Members of the 177th Fighter Wing Fire Department departed this week for Iraq in Support of Operation Iraqi Freedom. Major General Eugene Chojnacki, Commander, NJ Air National Guard, along with Colonel Brian Webster, Commander, 277th Fighter Wing, and the senior leadership of the Support Group met with the group before they departed the 177th. They will be attached to the 407th AEG.

While deployed to the Area of Responsibility, they will be assigned to the base fire department as the RAMS Team, six firefighters and a combat medic. They will respond to off-base incidents via ground transportation or helicopter that require specialized training in extraction, confined space, haz-mat or other emergency/rescue operations. They received three weeks of Combat Skills Training at Fort Carson, Colorado, and will receive two additional weeks of specialized training in Kuwait before deploying to their final location.

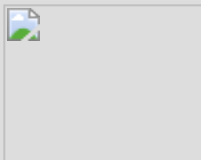

New Jersey Freedom Loans

What is a Freedom Loan?

- * Up to \$10,000
- * Annual APR 6%
- * Term: 5 years (no pre-payment penalty)
- * Unsecured Loan (no collateral required)

Who is eligible to apply?

NJ residents who are:

- * Members of the National Guard or Reserve
- * Mobilized for one year or longer to fight in the Global War on Terrorism (GWOT) – excluding routine training.

Or

- * Served 90 or more consecutive days in the GWOT on federal or state active duty (excluding routing training) and have received orders extending cumulative active duty a year or longer.

How do I apply?

- * Contact participating banks. Call or visit your local branch office to

U.S. Department of Labor issues new rules regarding returning Guard and Reserve members.

The Labor Department issued new rules spelling out the rights and responsibilities of returning Guard and Reserve members – and of their employers.

The rules become effective this month and are designed to enforce a law that has been on the books for 11 years. This is the first clarification of the Uniformed Services Employment and Reemployment Rights Act, known as USERRA, since that law was enacted in 1994.

The 268 page document includes a large section in question-and-answer format that explain how USERRA protects against discrimination and retaliation because of military service and gives service members time to report back to jobs following completion of their service obligations.

Meet the 108th Air Refueling Wing's (ARW) new Chaplain, Captain Christopher L. Miller.

Coast Guard, Navy, Marine Corps, and now Air Force – the 108th ARW's new chaplain, Captain Christopher L. Miller, had had a well-rounded military career.

The chaplain began his military career as an enlisted Coast Guard Reservist in 1976. Almost 20 years later, he was commissioned into the United States Navy as an Ensign in the Chaplain Candidate Program. In 1998, Chaplain Miller became a full chaplain in the Navy and served as a Reserve chaplain. His last command before transferring to the Air National Guard was as a Reserve Station Chaplain for Marine Corps Air Station, Cherry Point, N.C. Chaplain Miller says that although he jokes about serving in the Army so that he can have the full set of uniforms hanging in his closet, his wife tells him there is no more room.

After six years as a licensed, local pastor, Captain Miller was ordained in the United Methodist Church in 1996. He has served in New Jersey churches located in Gibbstown, Pennsville, Buckshutem, Millville, Port Norris, and Pemberton. Capt Miller also worked for three years on the Bishop's staff as the Director of the 9/11 Long-Term Recovery Program for the United Methodist Church throughout New Jersey.

Chaplain Miller currently serves as the Senior Pastor of First United Methodist Church of Delran, N.J. He and his wife Linda have two daughters, Adia and Danica, and one granddaughter, Mayden.

To culminate its involvement in the Bicentennial, the National Guard is sponsoring this Lewis and Clark Youth Rendezvous.

By way of an essay contest, our nation's high school juniors and seniors will be afforded the opportunity to compete for one of the 540 spots in this immersion into history," said Stephen L.
