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PREFACE

The primary reason for the establishment of the decennial census of population, as set forth in the Constitution, was to provide a basis for the apportionment of members of the House of Representatives among the several States. This atlas of State maps and inset maps depicts the boundaries of the congressional districts into which the country was divided at the time of the 1960 Census of Population.

In its first session next year the 87th Congress will reapportion the number of representatives among the States, and the States which gain or lose members of Congress may then be expected to redefine congressional districts within their borders. When the majority of these changes have been accomplished, a revised edition of this atlas may be published.

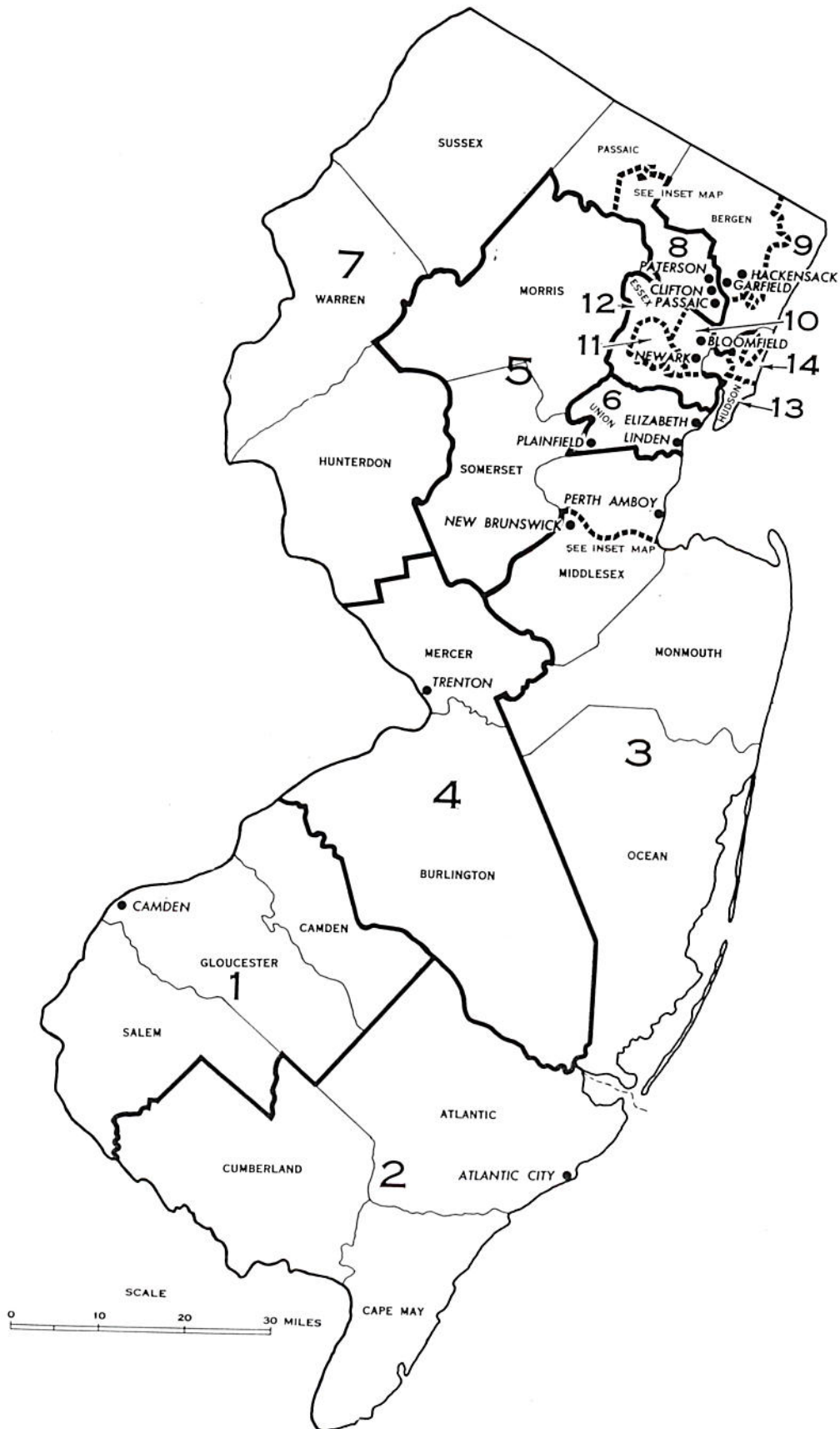
In the Spring of 1961 the Bureau of the Census plans to issue a Congressional District Data Book which will present a selection of statistics from the most recent censuses for each congressional district. The statistical items proposed for