





GARDEN STATE PARK'S REQUEST TO
SIMULCAST THEIR FEATURE RACE TO FOXBORO RACEWAY

Garden State Park requests Commission approval to simulcast its feature race to Foxboro Raceway, Foxboro, Massachusetts for the following dates:

August 21, 22, 23, 26, 28, 29, & 30

September 9, 11, 12, 13, 16, 18, 19, 20, 23, 25, 26, 27, & 30

October 2, 3, 4, 7, 9, 10, 11, 14, 16, 17, 18, & 21

The Commission is in receipt of the approval from the Standardbred Owner's Association of New England, Inc., and the Massachusetts Racing Commission in compliance with the Federal Interstate Horse Racing Act. John Higgins, Secretary, on behalf of the Standardbred Breeders and Owners Association of New Jersey gave that organization's approval for this request.

On motion by Commissioner Dimon, seconded by Commissioner Monaco, Garden State Park's request to simulcast its feature race to Foxboro Raceway was approved.

JOINT APPLICATION BETWEEN THE MEADOWLANDS AND
ATLANTIC CITY FOR AN INTRASTATE SIMULCAST PERMIT

The Meadowlands and Atlantic City Racing Association have applied for an intrastate wagering license whereby the Meadowlands thoroughbred races would be simulcast to Atlantic City from September 1 through December 13, 1986. Frank Viggiani, Chairman of the Financial Committee for the Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association, granted that organization's support of this request.

On motion by Commissioner Dimon, seconded by Commissioner Monaco, approval was granted for the Meadowlands and Atlantic City Racing Association's request to simulcast the Meadowlands thoroughbred races to Atlantic City for the Meadowlands thoroughbred race meeting.

JOINT APPLICATION OF GARDEN STATE PARK AND ATLANTIC CITY
RACING ASSOCIATION FOR AN INTERTRACK SIMULCAST PERMIT

Garden State Park and Atlantic City Racing Association have applied for a simulcast permit whereby Garden State Park harness races would be simulcast to Atlantic City from September 2 through December 20, 1986. John Higgins, Secretary, Standardbred Breeders and Owners Association and Frank Viggiani, Chairman of the Financial Committee for the Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association, respectively granted their organization's approval of this request.

On motion by Commissioner Dimon, seconded by Commissioner Monaco, the joint application of Garden State Park and Atlantic City Racing Association to simulcast Garden State Park harness races during its meeting to Atlantic City Racing Association was approved.

ATLANTIC CITY AND GARDEN STATE PARK'S APPLICATION
TO SIMULCAST FROM ATLANTIC CITY TO GARDEN STATE PARK

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Atlantic City Racing Association and Garden State Park request approval for a joint simulcast permit for Atlantic City to simulcast their thoroughbred races to Garden State Park through August 30, 1986. Frank Viggiani, Chairman of the Financial Committee for the Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association, gave that organization's approval. Paul M. O'Gara, Counsel for the Standardbred Breeders and Owners Association, had submitted a letter granting the Standardbred Breeders and Owners Association's approval of this request.

On motion by Commissioner Dimon, seconded by Commissioner Monaco, Atlantic City's request to simulcast their thoroughbred races to Garden State Park through August 30, 1986 was approved.

JOINT APPLICATION FOR AN INTRASTATE SIMULCAST PERMIT
FROM THE MEADOWLANDS TO MONMOUTH PARK

The Meadowlands and Monmouth Park have submitted a joint application for a simulcast permit whereby the Meadowlands thoroughbred races would be simulcast to Monmouth Park from September 1 through December 13, 1986. Frank Viggiani, Chairman of the Financial Committee for the Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association, requested that the following be read into the minutes:

The HBPA consents to the various simulcasting requests on the agenda today with the exception of Meadowlands to Monmouth Park September 1 to December 13, 1986. The Horsemen have been running at Monmouth Park without a contract, and the Sports and Exposition Authority had not met with us at all to discuss the contract concerning the upcoming Meadowlands meeting.

