DMVA hosted the State's Memorial Day observance at BG Doyle Cemetery.

On Saturday, 24 May 2003, this Department hosted the State's Memorial Day Observance at the Brigadier General William C. Doyle Veterans Memorial Cemetery. In spite of the poor weather conditions, more than 1,000 Veterans, family members, and citizens attended this year's observance and heard Governor James E. McGreevey give the keynote address. The ceremony was held at the Memorial Walkway, where Kevin Whittner's Eagle Scout Project installed five benches along the Memorial Walkway. The Department would like to offer special thanks to Kevin Whittner and all of the organizations that helped us with this year's event.

Albanian leaders meet with DMVA.

Fifteen senior government officials attended a week long Emergency Preparedness Workshop hosted by DMVA as part of the U.S. Department of Defense Partnership for Peace Program. This visit was unique in that the visitors represented eight different civilian Ministries as well as the Ministry of Defense. The Albanians were briefed by The Adjutant General, personnel from DMVA's Homeland Security Center of Excellence, the U.S. Coast Guard, the Mayor, Police Chief, and Fire Chief of Hamilton Township, NJ, and the New Jersey Office of Emergency Management. Governor James E. McGreevey met with them in his office, and Chairman Jack Connors of the Assembly Military and Veterans Affairs Committee recognized the delegation while the Assembly was in session leading all there in a standing ovation. The Chiefs of Staff of eight NJ Departments briefed the Albanians on their particular programs and objectives. The visitors were taken to Philadelphia to see Independence Hall, the Liberty Bell, and other historical sites. They also visited the World Trade Center site prior to their departure for home.

Veterans Service Officers obtained nearly \$3 million in monetary awards for veterans throughout the State.

During the month of April, five of our Veterans Service Officers helped the veterans they represented to receive nearly \$3 million in monetary awards. Some of the funds were received retroactively, and the rest will come in during the next twelve months. Getting to Know New Jersey - The State Shell


The state shell is the knobbed whelk, *Busycon carica gmelin*, having been so designated by Chapter 89 of the Public Laws of 1995, signed by Governor Christine Todd Whitman April 13, 1995. Commonly known as the conch shell, the shell of the knobbed whelk is large, solid, and pear-shaped, coiling from left to right, as seen from its apex. It is yellowish gray in color, with brownish purple axial streaks in juveniles. The shell is found on all beaches and bays of New Jersey.
