

# A ROBUST ROAD NETWORK

With 2,900 miles of interstates and highways, New Jersey's world-class infrastructure offers unrivaled access to consumers and businesses throughout North America. Wherever you need to go from New Jersey, our interstates, parkways and expressways can get you there.

Follow the Choose New Jersey Governor-led Economic Mission to East Asia

- Interstate 95/New Jersey Turnpike, the primary interstate along the U.S. East Coast, enables access to markets from New England to Florida. These include major metropolitan markets, such as Boston, New York City, Philadelphia, Baltimore, Washington D.C., Richmond, Savannah, Jacksonville and Miami.
- Interstate 80, a U.S. transcontinental highway, runs from New Jersey to California.
- Interstate 78 links New Jersey's ports to points west, accommodating more than four million trucks each year.
- The Garden State Parkway stretches the length of the State from north to south, linking up with the thruways and highways of New York and Pennsylvania.
- The Atlantic City Expressway, Interstates 87, 195, 280, 287, and 295, and the Palisades Interstate Parkway connect companies with consumers and businesses. It also gives the State's residents direct access to beaches, parks, and entertainment venues throughout the region.

# AN EXTENSIVE MASS TRANSIT NETWORK

New Jersey's public transit system is fast and easily accessible. NJ Transit is the 3rd largest provider of rail, light rail and bus service in the U.S., serving 270 million passengers each year. More than 1,200 trains transverse 12 commuter rail lines. New Jersey's 3 light rail routes – Hudson-Bergen, Newark and the River Line – include 93 vehicles. The NJ Transit fleet also includes 2,000 buses which serve more than 250 bus routes.

On an average weekday, more than 280,000 commuters travel to New York City from Jersey City, Hoboken and other New Jersey cities via the PATH rail system. NJ Transit and PATH trains put Manhattan within an 18-minute commute.

New Jersey has six Amtrak stations and connections to many Amtrak routes, including the Northeast Regional line stopping in New York City, Philadelphia, Washington D.C. and Boston.

# AN UNRIVALLED CARGO NETWORK

With nearly 1,000 miles of freight lines, New Jersey is one of the top transporters of goods in North America. The Norfolk Southern, CSX, CSAO, Morristown & Erie Railroad move cargo from New Jersey to inland markets throughout the U.S.

When combined with the Port Authority of New York and New Jersey's deep water ports and air cargo network, the State's cargo rail system deepens the reach of products and materials to consumers and companies around the country.
