

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PREFACE

The 1980-81 edition of Vital Educational Statistics is the seventh in a series which began in 1974-75. It is the fourth year of a revised series using data derived from re-designed instruments supported by detailed and illustrated instructions. It is also the third year the publication has been divided into two volumes. A glossary of terms and definitions was added for the first time in 1979-80.

Volume II contains both certificated and non-certificated staff personnel data. The certificated staff data (Section I) deals with staff employed on a full-time and part-time basis; academic degrees held; certificates held; staff mobility; racial/ethnic composition and sex. Six new tables have been added to the 1980-81 edition of Volume II. Three contain certificated staff age data and three contain experience data. Certificated staff personnel are those personnel who are required to hold certificates issued by the State Board of Examiners.

The non-certificated staff data (Section II) consists of the following: the number of staff employed by professional and non-professional classifications; the number employed in the various support service program areas and the racial/ethnic distribution of full-time personnel. Non-certificated staff are those support service personnel who are not required to hold State (educational) certification from the State Board of Examiners.

The data were collected from school districts and reviewed by the county data analysts before transmittal to the State Department of Education. For a comprehensive overview of the condition of education it is recommended that both Volumes I & II be used as a set. Volume I contains school district and school data, including enrollments, dropouts, graduates and facilities data and is a separate publication. The 1980-81 edition of Volume II contains data that users will identify with the 1980 Census Year.

The back cover contains two evaluation forms on which users are invited to send comments or suggestions for improving the utility of the data.

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INTRODUCTION

This introduction presents selected trend data characteristics of the certificated staff employed in the public elementary and secondary schools between 1976-77 and 1980-81. Additionally, two sets of statistics show selected characteristics of non-certificated staff employed between 1976-77 and 1980-81. The data will show that the number of certificated staff employed has remained relatively stable over the five-year period, having increased 0.6 percent for the period. Full-time non-certificated staff increased by 3,465, an increase of 8.8 percent for the period.

SYNOPIS OF TRENDS

- Between 1976-77 and 1980-81 the number of full-time classroom teachers employed decreased by 2,151, an average of 430 classroom teachers per year for the five-year period. Administrators and supervisors increased by 3.3 percent during the five-year period and educational support services personnel increased by 24.6 percent. The latter group increased (as an average) by 501 each year over the five-year period.
- The racial/ethnic characteristics of certificated staff reflected change in all of the classifications. Hispanic staff increased by 53.8 percent; American Indian, Alaskan Native/Asian or Pacific Islander staff increased by 26.9 percent; Blacks increased by 7.8 percent and there was a decrease of 0.7 percent in the White category. Overall, minority staff increased by 1.1 percent during the five-year period.
- The holders of both masters and doctors degrees increased between 1976-77 and 1980-81. The masters degree holders increased by 14.9 percent whereas the doctors degree holders increased by 33.8 percent. Personnel without degrees decreased by 30.4 percent and those classified as "other" decreased by 23.1 percent.
- During the five-year period 1976-77 and 1980-81 all non-standard (non-regular) certificate holders decreased. The regular certificate holders increased by one percent between 1976-77 and 1980-81.
- Certificated staff mobility showed an increasing trend between 1976-77 and 1979-80. In 1980-81 the number "entering" and "leaving" declined for the first time during the five-year period. For the five-year period the percent change between the mobility of those "entering" and "leaving" had widened to 3.8 percent. The 3.8 percent represented the excess of those leaving over those entering.
- Non-certificated staff increased by 8.8 percent between 1976-77 and 1980-81. The racial/ethnic characteristics of non-certificated staff are not available for 1976-77. However, between 1977-78 and 1980-81 all of the minority groups increased: the category "other" increased by 25 percent; Hispanics by 7.4 percent and Blacks by one (1) percent.

SECTION I

CERTIFICATED STAFF INFORMATION

The 17 tables in this section contain data on the certificated staff employed in the public schools of New Jersey on September 30, 1980. The tables are organized to reflect staff employed systemwide by the major position categories: administrators/supervisors; classroom teachers and educational support services personnel. Racial/ethnic data are also provided for the major position categories.

