James DiEleuterio Sworn-in as State Treasurer by Gov. Christie Whitman

Gov. Christie Whitman today swore in James A. DiEleuterio, Jr. as State Treasurer.

"Jim DiEleuterio brings to the Treasurer's office a vast amount of expertise and experience in state government fiscal matters," Whitman said. "I am confident that he will greatly assist us in our efforts to continue to formulate fiscal policies that are in the best interests of New Jersey taxpayers and the economy of our state."

DiEleuterio, Deputy State Treasurer since 1996, has spent 26 years working for the Department of the Treasury. He began his career in 1971 as an auditor with the Division of Taxation and was promoted to a variety of managerial positions within the division, including Chief of Staff, Manager of Long-Range Planning and Chief of Management Services.

In 1991, he was named Assistant Director of Processing and Administration for the Division of Taxation and served as Assistant State Treasurer for Tax Policy from 1994 to 1996.

DiEleuterio, who lives in Hamilton, received his undergraduate degree from Rider University and his master's degree from the Widener University Graduate School of Business.