inclusion will cover subjects from the following censuses: 1960 Censuses of Population and Housing, 1959 Census of Agriculture, 1958 Census of Business, 1958 Censuses of Manufactures and Mineral Industries, and the 1957 Census of Governments. 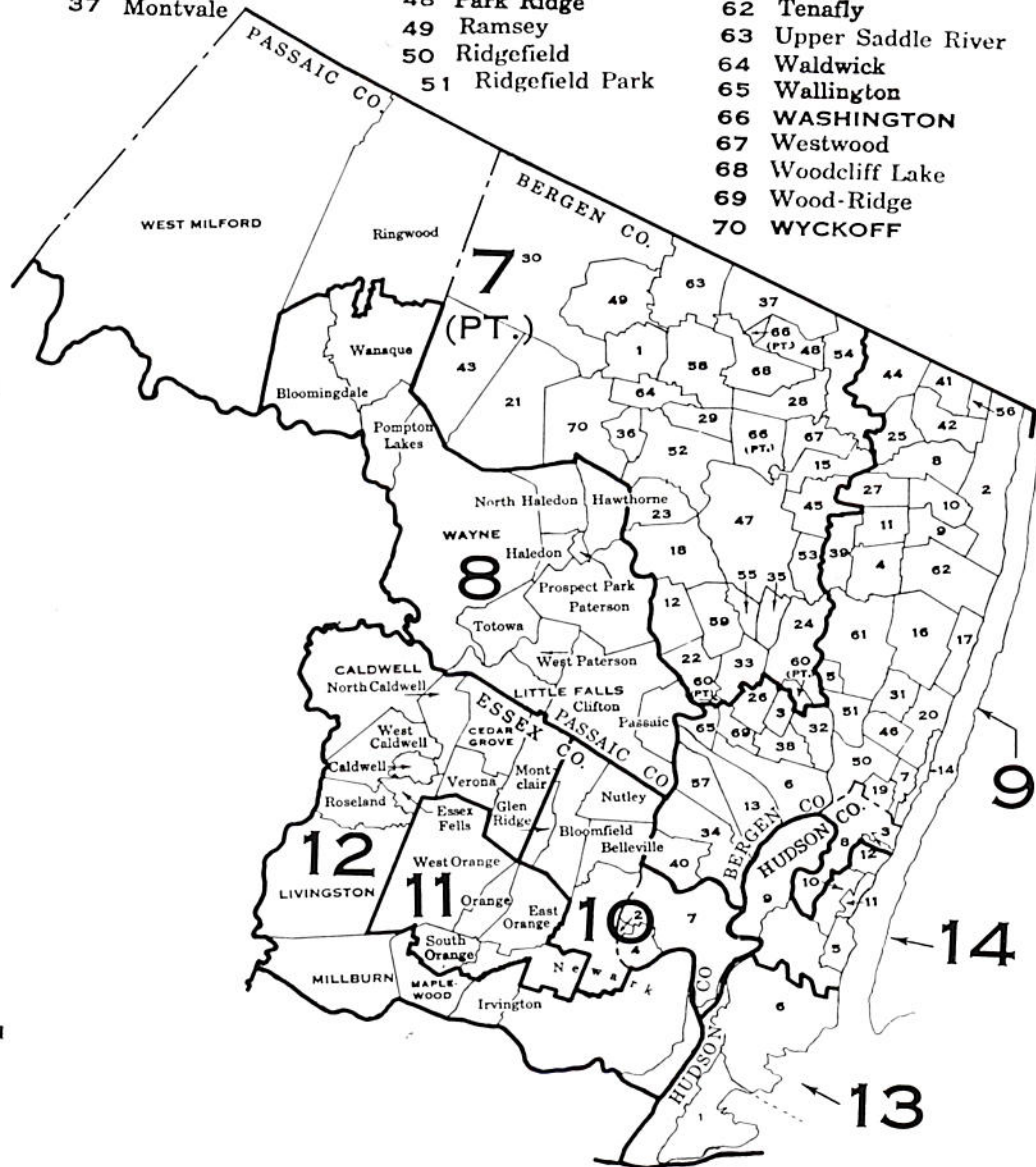

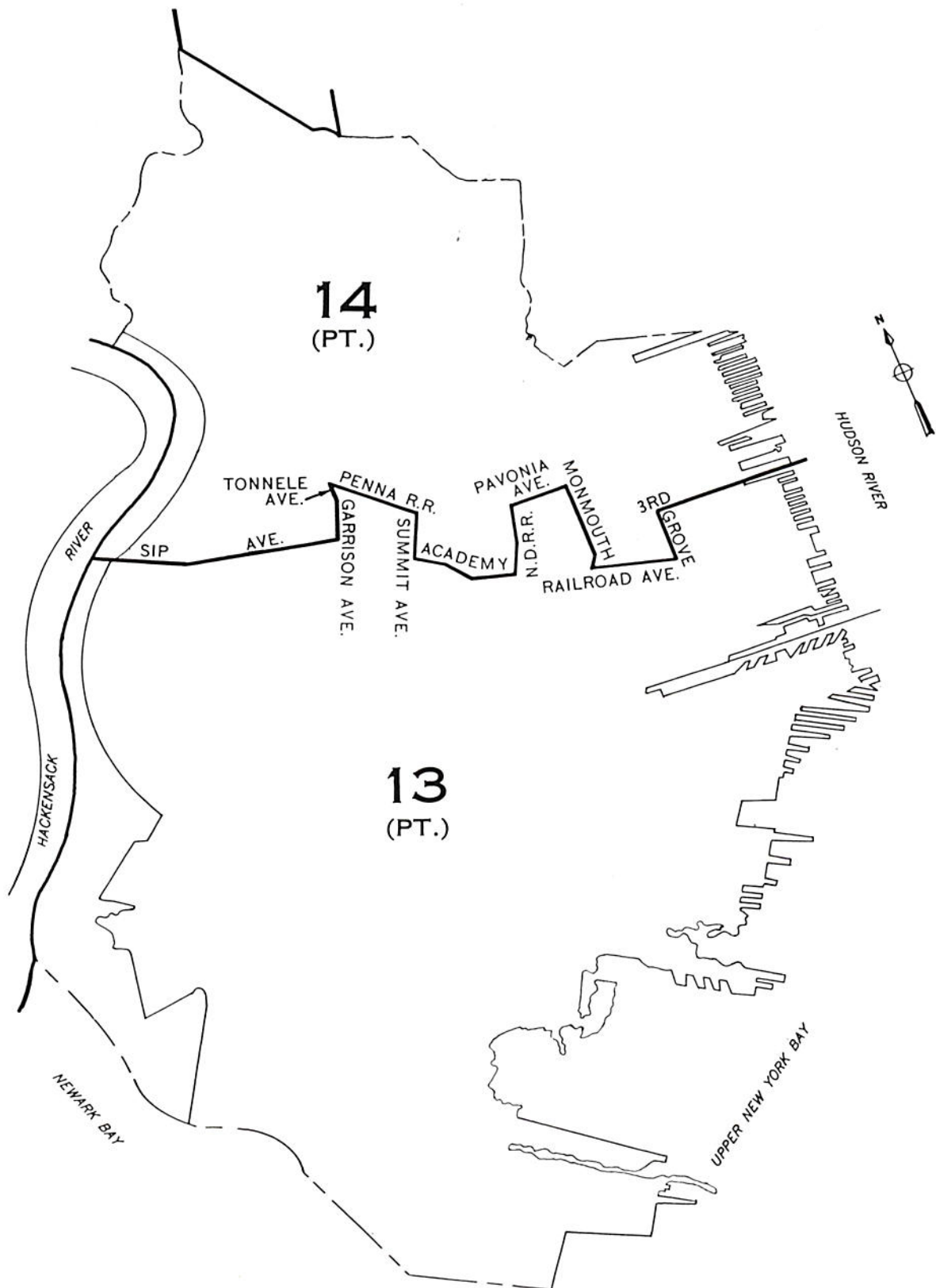

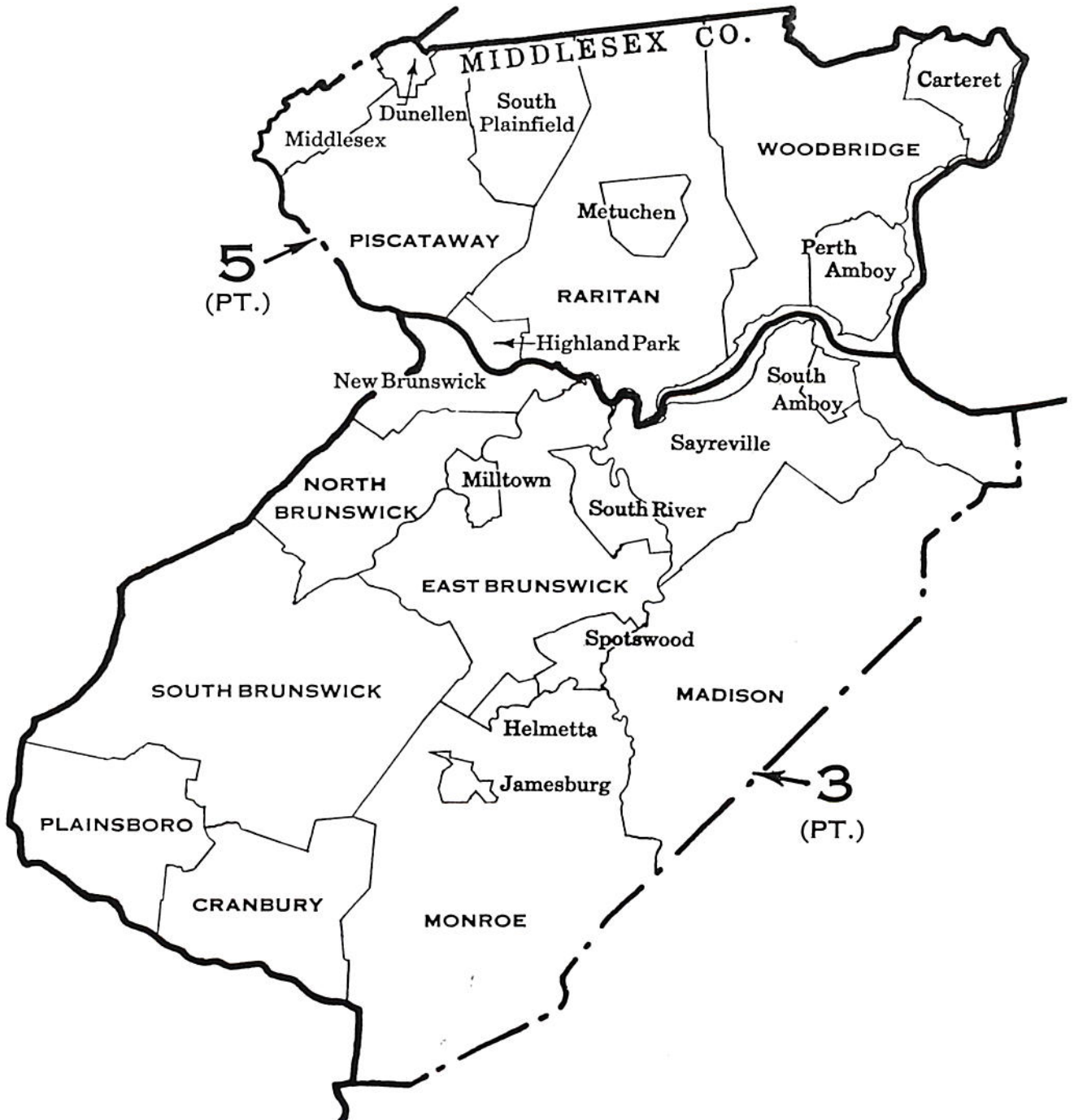