Table I is the basic table in this series. The full-time and part-time certificated staff employed appear in three categories: administrators/supervisors; classroom teachers, and, educational support services personnel. On September 30, 1980 there were 96,399 full-time certificated staff employed in the state. That total was 574 fewer than the number reported last year. Increases were in the following categories: administrators/supervisors 52 and 267 educational support services personnel. The number of classroom teachers decreased by 893.

Of the 3,701 part-time personnel 2,028 or 54.8 percent were classroom teachers; 1,651 or 44.6 percent were support services personnel and 22 were administrators/ supervisors.

<u>Table II</u> shows those certificated staff members who are assigned to either the elementary or secondary level and those who serve in systemwide positions. The latter may include administrators, classroom teachers or special educational support services personnel. In some instances the personnel serving systemwide are identified as "itinerants" or personnel "unclassified" in terms of specific school or educational level. There were 10,179 full-time persons serving systemwide in 1980-81. That was an increase of 243 over 1979-80. There were 999 certificated staff persons serving in part-time positions at the district level. Table III takes a look at the certificated staff personnel assigned exclusively to elementary schools. The data show that of the 50,000 certificated staff serving the elementary schools 43,082 (86.2 percent) are classroom teachers, 4,566 (9.1 percent) are educational support services personnel, and 2,352 (4.7 percent) are administrators or supervisors.

Compared to last year, there was an increase of 92 educational support services personnel serving elementary schools. There was an increase of twenty-two (22) administrators or supervisors and a decrease of 587 classroom teachers.

Of the 2,095 elementary school part-time staff, 1,225 or 58.5 percent were classroom teachers; 861 or 41.1 percent were educational support services personnel and nine (9) were administrators or supervisory personnel.

Table IV reflects full-time certificated staff personnel assigned exclusively to the secondary schools. The data show that of the 36,220 certificated staff serving secondary schools, 29,667 (81.9 percent) are classroom teachers, 3,919 (10.8 percent) are educational support services personnel, and, 2,634 (7.3 percent) are administrators or supervisors.

Compared to last year there was an increase of 94 educational support services personnel serving secondary schools, an increase of 21 administrators or supervisors, and, a decrease of 459 classroom teachers.

Of the 607 part-time secondary school staff, 440 or 72.5 percent were classroom teachers; 164 or 27.0 percent were educational support services personnel and three (3) were administrator/supervisory personnel <u>Table V</u> is the first of three (3) tables dealing with the degree and certificate status of the three major certificated staff categories used in this publication. Each of the three categories: administrators/supervisors, classroom teachers and educational support personnel are also reported by sex.

Approximately 80.5 percent of all administrators and supervisors are male and 19.5 percent are female. Of the 52 increase in administrators and supervisors, over last year, 28 were female and 24 were male.

Approximately 84.9 percent of the administrators or supervisors held the master's degree and 8.5 percent were holders of a doctor's degree. Master's degree holders were up again over last year whereas the holders of the bachelor's degree dropped from 426 to 384, a drop of approximately ten (10) percent.

"Regular" certificates were held by 99 percent of the administrators and supervisors in their first or major assignment.

In terms of numbers and percentages, the degree status of administrators and supervisors improved over last year.

Table VI repeats the data elements contained in the previous table, however, the data relate to classroom teachers. This year again, an improvement is reported in the degree and certificate status of classroom teachers. Of the classroom teachers, 25,005 (32.7 percent) held the master's degree and 314 (0.4 percent) held the doctor's degree. Both of those categories were up compared to last year. Compared to last year there was a decline in the number of classroom teachers without a degree. Teachers without degrees are primarily those serving in areas where experience, in lieu of formal education, is one of the qualifying prerequisites to employment. The number of classroom teachers reported as having no certificate in the first or major assignment increased from 312 in 1979-80 to 318 in 1980-81.

Approximately 64.0 percent of the classroom teachers are female and 36.0 percent are male. Compared to last year there was a decrease of 592 male classroom teachers and a decrease of 301 female teachers.

<u>Table VII</u> is the last of the series reporting on the degree and certificate status of certificated personnel. This table reports on the educational support services personnel, a category that has been on the increase over the past decade. The increase of 267 over last year brought the total number to 12,688 as of September 30, 1980.

