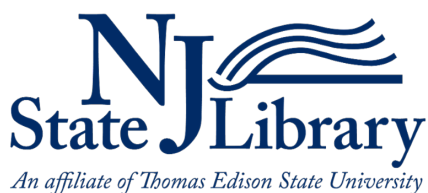

Heritage Quest from ProQuest

As per our state sales representative, the State Library has been told to have patrons/users access the direct url to HeritageQuest:

<https://www.heritagequestonline.com>.

That will authenticate IP's that are in the ProQuest system. Any remote or alternate method (barcode, referring url), a library can send into customerservice@proquest.com and they will work with each library.

The direct method is preferable over the portal at this time. If there is some 3rd party authentication like Auto-Graphics, ProQuest will work with the libraries to authenticate users as well.
