In appreciation for the military, the organizers for National Military Appreciation Month are asking Americans to display the American flag and the POW/MIA flag from May 1 through Flag Day on June 14. The month of May was proclaimed National Military Appreciation Month by a Congressional resolution in 1999. The month honors and remembers those who gave their lives in defense of the nation's freedom, and honors those Americans who have served their country, and the men and women now serving in uniform on active duty, in the National Guard and Reserve and all of their families. More than 80 million Americans have served in uniform in more than 225 years of American history.

Vietnam Service Medal Ceremony held at Somerset Armory.

On Tuesday, 29 April 2003, BG Thomas J. Sullivan presented 133 veterans with the Vietnam Service Medal in a ceremony attended by approximately 400 people. The ceremony was hosted by HQ 42nd DISCOM. MAJ Mark Piterski, full-time Support Supervisor, welcomed the veterans to the Somerset Armory and MAJ Piterski and MAJ David Majury assisted BG Sullivan with the presentation of medals. CW5 (Ret) Bob Wimberly was the emcee.

The names have changed, but the service won't. Effective 1 May 2003, the former Information and Administrative Services Division (IASD) will become the G6 for the federal staff, and the Fiscal, Information and Administrative Services Division (FIASD) for the state staff. Personnel from the original directorate will be realigned along pure state and federal lines to support state and federal missions. On or about 1 July 2003, the federal personnel will relocate to Fort Dix and consolidate with the Army Guard staff there. The Help Desk will still be where our workers get their Information Technology support. The two organizations will work together to pass the requests to the appropriate state or federal office for support.

US Airways Introduces "Salute Savings" for U.S. Military Personnel.

On 21 April, US Airways introduced "Salute Savings," a discount program for U.S. military, with special fares as low as \$79 each way, based on roundtrip purchase. "Salute Savings" rates are available to active and reserve military and their immediate families through government-contracted commercial travel offices throughout the U.S. The fares are valid for tickets purchased through December 31, 2003 for travel completed by February 12, 2004.

DMVA Appears Before Senate Budget & Appropriations Committee.

Brigadier General Glenn K. Rieth appeared before the NJ Senate Budget & Appropriations Committee on Wednesday, 30 April 2003, and testified on the Governor's FY 04 State Budget recommendation for DMVA. He spoke of the Department's initiatives, FY 03 accomplishments, and publicly acknowledged the outstanding soldiers, airmen, and civilian (state and federal) employees of DMVA. BG Rieth assured the Senators that the FY 04 budget is absolutely

sufficient to operate all of DMVA's Veteran's Programs, and adequate in support of the National Guard. Following his remarks, the assembled Senators asked specific questions of TAG that were both candidly and completely answered to their acknowledged satisfaction. The annual Budget Hearings are part of New Jersey's formal process to ensure that State government balances its budget as is required by law.

New Army Regulation 350-1, Army Training and Education, dated 9 April 2003 was officially released for implementation. The new regulation consolidates and supersedes AR 350-1, AR 350-35, AR 350-41, and AR 351-1. AR 350-1 prescribes policies, procedures, and responsibilities for developing, managing, and conducting Army training and education programs.
