A Look At What Legislative Inaction On Governor Christie's Common-Sense, Middle-Class Reforms Means For New Jersey Taxpayers

\$3.25 Billion	Minimum cost to New Jersey taxpayers based on the Democrats' non-reform proposal allowing a \$7,500 sick pay cap, based on the current number of state and local employees.
\$880 Million	Accumulated sick and vacation payout liability for municipalities statewide.
\$81.4 Million	Total accumulated sick and vacation time owed to public workers in Jersey City alone.
\$14 Million	Projected annual savings from consolidated Camden County regional police force sharing services.
\$3 Million	Projected savings for Princeton taxpayers following borough and township merger.
\$1,500	Passaic Fire Department Emergency Response Fee for a firefighter extraction.
\$775	Savings for the average family under Governor Christie's bipartisan, middle-class tax relief proposal.
742	Days of legislative inaction on Ethics Reform.
650	Days of legislative inaction on Ending Sick Leave Payouts.
593	Days of legislative inaction on Shared Services and Civil Service Reform.
\$550	Average annual benefit for eligible families under Governor Christie's proposed Earned Income Tax Credit increase.

400%	Increase in Englewood's Pool Fee in 2012. A decision they have since reversed.
\$200	Property tax deduction for renters under Governor Christie's proposal, up from \$50 currently.
165	Municipalities in New Jersey with over \$1 million in accumulated sick and vacation pay liabilities.
128	Days waiting for the legislature to close Property Tax Cap loopholes.
115	Tax and fee increases in the eight years prior to Governor Christie taking office.
91	Town halls held by Governor Christie.
79	Days of legislative inaction on bipartisan, middle-class tax relief.
\$20	Fair Lawn water surcharge fee over per quarter, up from \$5 a quarter now.
13	Municipalities in New Jersey with over \$10 million in accumulated sick and vacation pay liabilities.
11	Pieces of Ethics Reform legislation awaiting legislative action.
0	As Governor Christie has said, when it comes to sick time cash payouts " Zero Means Zero ."
