## Transcript From July 24, 2012 Press Conference:

**Governor Christie:** Now the cooperation, cooperation we've seen and a level of reinvestment that we haven't seen in years has taken a hold here in Atlantic City, and it's going to continue to be transformative for what we're trying to accomplish here.
