A proficiency rate is calculated by summing the count of students who scored either proficient or advanced proficient on the assessment and dividing by the count of valid test scores.

## Graduation and Post-Secondary

This school outperforms $\mathbf{6 4} \%$ of schools statewide as noted by its statewide percentile and $\mathbf{4 4 \%}$ of schools educating students with similar demographic characteristics as noted in its peer school percentile in the performance area of Graduation and Post-Secondary.
