I. INTRODUCTION

This directory lists agencies, institutions and organizations which have persons available to address educators, community people, and students in their Holocaust-Genocide studies, and to assist teachers in the implementation of these studies. Such persons include; survivors, liberators, children of survivors (second generation persons), social scientists, historians, prosecutors of Nazi war criminals, artists, community leaders involved in moral-ethical issues, teacher trainees, and volunteers.

This booklet was prepared in response to the recommendations of the New Jersey Advisory Council on Holocaust Education which were contained in its report presented to the Governor and the Commissioner of the State Department of Education on January 24, 1984. The council, upon its creation by Governor Kean in October 1982, was charged with offering recommendations to "facilitate the inclusion of the Holocaust in public education."

Among the recommendations of the Council were two requests directed to the New Jersey State Department of Education: that it prepare a booklet listing essential books and films, annotated, in Holocaust-Genocide studies, to serve as a core library for school districts interested in setting up resource materials in such areas for its students; and that it prepare a second booklet listing organizations and names of resource persons in the state who can provide expertise to school districts for implementing or enhancing Holocaust-Genocide studies.

This is the second booklet. It contains three sections: Resource Persons, Resource Organizations, and Questionnaires, useful for contacting resource persons. The first section lists names of resource persons in public agencies, such as the New Jersey Advisory Council on Holocaust Education, or in educational institutions and agencies which have granted permission for inclusion of individual listings.

The second section lists various resource organizations which can provide individuals to meet specific needs of school teachers and educators. Since their own membership lists are private and not for public release, the organizations must be contacted directly to secure appropriate speakers and assistance.

The third section contains two questionnaires developed by the Human Resources Committee of the Advisory Council on Holocaust Education one to screen prospective speakers to ascertain their background, availability and suitability for specific educational needs; the second, a teachers questionnaire designed to inform the speaker of the specific student group to be addressed. Such data on student background, supplied by the teachers, enable speakers to prepare for their presentations.

The listings contained herein are by no means exhaustive, either for individual resource persons or resource organizations. In some cases, there are duplicative listings, with speakers cited both individually and again as members of organizations. Although listings were originally intended to be confined to New Jersey resources, important organizations outside the state have been included as well.
