New Jersey Historical Commission Accepting Applications for Black Heritage Trail Program

The New Jersey Historical Commission, a division of the Department of State, is now accepting applications for its inaugural, statewide Black Heritage Trail Program. The New Jersey Black Heritage Trail was signed into law by Governor Murphy on September 7, 2022. The legislation calls for the New Jersey Historical Commission (NJHC) to establish a Black Heritage Trail “to promote awareness and appreciation of Black history, heritage, and culture” that will “highlight Black heritage sites through historical markers and a trail-like path that connects the stories of Black life and resiliency.” The Black Heritage Trail Marker Nomination Process is now open and submissions must be completed by **Friday, March 8, 2024, at 2:00pm**.