As you know, this summer, the Thoroughbred Horsemen initially refused certain simulcasting requests made by the Sports and Exposition Authority to simulcast races from Monmouth Park.

Upon being assured that a reasonable proposal regarding purses at Monmouth Park would be made by the Sports and Exposition Authority, and, in good faith, we changed our position and granted all simulcasting requests.

We will not do this again. The consents we give today, we give, so as not to injure third parties such as the Atlantic City organization.

But, in order to avoid any possible misunderstanding, we wish to make it very clear on the record that the HBPA has no intention of consenting to the simulcasting of races from Meadowlands to Monmouth Park this fall

unless the Sports and Exposition Authority presents the Thoroughbred Horsemen with satisfactory purse structures, consistent with today's economic conditions, with respect to both the current Monmouth Park meeting and the fall Meadowlands meeting.

We wish to note that on Friday, July 25, 1986, we delivered a copy of our negotiating contract, signed by President Frucht, to Mr. Harold Handel and have heard nothing since. We also wish to note that we have been and remain ready, willing and able to meet with the Sports and Exposition Authority concerning the Meadowlands contract.

Harold G. Handel, General Manager of Monmouth Park, stated that he again wished to comment that he felt it was not the intent of the legislature for the Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association to use the power for rejecting simulcasting as a means for negotiating contracts with the permitholders. Commissioner Neff stated he was in agreement with Mr. Handel that it was not the intent of the legislature to use horsemen's approval for simulcast requests as a tool to negotiate contracts by the horsemen groups and the racing associations.

Stanley Panco, President, Thoroughbred Breeders Association, stated that he felt the Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association had to know where the benefit from simulcasting is going to come from in order for the Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association to negotiate a contract on purses. Mr. Panco also stated that the Meadowlands had exceeded the statutory percentage given to purses in order to compete with purses in other states as well as within the State of New Jersey.

On motion by Commissioner Jacobson, seconded by Commissioner Monaco, the Racing Commission approved the simulcast request by the Meadowlands to simulcast their races to Monmouth Park from September 1 through December 13, 1986 conditioned upon the Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association providing written approval prior to September 1, 1986.

OFFICIALS, MUTUEL POOLS, ADMISSION AND PARKING FEES
FOR FREEHOLD RACING ASSOCIATION'S HARNESS MEET

On motion by Commissioner Dimon, seconded by Commissioner Monaco, the Commission approved the list of officials as submitted by Freehold Racing Association, as well as the mutuel pools, admission and parking fees.

Joseph V. McLoone, President, Freehold Racing Association, advised the Commission that Freehold would reopen with a tent meeting due to the delay in the complete reconstruction of the Freehold grandstand. The admission and parking fees would be the same as was provided for in previous tent meetings and a new format will be forwarded for the Commission's approval when the facility is completed.

Freehold will offer eleven (11) races with a daily double on the 1st and 2nd race, exactas on the 2nd, 3rd, 4th, 6th, 7th, 8th, 9th, and 10th races and trifecta wagering on the 5th and 11th races.

OFFICIALS, MUTUEL POOLS, ADMISSION AND PARKING FEES
FOR GARDEN STATE PARK'S HARNESS MEET

On motion by Commissioner Dimon, seconded by Commissioner Monaco, the list of officials, mutuel pools, admission fees and the parking fees as submitted by Garden State Park for their upcoming harness meet were approved. The Commission made note that one position, that of a patrol judge, was not filled at this time, however, the candidate for the vacancy would be approved subject to the necessary background investigations.

A letter from Arthur Winkler, House Counsel and Director of Administration, Garden State Park, notified the Commission that Garden State Park would offer the Super-Six and it would be comprised of the 3rd through 8th race and they would have exacta wagering in each race except for the 4th race where they will offer a trifecta only and they would also card a second trifecta which will be offered on the last race of its program. Garden State Park will also offer an early double on the 1st and 2nd race and a late double on the 7th and 8th race.

