Very High Performance is defined as being equal to or above the 80th percentile. High Performance is defined as being between the 60th and 79.9th percentiles. Average Performance is defined as being between the 40th and 59.9th percentiles. Lagging Performance is defined as being between the 20th and 39.9th percentiles. Significantly Lagging Performance is defined as being equal to or below the 19.9th percentile.

<u>Peer Schools</u> are schools that have similar grade levels and students with similar demographic characteristics, such as the percentage of students qualifying for Free/Reduced Lunch, Limited English Proficiency programs or Special Education programs.

#### **Academic Achievement**

This school outperforms 48% of schools statewide as noted by its statewide percentile and 63% of schools educating students with similar demographic characteristics as noted in its peer school percentile in the performance area of Academic Achievement. Additionally, this school is meeting 100% of its performance targets in the area of Academic Achievement.



Academic Achievement measures the content knowledge students have in language arts literacy and math. For high schools, this includes measures of the school's proficiency rate on both the Language Arts Literacy and Math sections of the New Jersey High School Proficiency Assessment (HSPA). A proficiency rate is calculated by summing the count of students who scored either proficient or advanced proficient on the assessment and dividing by the count of valid test scores.

#### **College and Career Readiness**

This school outperforms 62% of schools statewide as noted by its statewide percentile and 74% of schools educating students with similar demographic characteristics as noted in its peer school percentile in the performance area of College and Career Readiness. Additionally, this school is meeting 40% of its performance targets in the area of College and Career Readiness.



College and Career Readiness measures the degree to which students are demonstrating behaviors that are indicative of future attendance and/or success in college and careers. For high schools, this includes measures of participation in college readiness tests such as the SAT, ACT or PSAT and in rigorous coursework as defined by participation in AP or IB courses in English, math, social studies and science.

#### **Graduation and Post-Secondary**

This school outperforms 92% of schools statewide as noted by its statewide percentile and 97% of schools educating students with similar demographic characteristics as noted in its peer school percentile in the performance area of Graduation and Post-Secondary. Additionally, this school is meeting 100% of its performance targets in the area of Graduation and Post-Secondary.



Graduation and Postsecondary measures the rate at which students who begin high school four years earlier graduate within four years. Also included is a measure of the rate at which students in a particular school drop out of school.



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#### **Enrollment by Grade, in Full Time Equivalent**












#### **Proficiency Trends - Math**

#### COLLEGE AND CAREER READINESS **BERGEN**

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Students in high schools begin to demonstrate college readiness behaviors long before they actually graduate from high school. Among those behaviors are taking college entrance exams and challenging themselves with rigorous course work. The table below presents five such indicators: the percentage of students enrolled in the 12th grade who took the SAT or ACT, the percentage of 10th and 11th graders who took the PSAT, the percentage of students who scored above the SAT benchmark of 1550, the percentage of 11th and 12th graders who took at least one AP or IB test in English, math, social studies or science, and the percentage of those AP or IB tests that were scored a 3 or higher.





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#### GRADUATION AND POSTSECONDARY


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#### **Graduation Pathway Rates**










#### **Enrollment Trends by Program Participation**








### NJASK Proficiency Trends - Language Arts Literacy - Grade Level - 03






#### NJASK Proficiency Trends - Math - Grade Level - 03









#### Enrollment by Grade, in Full Time Equivalent






#### **Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup**








#### NJASK Proficiency Trends - Language Arts Literacy -Grade Level - 03






#### NJASK Proficiency Trends - Math - Grade Level - 03














### **Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup**























### Enrollment by Grade, in Full Time Equivalent






### **Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup**








### NJASK Proficiency Trends - Language Arts Literacy - Grade Level - 03






### NJASK Proficiency Trends - Math - Grade Level - 03









#### **Enrollment by Grade, in Full Time Equivalent**






#### Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup















#### **Enrollment by Grade, in Full Time Equivalent**






#### **Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup**




















