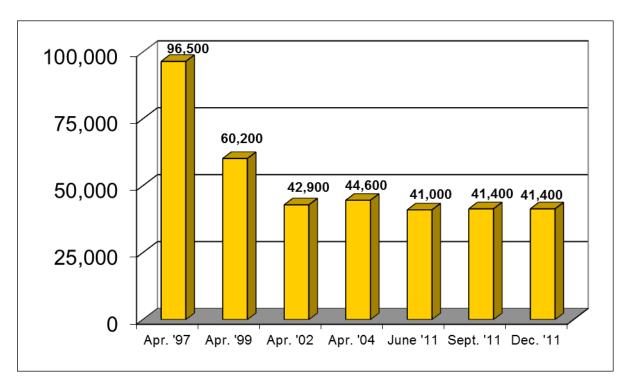

1. Work First NJ Caseload

Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF)

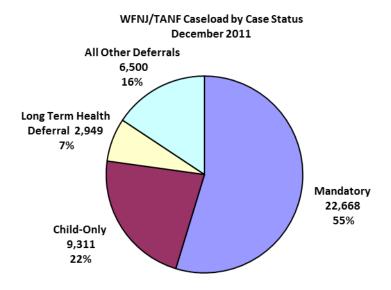
The number of families receiving WFNJ/TANF totaled approximately 41,400 as of December 2011.

WFNJ TANF Caseload



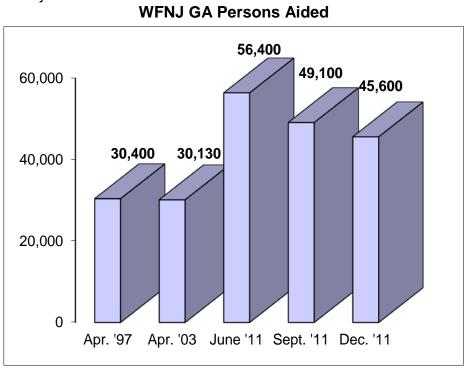
•Client Deferrals and Exemptions

Of the total TANF caseload of 41,400, about 23,000 cases (55 percent) were those with adults in the household who must comply with WFNJ/TANF work requirements.



General Assistance (GA)

As of December 2011, there were approximately 45,600 General Assistance (GA) persons aided in New Jersey.



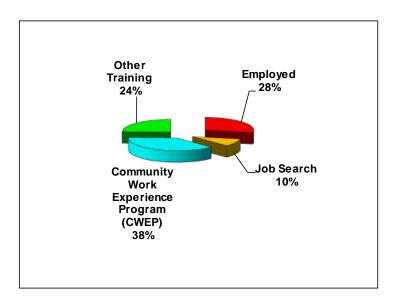
•Teenaged Welfare Recipients

Of the WFNJ/TANF population of 41,400 in December 2011, about 1,500 (3.6%) were teenaged recipients, aged 18 and 19, who were heads of their households.

2. Employment & Work Preparation

•Participation of WFNJ TANF Clients in Employment-Directed Activities

For the month of December 2011, TANF clients were engaged in more than 16,200 work activities. About 4,600 (28 percent) of these individuals had begun working but were still receiving a partial cash assistance payment, due to income disregards.



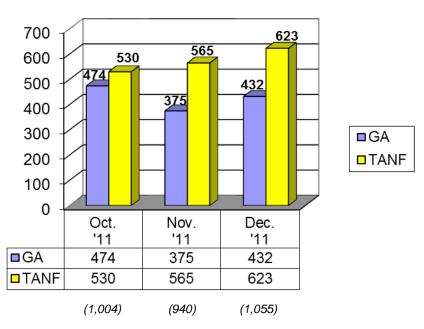

Cases that met the Federal Participation Requirement

Of the people scheduled to participate in the work-directed activities, 4,698 participated at levels sufficient to satisfy federal requirements.

Cases Closed Due to Employment

During the quarter, an average of about 1,000 WFNJ TANF and GA clients left welfare for employment each month.



Major Reasons for TANF Case Closings

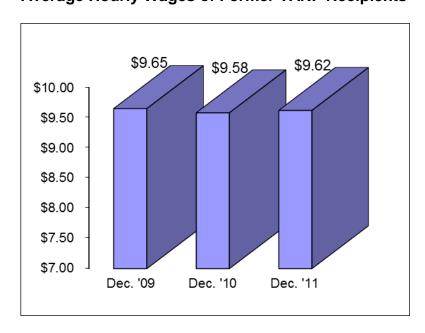

•Earnings of Former TANF Recipients

During the fourth quarter of 2011, WFNJ TANF recipients who were working were earning an average of \$9.62 per hour.

•Statewide Job Openings

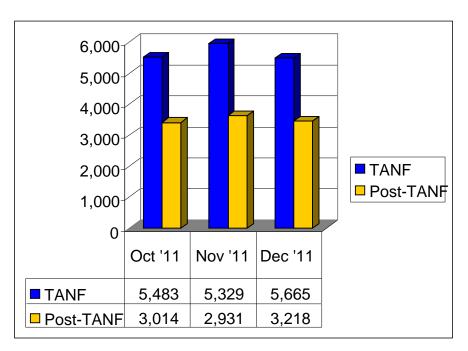
According to the NJ Department of Labor and Workforce Development, there were 58,459 job openings statewide during the period of January 1, 2011 through December 31, 2011. The majority of positions available were in the Administration and Support, Waste Management and Remediation category, followed by the Manufacturing and Retail Trade fields.

3. Child Care

As of December 2011, about 5,700 WFNJ TANF clients were receiving child care benefits. Post-TANF child care benefits were issued to nearly 3,220 families who had become employed and were no longer receiving cash assistance.