OFFICIALS, MUTUEL POOLS, ADMISSION AND PARKING FEES
FOR THE MEADOWLANDS THOROUGHBRED MEET

On motion by Commissioner Dimon, seconded by Commissioner Monaco, the list of officials, mutuel pools, admission and parking fees as submitted by the Meadowlands in connection with their 1986 thoroughbred race meeting, which begins on Friday, August 29, 1986, were approved.

CANCELLATION OF WAGERS ON RACES
REMOVED FROM THE TURF

Monmouth Park requested Commission approval to allow refunds when races scheduled for the turf are cancelled due to inclement weather after wagering on the races for that day has commenced.

On motion by Commissioner Jacobson, seconded by Commissioner Neff, approval was granted to allow for cancellation of wagers made on turf races when the turf races are cancelled and moved to the main track for the remainder of the Monmouth Park meeting on an experimental basis. Executive Director Garland explained that the wagers would be cancelled prior to the preceding race of the turf race being declared official.

STATUS REPORT OF FREEHOLD RACING
ASSOCIATION'S RECONSTRUCTION PROJECT

Joseph V. McLoone, President, Freehold Racing Association, advised the Commission that the reconstruction of the grandstand at Freehold Raceway would

not be completed until the end of September. Mr. McLoone told the Commission that the air supported structures have been removed and that tents have been erected in their place to accommodate the fans for their scheduled reopening on August 25, 1986. Mr. McLoone also noted that the facilities for the public would be the same as it was for the previous temporary tent meetings.

STATUS REPORT OF ATLANTIC CITY RACING ASSOCIATION'S THIRD TRIFECTA

James Murphy, President, Atlantic City Racing Association, notified the Commission that the initial results of having a 3rd trifecta at Atlantic City was successful. Mr. Murphy noted that the 6th race, in which the 3rd trifecta had been designated as, is the largest wagering trifecta pool of the evening, highlighted by the fact that the horses competing in that race on the program are of a higher quality than the other two (2) trifecta races.

Mr. Murphy advised the Commission that the Super-Six has been an effective tool although not an overwhelming success in increasing the patron's interest. He stated that there is a large fan interest and an increased attendance when the Super-Six has not been hit for a few days and the pool, as a result of the carry-over, has grown larger.

Harold G. Handel, General Manager, Monmouth Park, stated that the initial results of the Super-Six at Monmouth Park were encouraging. Monmouth Park had guaranteed that successful patrons who selected the Super-Six on opening day were assured of a \$100,000 payoff. Mr. Handel noted that five (5) patrons were successful in selecting the winners of the races comprising the Super-Six on opening day which resulted in Monmouth Park paying out an additional \$50,000 over and above the money in the Super-Six pool.

FINANCIAL REPORT

Executive Director Garland notified the public that he would not read into the record the financial report of the operating racetracks, however, copies of that report had been forwarded to the Commissioners and reports were available to any interested party.

THE MATTER OF JAMES KING, JR.

On motion by Commissioner Marfuggi, seconded by Commissioner Neff, the Racing Commission on remand from the Supreme Court, State of New Jersey, has rejected the initial decision issued by the Administrative Law Judge and affirmed the decision by the Board of Judges suspending driver/trainer James King, Jr., for six (6) months for lack of effort. Mr. King was suspended by the Board of Judges for an unsatisfactory drive while driving the horse, "NANCY'S BEST BET" in the 8th race on March 31, 1984 at Freehold Raceway. The Board of Judges had found Mr. King to be in violation of N.J.A.C. 13:71-20.10(a) "If the judges believe that a horse is being driven or has been driven with design to prevent his winning a heat or a dash which he was evidently able to win, or is being raced in an inconsistent manner . . ." Commissioner Monaco dissented on this decision. Neither Chairman Stuart O. Goldsmith nor Executive Director Bruce H. Garland participated in the consideration of this matter.
