Transcript:

Governor Christie: I am extraordinarily proud of what all of us working together have done over the last four years. The rebuilding of this state, as I walked around it in late October and early November of 2012, seemed like a task that was almost too overwhelming for us to even consider. I remember being here in Moonachie and going through homes in Moonachie where people's lives had been torn apart. That they thought they would never get back. I remember going down to places like Port Monmouth, in Monmouth County, a working class neighborhood in Monmouth County where people felt like maybe the wealthy people at the beach would be able to rebuild but they would never be able to. Those people are now back in their homes. People here in Moonachie are back in their homes. In Little Ferry, in Carlstadt, in places where working New Jerseyans live each and every day. They're represented by Republicans and Democrats, they don't care our party, they want us to get the job done. And we're gotten the job done in the rebuilding of Sandy. There will always be critics, there will always be people who will say they could have done it better, I didn't see them raising their hands in 2012 to say here give me a shot I can do it better. It was the people who were in charge at the time who had to take the responsibility for it and they did a great job doing it. And included in that group are not only the members of my cabinet who are here, and the ones who aren't here, but also the leadership at PSE&G. I never heard excuses from either Ralph Izzo or Ralph LaRossa about what they couldn't do. They told me they were going to get it done and they did get it done for the people of this state and for the people of their company. And so there will always be critics and I am happy to take the criticism because when you take the criticism that means you are
