Instead, the intention is that educators and stakeholders will engage in meaningful conversations about the full range of the data presented. While the School Performance Reports bring attention to important student outcomes, the NJDOE does not collect data about other essential elements of a school, such as the provision of opportunities to participate and excel in extracurricular activities; the development of non-cognitive skills; the pervasiveness of a positive school culture or climate; or the attainment of other employability and technical skills, as many of these data are beyond both the capacity and resources of schools to measure.

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


Enrollment by Gender

This graph displays the percentage of students by gender for the past three school years.




Enrollment by Ethnic/ Racial Subgroup

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






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PARCC Math Performance Trends






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
Visual and Performing Arts

The graph displays the percentage of students by five ranges of absences. An absence is defined as being 'not present' and includes both excused and unexcused absences.







This graph displays the percentage of students by gender for the past three school years.




This graph displays the percentages of students by special population (Students with Disabilities, Economically Disadvantaged, and English Language Learners) for the past three school years.




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PARCC Math Performance Trends




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
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


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
Visual and Performing Arts


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
Absenteeism
