Academic Achievement

College and Career Readiness

Additionally, this school is meeting 100% of its performance targets in the area of College and Career Readiness.



College and Career readiness measures the degree to which students are demonstrating behaviors that are indicative of future attendance and/or success in college and careers. For all elementary and middle schools, this includes a measurement of how many students are chronically absent. Student Growth

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

This graph presents the count of students who were 'on roll' by grade in October of each school year.




Total School Enrollment Trends




Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup



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




NJASK Proficiency Trends - Language Arts Literacy -Grade Level - 03




NJASK Proficiency Trends - Math - Grade Level - 03

This graph presents the grade level outcomes in the categories of Advanced Proficient, Proficient, and Partially Proficient over the last four years.





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
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NJASK Proficiency Trends - Math - Grade Level - 05






Chronic Absenteeism Trend



This graph presents the count of students who were 'on roll' by grade in October of each school year.








Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup

















This graph presents the count of students who were 'on roll' by grade in October of each school year.




Total School Enrollment Trends

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


Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup








NJASK Proficiency Trends - Language Arts Literacy -Grade Level - 06




NJASK Proficiency Trends - Math - Grade Level - 06






Chronic Absenteeism Trend



This graph presents the count of students who were 'on roll' by grade in October of each school year.




Total School Enrollment Trends