The special educational support services group described in this table includes such titles as librarian, nurse, psychologist, counselor, remedial instructor, etc. Females constitute 74.6 percent of the educational support services group. Males account for 25.4 percent of the total support services group.

<u>Table VIII</u> is the first of three tables reporting on the racial/ethnic composition of certificated staff. Of the administrators and supervisors serving full-time, 6,490 (90.6 percent) were White, 605 (8.4 percent) were Black and 59 (0.8 percent) were Hispanic. Compared to last year there were increases in each of the major racial/ethnic categories as well as a percentage increase in the "minority" group.

Table IX reports on the racial/ethnic distribution of classroom teachers. Of the 76,550 classroom teachers employed full-time 68,162 (89.0 percent) were White, 7,013 (9.2 percent) were Black, 1,143 (1.5 percent) were Hispanic, 197 (0.3 percent) were Asian or Pacific Islander and 35 were American Indian or Alaskan Native. Compared to last year there was an increase of 0.5 percent in the group classified as "minority." Table X is the last of three tables reporting on the racial/ethnic characteristics of certificated staff. In this table, the educational support services group is reported by racial/ethnic categories: 11,397 (89.8 percent) were White, 1,084 (8.5 percent) Black, 159 (1.3 percent) were Hispanic and there were 48 full-time personnel in the two remaining categories. The minority group is 10.2 percent of the total. Compared to last year there was a decrease of 0.3 percent in the number of educational support services personnel employed.

Table XI is the first of three tables containing age distributions for certificated staff personnel. Of the 7,161 administrator/ supervisor group, 2,192 (30.6 percent) were in the 42-49 age group. Fifty-six (0.8 percent) were in the "66 and over" category and 18 (0.3 percent) were in the 18-25 category. The median age of the administrator/supervisory group was 44 years.

Table XII shows that of the 76,550 classroom teachers, 27,045 (35.3 percent) were in the 26-33 age group. In the "66 and over" age group there were 274 (0.4 percent) classroom teachers, and 7,511 (9.8 percent) were reported in the 18 to 25 age group. The median age of classroom teachers was approximately 35 years.

Table XIII is the last of three tables containing the age distributions of certificated staff. Of the 12,688 educational support services staff, 2,879 (22.7 percent) were in the 26-33 age group and 2,791 (22.0 percent) were in the 34-41 age group. There were 89 staff in the "66 and over" age group and 751 (5.9 percent) in the 18 to 25 age group. The median age of the educational support services staff was approximately 41 years. <u>Table XIV</u> is the first of three tables containing experience distributions for full-time certificated staff personnel. Of the 7,161 administrator/supervisor group, 1,673 had 20 to 24 years of total experience. There were 1,575 (22.0 percent) administrators/supervisors in the 15 to 19 experience group. Twenty-one (21) administrators/supervisors had less than one (1) year of experience. Thirteen had 45 or more years of experience. The median years of experience reported for the administrator/supervisor group was 19 years.

Table XV shows that of 76,550 classroom teachers, 20,445 (26.7 percent) had 5 to 9 years of experience, and 18,390 (24.0 percent) had 10 to 14 years of experience. Twenty-two (22) of the classroom teachers had 45 or more years of experience, and 2,335 (3.1 percent) had less than one year of experience. The median years of experience for classroom teachers was nine (9) years.

<u>Table XVI</u> is the last of three tables containing the employment experience distributions of certificated personnel. Of the 12,688 educational support services personnel 2,937 (23.2 percent) reported 5 to 9 years of experience, and, 2,889 (22.8 percent) reported 10 to 14 years of experience. Five educational support services personnel had 45 or more years of experience, and, 364 (2.9 percent) reported less than one (1) year of experience. The median years of experience for educational support services personnel was ten (10) years.

Table XVII summarizes the mobility characteristics of full-time certificated staff including the three major categories: administrators and supervisors, classroom teachers, and special educational support services personnel. Statewide the data again show more certificated staff "leaving" than "entering". Of the three major categories, only the educational support services group shows a larger number entering than those leaving. The terms "entering" and "leaving" are a composite of approximately 21 coded explanations (reasons) supplied to respondents to facilitate identification of sources of staff supply, and, the destination of those who either transfer from school to school, resign, retire, or accept employment in non-teaching positions etc.

