EMPLOYMENT TRENDS

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Data through May 1982

July 1982

Nonfarm wage and salary employment in New Jersey dropped on a seasonally adjusted basis by 6,300 from April to a May level of 3,060,700. The April-to-May downturn was substantially the result of a strike of about 4,600 workers at Public Service Electric and Gas.

Nonfactory division employment decreased by 3,400 to a seasonally adjusted level of 2,330,600. Transportation and public utilities accounted for virtually all of this loss as a result of the above mentioned strike and the layoff of 325 motor freight and air transportation workers.

Construction employment rose by 1,100 jobs in May to a seasonally adjusted level of 113,600. Over-the-month increases were posted in the residential building, the heavy construction, and the special building trades segments.

Government increased by 1,000 jobs in May to a seasonally adjusted level of 524,800. Small gains of 300 to 400 were recorded in each of the state, local, and federal government segments.

Jobholdings in manufacturing fell on a seasonally adjusted basis for the tenth consecutive month to a May level of 730,100. Small increases of from 100 to 500 in several durable goods industries could not offset the grip of the national recession on the nondurable goods sector, which declined by 3,100. Less than seasonally expected hiring in apparel and a number of layoffs throughout the other nondurable industries accounted for the over-the-month decline. Apparel lost 1,200 jobs followed closely by chemicals, which lost 900 jobs.

The Department of Labor survey also revealed that the average production worker in New Jersey's manufacturing industries earned \$339.69 during the May survey week, \$3.69 more than in April. After seasonal adjustment, the average workweek remained at 40.3 hours over the month.

LABOR AREA COMMENTS (Not seasonally adjusted data)

Total nonagricultural wage and salary employment increased seasonally in May in seven of the state's ten major labor areas. The most substantial gain in jobholdings was recorded in the Newark Labor Area, which rose by 3,900 over the month. Following closely were the Atlantic City and Long Branch-Asbury Park Labor Areas, gaining 2,700 and 2,600, respectively. The Vineland-Millville-Bridgeton and Jersey City Labor Areas remained stable over the month. Only the Hackensack Labor Area registered a decline in May, dropping by 2,100 jobs.

The Newark increase was concentrated in the nonmanufacturing division, rising by 4,900, mainly because of seasonal hiring in retail trade and construction. The Atlantic City and Long Branch-Asbury Park gains were primarily in nonmanufacturing reflecting seasonal hiring in services and trade. The Hackensack decrease, chiefly in nonmanufacturing, was due to scattered layoffs throughout the sector and a strike in the trade industry.

In the manufacturing division, activity was split over the month, with five areas showing small increases of from 100 to 300 and five areas registering decreases from 100 to 700. The Camden Labor Area recorded the largest increase, up by 300, due to increases in durable goods, while the Hackensack Labor Area posted the largest decline, down by 700, primarily because of scattered layoffs throughout both the durable and nondurable goods sector.

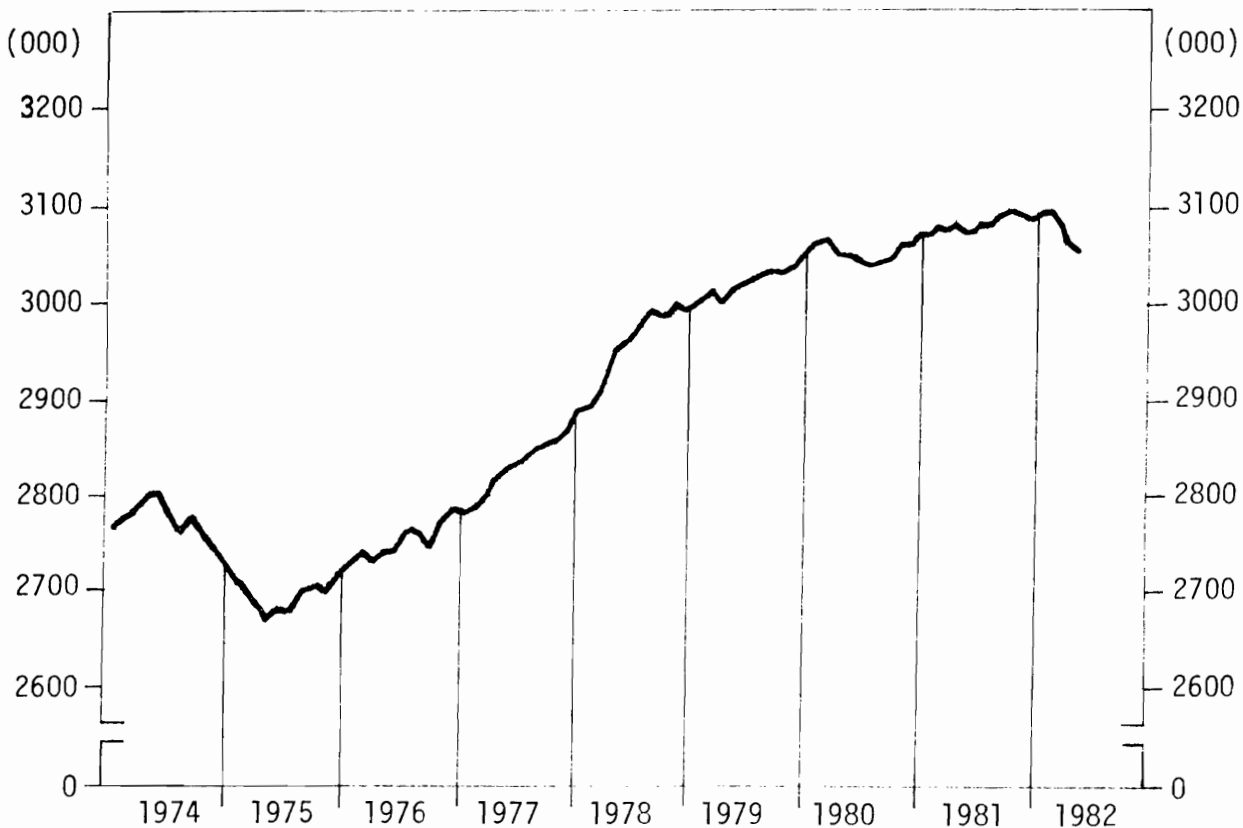

TECHNICAL NOTES

Nonfarm Wage and Salary Employment

Employment data refer to persons on establishment payrolls who received pay for any part of the pay period which includes the 12th of the month. The data exclude proprietors, the self-employed, unpaid family workers, farm workers, and domestic workers in households. Salaried officers of corporations are included. Government employment covers only civilian employees; federal military personnel are excluded.

Persons on an establishment payroll who are on paid sick leave (when pay is received directly from the firm), on paid holiday or paid vacation, or who work during any part of the pay period but are unemployed or on strike during the rest of the period, are counted as employed. Not counted as employed are persons who, during the pay period which includes the 12th, are laid off, on leave without pay or on strike for the entire period, or who are hired but do not work during the period.
