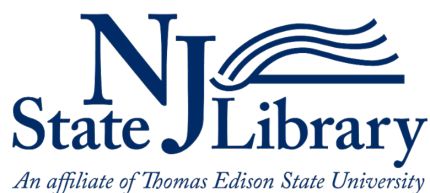

Grant Opportunities and More...

Preservation Assistance Grant Application Open

Applications are open for the National Endowment for the Humanities Preservation Assistance Grants for Smaller Institutions program. Preservation Assistance Grants help small and mid-sized institutions improve their ability to preserve and care for their significant humanities collections. The maximum award amount is \$10,000 (or \$15,000 for projects related to NEH's "A More Perfect Union" initiative). The [application](#) is due Jan. 15, 2020.

Webinar: Library Programs and Partnerships in 2020 Census

The American Library Association will host a free webinar, "Library Programs and Partnerships in the 2020 Census," for library staff Dec. 16, 2019 at 2:00 p.m. This webinar will highlight key opportunities for libraries to collaborate with community partners and provide informational programs in the upcoming census. Sustaining Cultural Heritage Collection Application Open

Applications are open for the National Endowment for the Humanities Sustaining Cultural Heritage Collections program. SCHC helps cultural institutions meet the complex challenge of preserving large and diverse holdings of humanities materials for future generations by supporting sustainable conservation measures that mitigate deterioration, prolong the useful life of collections, and support institutional resilience. Planning grants up to \$50,000 and implementation grants up to \$350,000 will be awarded. The [application](#) is due Jan. 30, 2020.

Libraries Transform Communities Engagement Grant Application Open

The American Library Association is accepting applications for the "Libraries Transform Communities Engagement Grant." The grant provides support for a school, public, academic, tribal or special libraries to expand their community engagement efforts. One library will be selected to receive \$2,000. The grant period may be one to two years in length. The [application](#) deadline is Feb. 3, 2020.