Statewide, the mobility rates for 1979-80 exceeded the average of the rates for the last four years with one exception: the mobility rates for the educational support services staff were the lowest in the last four years and below the average for that period. All other groups exceeded the mobility rates for the four-year period with the leaving rates in excess of the entering rates. Comparison of Certificated Staff Mobility*

SECTION II

NON-CERTIFICATED STAFF INFORMATION

This section contains three (3) tables reporting data on non-certificated staff personnel. The tables report data by support service program areas, the number of professional and non-professional personnel, the racial/ ethnic distribution of full-time (non-certificated) staff, and the full-time equivalent (FTE) of all noncertificated support services personnel.

<u>Table XVIII</u> shows that of the 43,024 full-time non-certificated support services personnel the majority (41,998) were reported in the non-professional category. There were 1,026 professionals in the non-certificated support services group.

Of the eight (8) support services program areas, business services accounted for 24,825.5 (57.7 percent) of the non-certificated support personnel. School administration and instructional services combined, accounted for 27 percent of all non-certificated support personnel.

<u>Table XIX</u> is a racial/ethnic distribution of full-time non-certificated support services personnel. Of the total number of full-time noncertificated support staff, 18.4 percent were "minority". Of the non-certificated group 6,820 (15.9 percent) were Black, 1,015 (2.4 percent) were Hispanic and there were 93 personnel in the two remaining categories.

Of the total number of full-time non-certificated support staff, 27,483 (63.9 percent) were female and 15,541 (36.1 percent) were male.

Table XX is a composite of the full-time equivalent of all non-certificated support services personnel. Column ten (10) shows that of the 50,427.9 full-time equivalent staff 57.7 percent were assigned to business services, 15.5 percent to instructional services and 10.7 percent to school administration. The remainder were reported in general administration, pupil services, community services and "other". The full-time equivalent of part-time non-certificated staff at the time of the report was 7,403.9.

<u>Board of Education Personnel</u>: Includes personnel employed in directing and managing the general operation of the board of education; board secretary; custodian of funds; election services; legal services; audit services, etc.

Business or Secretarial School: A non-degree granting, post-secondary institution offering courses of varying length in preparation for technical business occupations.

<u>Certificate</u>: The legal document giving authorization, from the New Jersey State Board of Examiners, to perform the services to which the person is assigned.

<u>College (four year)</u>: A post-secondary institution offering a four year curriculum and empowered to confer a Bachelor's degree.

<u>College (two year)</u>: A post-secondary institution offering a two year curriculum and empowered to confer an Associate's degree.

Data Processing Services: Directing and managing; programming services; machine operation services; data processing systems analysis, etc. <u>Degree</u>: A title conferred by an approved college or university as official recognition for the completion of a course of study. (Only the highest degree conferred should be used in this report.)

<u>Direction and Management of Personnel</u>: Includes noncertificated personnel in planning, research, development, evaluation, information, staff, statistical and data processing services.

Directing and Managing Personnel: Includes non-certificated personnel engaged in purchasing, paying, transporting, exchanging, and maintaining goods and services for the local education agency.

Educational Media Services: Includes directing and managing; school library services; audio-visual services; educational television; computer-assisted instruction, etc.

Employment: Working full-time or part-time in one of the following categories cited in the Dictionary of Occupational Titles: Professional, Technical or Managerial; Clerical-Sales; Service; Farming, Fishing, Forestry and Related; Processing; Machine Trades; Bench Work; Structural; Miscellaneous.

Entering: The source from which a staff member new to the school or district was recruited.

Executive Administration Personnel: Includes personnel involved in staff relations and negotiation services; state and federal relations, and the secretarial or clerical staff, etc. Experience: Whole years of professional, educational employment (excluding current year) in a public school, college or university.

<u>Facilities - Acquisition and Construction</u>: Includes directing and managing; land acquisition and development services; architectural and engineering services; educational specifications development; building acquisition; construction and improvement, etc.

