# 2015-2016 School Performance Reports

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



This graph displays the percentage of students by gender for the past three school years.




### **Enrollment Trends by Special Population**




#### **Enrollment by Gender**

This graph displays the percentage of students by gender for the past three school years.




#### Enrollment by Ethnic/ Racial Subgroup







This graph presents the percentage of students who met or exceeded expectations for the past two years.










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




### Enrollment by Gender

This graph displays the percentage of students by gender for the past three school years.





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


#### Enrollment by Gender

This graph displays the percentage of students by gender for the past three school years.




#### Enrollment by Ethnic/ Racial Subgroup







This graph presents the percentage of students who met or exceeded expectations for the past two years.









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
#### Absenteeism
