APPROVAL OF A REQUEST BY GARDEN STATE PARK TO RECEIVE THE
PRESIDENTIAL PACE AND THE FIRST LADY FROM ROSECROFT RACEWAY ON
NOVEMBER 3 AND TWO BREEDER CROWN EVENTS FROM POMPANO PARK ON
NOVEMBER 2 FROM AND NOVEMBER 30

Chairman Dowd indicated that Garden State Park submitted along with the request an analysis of the races that they requested. The analysis appears to fit all statutory requirements.

On motion by Chairman Dowd, seconded by Commissioner McGlynn the request by Garden State Park was unanimously approved by the Commission.

THE APPROVAL OF AN ADVERTISEMENT OF RULE N.J.A.C. 13-71-9.4,
13:70-19.43 AND 13:71-9.2(c), WHICH WOULD REQUIRE EMERGENCY
VETERINARIAN SERVICES DURING RACING

Executive Director Bruce Garland indicated to the Commissioners and the public that this rule was a recommendation from the Veterinarian Advisory Committee through Deputy Director Bradley.

He stated this advertisement would allow comments from the public. Chairman Dowd asked if the economics of the emergency veterinarian services have been taken into consideration. Executive Director Garland stated that economics were not a part of the rule and the rule would require that the services be acquired by the track associations. He stated that the other options could be discussed.

On motion by Commissioner McGlynn, seconded by Commissioner Dimon, approval was given for the advertisement of a rule for emergency veterinarian services.

ADOPTION N.J.A.C. 13:71-23.8 AND 13:70-14A.9 (EXPANDS THE
CERTIFICATION OF RESPIRATORY BLEEDERS)

Executive Director Garland informed the Commission that this adoption was consistent with the directive that has already been in effect. He stated that this would authorize certified bleeders from other states to race as bleeders in New Jersey on Lasix. This would also be consistent with the recommendation of the Lasix committee appointed by Chairman Dowd and is consistent with preliminary discussion that New Jersey has had with other racing jurisdictions for a regional Lasix policy.

Chairman Dowd asked whether the commission had received other comments from groups other than the lasix committee regarding this rule. Executive Garland indicated that the Commission had not.

On motion by Commissioner McGlynn, seconded by Commissioner Dimon, the adoption of N.J.A.C. 13:71-23.8 and 13:70-14A.9 was unanimously approved by the Commission.

Executive Director Garland indicated that a subcommittee of the regional Lasix committee has met to discuss final recommendations to the committee. There was substantial agreement on all subjects including reciprocity in certification. The subcommittee will be recommending a rule similar to this rule. This would put states on notice outside our region beginning in 1992 the region will be approving only state veterinarian certified bleeders. There is also an agreement on all areas which include dosages and length of time on the list for various times bled.

APPROVAL OF MEADOWLANDS REQUEST TO RUN AN ADDITIONAL FIVE RACES ON BREEDERS' CUP DAY

Executive Director Garland informed the Commission that the Meadowlands was requesting an approval of five races during the Breeders' Cup day and interspace those races between the Breeders' Cup races in the afternoon in addition to their regular night card.

Sam Anzalone, of the Meadowlands informed the Commission that the Meadowlands wanted to offer their racing fans live racing during Breeders' Cup day in addition to their night card.

Chairman Dowd asked if the Racing Commission staff or officials would be compensated due to the additional five races. Executive Director Garland indicated to the Commission that it would be additional hours for the staff and the officials, however, the Meadowlands would work out additional compensation for the officials for their extra hours.

On motion by Commissioner Dimon, seconded by Commissioner McGlynn, the Meadowlands request was unanimously approved by the Commission.

REPORT TO THE COMMISSION ON THE ELIMINATION OF PLACE AND SHOW WAGERING ON THE THREE DIAMONDS ELIMINATION FROM GARDEN STATE PARK ON OCTOBER 6

Executive Director Garland reported to the Commission on the elimination of place and show wagering on the Three Diamonds Elimination from Garden State Park on October 6. Consistent with the Commission's authorization, Executive Director Garland also approved the elimination of place and show wagering on the Three Diamond Final which was held on October 13.

Mr. Hastings from Garden State Park was in attendance at the meeting to answer any questions. Mr. Hastings indicated that the amounts that were bet were consistent with what track management expected would be wagered on these races, Mr. Hastings indicated for the record the figures that had been wagered on the Diamond Eliminations and the Final in previous years. Track management had not received any negative feedback from racing patrons.

THE EFFECT OF EXOTIC WAGERING ON THE STATE-WIDE HANDLE

Chairman Dowd stated the Commission has had continuous request from the tracks to add exotic wagering. He conveyed an incident at Freehold, in which the tote computers were "down" for one race which did not allow patrons to place a wager on the trifecta race.

Due to the machine malfunction there was an increase in the win pool. Ed Ryan of Freehold Raceway indicated that all thing being considered total wagering for the race was down, however, Freehold did not experience much of a loss due to patrons taking advantage of the win, place and show wagering.

Chairman Dowd indicated that Racing Commission figures showed the win pool increased \$4,000.00 in the last eight minutes of wagering. Chairman Dowd maintained Freehold's experience of not having trifecta wagering on a race follows up the theory that increasing trifecta wagering increases the take out and eventually has an adverse effect on the handle.