Fiscal Services: Includes direction and managing; budgeting services; receiving and disbursing funds, payroll services; financial accounting; internal auditing; property account, bookkeepers and accountants, etc.

Food Services: Includes directing and management; food preparation and dispensing; food delivery and cafeteria and food service workers, etc.

<u>Full-Time</u>: The period of time in each day required for full-time certificated staff employment shall be the number of hours prescribed by the local board of education, but shall be not less than (4) clock hours.

<u>Full-Time Equivalent</u>: The amount of time for a less-than-full-time activity divided by the amount of time normally required for a corresponding full-time activity.

<u>Guidance Services</u>: Includes directing and managing and non-certificated counseling services; pupil appraisal services; information about vocational opportunities; pupil records; placement services, etc. <u>Health Services</u>: Includes medical inspector; dental services; nursing services; screening for vision; hearing deficiencies, etc.

<u>Improvement of Instruction</u>: Includes personnel who direct and manage (non-certificated) staff training services; assist with instruction and curriculum development, etc.

<u>Information Services</u>: Directing and managing; internal information; public information; management information.

<u>Instructional Aides</u>: Persons performing a variety of non-instructional duties in the classroom with such things as setting up activities and assisting individual children.

<u>Internal Services</u>: Includes directing and managing; purchasing, warehousing, and distribution; printing and duplicating; publishing, etc.

Leaving: The reason for which a staff member left employment in the school or district.

<u>Maintenance Services</u>: Directing and managing; personnel who repair buildings and equipment and service the replacement of existing equipment; carpenters, plumbers, etc.

Non-Professional: Non-certificated personnel other than professionals. In many instances, the dividing point between the two is simply the amount of education required for the assignment. Broad general categories here will include: technicians, clerical employees, crafts and trades employees, vehicle operators and laborers. Office of the Principal: Non-certificated staff providing support in the principal and assistant principal's office. This includes all clerical activities.

<u>Operation of Plant Services</u>: Directing and managing personnel care and upkeep of buildings; care and upkeep of grounds; care and upkeep of equipment. This includes custodians or building service workers and security services.

Part-Time: A certificated staff member whose total current assignments require less than his or her full-time services. A part-time staff member may be employed full-time for part of the school or academic year or part-time for part or all of the school or academic year.

Planning, Research and Evaluation: Directing and managing; development services; evaluation services; planning services; research services.

<u>Professional</u>: A person whose assignments require a high degree of knowledge and skills acquired through at least a Bachelor's degree (or its equivalent), but not requiring skills in the field of education. Some examples of noncertificated professionals are such school board employees as: accountants, architects, auditors, dieticians/nutritionists, engineers, attorneys, medical personnel, planners and researchers/statisticians.

<u>Psychological Services</u>: Planning and managing psychological services (if non-certificated) psychological testing services, etc.

<u>Pupil Transportation Services</u>: Service area direction; vehicle operation (drivers) monitoring services; vehicle servicing maintenance.

<u>Racial/Ethnic Groups</u>: A staff member may be included in the group to which he or she appears to belong, identifies with, or is regarded in the community as belonging to. However, no person should be counted in more than one racial/ethnic category. The categories are: White, Not Hispanic Origin, Black, Not of Hispanic Origin, Hispanic, American Indian or Alaskan Native and Asian or Pacific Islander.

<u>Rate</u>: The total hourly, daily, weekly or monthly wage, to be paid for services rendered.

<u>Residential Housing Services</u>: Administrative personnel services by students or staff.

<u>Salary</u>: The total amount, specified by contract, to be paid for services rendered.

<u>School Year</u>: The "school year" begins on July 1 and ends on June 30.

<u>Social Security Number</u>: The unique identification number assigned to a person by the Social Security Administration.

<u>Speech Correction and Audiology Personnel</u>: Includes directing and managing and other personnel assisting in identification and appraisal of speech and hearing disorders.

<u>Staff Services</u>: Directing and managing; recruitment and placement; staff accounting in-service education; health services, etc.

<u>Statistical Services</u>: Directing and managing; statistical analysis service; statistical reporting, etc.
