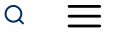

Currently, the [Digital Jerseyana Collection](#) boasts over 7,700 items, a majority of which are photographs. It features a wide-range of items and collections that can be used for all matters of interest.

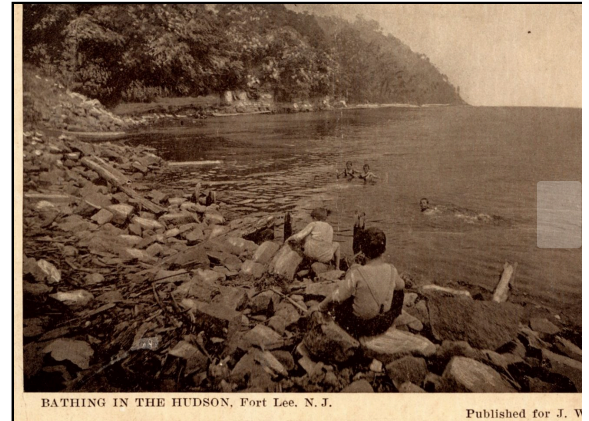
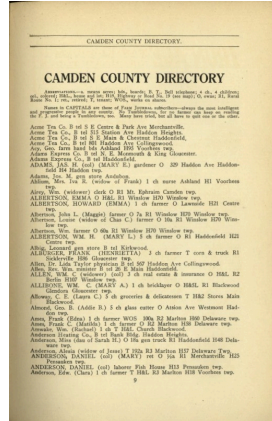
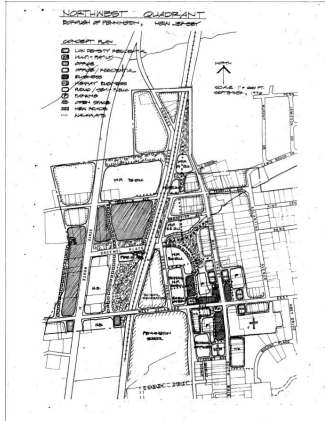
Some of the highlights of the collection so far include:

For example, we have the [annual reports and proceedings](#) of 2 prominent 19<sup>th</sup> and early 20<sup>th</sup> century benevolent societies, the Knights of the Golden Eagle and the Knights of Honor of New Jersey. We also have a [written agreement](#) between two members of the Disbrow family for the sale of an enslaved person named Harriet for a two-wheeled carriage.