The Chairman indicated there has been studies done that illustrate in the long-run increase in take out decreases handle because bettors tend not to re-bet the money. The Chairman expressed how important it was for track management and the Racing Commission to discuss a joint experiment to test the theory of take out versus handle. Chairman Dowd indicated the variable of patron impact was as important as the figures.

Ed Ryan of Freehold indicated suggestion boxes around the tracks have shown the patrons liked the exotic wagers. Mr. Ryan indicated the trifecta bet is not a wager for real gamblers. He indicated the patrons at Freehold prefer the one-two wager.

Commissioner McGlynn stated that 83% of the patrons received money back on the race in question at Freehold rather than 75% to the patrons. Commissioner McGlynn expressed the importance to the industry of the exotic wagering and how it affects the patrons.

Executive Director Bruce Garland indicated staff would recommend the tracks take a very serious look before submitting their formats for next year's exotic betting schedule. The exotic wagers are no longer exotic and are more of a routine. Executive Director Garland indicated staff would recommend convening another racing industry conference to deal with the issue of mutuels including the topics of uniform mutuel rules to deal with the proliferation of simulcasting. The conference would also consider the effects of exotic wagering and the possibility of changes in the take out structure.

Chairman Dowd expressed that after Election Day the Commission would get together with racetrack management to re-discuss the date's with regard to Sunday racing and casino simulcasting. He asked track management to bring to the table thoughts on exotic wagering and simulcasting for an open discussion. He also asked the tracks to bring their thoughts to the meeting on the sale of Philadelphia Park because it will also impact on racing in New Jersey. The Chairman suggested through collective minds ideas could be raised as how to best serve the racing public and racing in New Jersey.

PROPOSED RULE AMENDMENT TO N.J.A.C. 13:70-14A.9(d) AND 13:71-23.9(d) (ADMINISTERING MEDICATION TO RESPIRATORY BLEEDERS')

Executive Director Garland reported on the recommendations from the Lasix committee appointed by Chairman Dowd. Staff recommended that along with the recommendations from the Lasix study committee, a rule change be made on the length of time a horse is on the bleeders list. It would reduce the down time a horse is on a veterinarians list for bleeding.

The proposed amendment reduces the time a horse is placed on the veterinarians list for bleeding from 14 days to 10 days, the second time remains at 30 days, however, a horse which bleeds a third time will be on the list for 90 days rather than three months.

These proposed amendments are consistent with the recommendation made by the Lasix review committee and have been agreed to by representatives of the regional committee which include the states of Pennsylvania, Maryland and Delaware.

Chairman Dowd expressed the importance to illustrate to other states that when the region recommends a change, New Jersey is willing to move quickly on that recommendation.

On motion by Chairman Dowd, seconded by Commissioner McGlynn, approval for the advertisement of a rule change for respiratory bleeders was unanimously approved by the Commission.

RE: THE MATTER OF GORDON J. BROWN AND ABC STABLES, INC.

Executive Director Garland stated that Mr. Brown made a \$2,500.00 payment by check of a fee to be entered in the Sweetheart Pace. When Mr. Brown found out his horse was ineligible for the race, he stopped payment on the check.

Racing Commission officials indicated he had to pay \$2,500.00 or face possible administrative penalties. The matter was appealed to Administrative Law. Administrative Law Judge Steven Weiss upheld the decision of the State Steward and therefore ordered Mr. Brown and ABC Stables, Inc., to make payment of the \$2,500.00 entry fee and failure to do so will result in the suspension of their license to participate in racing in New Jersey.

On motion by Commissioner McGlynn, seconded by Commissioner Dimon, the Commission unanimously accepted the Administrative Law judges decision. Chairman Dowd noted for the record the Commission has not received exceptions or objections from the petitioner.

DECISION OF HEIMER CASE

Chairman Dowd indicated the Racing Commission has received a notice of appeal on the Heimer law suit. DAG Bender stated the case was under appeal and the Commission is permitted, under 2:5-1B, to supplement their original decision.

On motion by Chairman Dowd, seconded by Commissioner McGlynn, the Executive Director was directed to supplement the decision in the Heimer matter to specifically include the background of the case and outline for the court's benefit the nature of the workmen's compensation program to which the funds would be utilized.

Executive Director Garland informed the public that the financial status report was available from Deputy Director Zanzuccki.

On motion by Commissioner McGlynn, seconded by Commissioner Dimon the November meeting would be changed from November 21, 1990 to November 28, 1990.

Chairman Dowd opened the meeting for questions and comments from the public.

Anthony Perentti who is representing the S.B.O.A. of New Jersey asked the Commission to reconsider the policy on requiring random mandatory breathalyzer test for all participants.


He expressed his concerns that the dollars saved by eliminating the breathalyzer test and having random test would not be worth the lives that would be at risk on the track.

Executive Director Garland indicated to Mr. Perentti there were not any plans to change the procedures on breathalyzer tests. He expressed to Mr. Perentti the Racing Commission fully expects any participant in any race that sees anyone intoxicated to make the matter known to the officials.

Mr. Perentti also stated the Racing Commission could possibly increase the penalty for someone found to be intoxicated and refuses the test. Executive Director Garland stated staff was reviewing the penalties. Chairman Dowd expressed a possible rule change could be in effect on the penalty on participating while intoxicated.

On motion by Chairman Dowd, seconded by Commissioner McGlynn, the meeting was adjourned subject to the provisions of the Sunshine Act and scheduled the meeting immediately before the next public meeting to address items covered by the Sunshine Act.
