clinical recommendations that have emerged from the recent efforts of researchers and practitioners across many agencies, organizations, and institutions to better understand the nature and consequences of injury to the brain," she added.

Concussion Coach was collaboratively developed by the Department of Veterans Affairs' Rehabilitation and Prosthetic Services and the National Center for Posttraumatic Stress Dis-

order and the Department of Defense National Center for Telehealth and Technology.

Concussion Coach Mobile App

Learn about:

- concussions, related symptoms, and treatment
- ways to improve concentration, thinking, and memory
- types of headaches, how to assess, and available treatments
- sleep and tools to help manage sleep problems
- symptoms of anxiety and PTSD and the relationships to concussions
- irritability and tips to help manage it

Select a coping tool, or begin by identifying a symptom and indicating your distress from 0 to 10. Based on your rating you will be offered a tool for crisis management or for your specific symptom.

Rate your distress again after using the tools and receive feedback.

Give a thumbs up or down to each tool, making it more or less likely to come up again.

Evaluate your symptoms with a self-assessment and receive interpretive feedback, including symptom severity and information about how your score compares to your last assessment.

View previous assessments on a line graph and schedule reminders to take it in the future.

Set goals to keep yourself motivated, track your symptoms and what has been effective in managing them in the Wellness Journal, make a plan to reduce isolation by selecting social activities and adding them to your calendar, and learn about smartphone features that may make it easier to keep up with daily activities and help with recovery.

Connects user with public and private resources to contact when support is needed, information to help user find professional care, and links for more extensive education.

Concussion Coach was a collaborative effort between the Department of Veterans Affairs Rehabilitation & Prosthetic Services, the Department of Veterans Affairs National Center for PTSD (NCPSTSD), and the Department of Defense National Center for Telehealth and Technology (T2).

Clean out your medicine cabinets



TRICARE beneficiaries have a safe and easy way to dispose of expired prescription drugs.

The Drug Enforcement Agency's (DEA's) National Prescription Drug Take-back Day is April 26. Sites will be open from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. for people to bring excess prescription drugs that otherwise could be abused or contaminate the environment.

A 2011 national survey on drug use found that Americans are twice as likely to regularly abuse prescription drugs as they are to regularly use cocaine, hallucinogens, heroin and inhalants combined. The same study found more than 70 percent of people abusing prescription pain relievers got them through friends or relatives, often without their knowledge.

During DEA's last take-back day in October 2013, Americans disposed of more than 647,211 pounds of prescription drugs. The last seven take-back days have collected more than 3.4 million pounds of unused medication.

Prescription and over-the-counter "solid dosage" drugs—tablets and capsules—are accepted, but intravenous solutions, injectable medications and needles are not. Illegal substances such as marijuana or methamphetamine are accepted.

Many military installations will participate in this event, including; Portsmouth Naval Medical Center in Norfolk, VA Peterson Air Force Base, Colo.; the Naval Medical Center in San Diego; and Fort Benning, Ga.
